Editors note to YLH Readersi There has been a bit of confusion as to where to send your donations in for YLRL Scholarship. My information on where to send the donations, was published in YLH, Issue #1, page 2j but before YLH was mailed, Quite a few donations were sent to Carrie, WA4-BVD, along with dues. As Carrie is listed as Receiving Treas., it would seem to be the logical place to send the money in for the Scholarship Fund. However, Carrie's office is not set up for these funds> her books and files are set up for receiving members dues only. All donation money sent to her had to be forwarded on to Sandra, YLRL Disbursing Treasurer, to be recorded and banked in the special account for Scholarship Funds. Carrie doesn't have a YLRL bank account, per se, to handle these funds.

REMINDER! Dues are due now! If you haven't sent them in as yet, please do so now, and mail to Carrie, WAhBVD.

In explanation; some of the copies were not collated properly by the printer, causing them to be "every which way". With 1300 copies to mail, it was impossible for us to spot the bad ones. There were other difficulties that the printer "couldn't be bothered with", but which upset me. I decided to look for another printer for issue #2. After visiting 5 printers and getting quotes from each, I finally choose one that I think will work with me to produce an issue of HARMONICS that we will all be proud of, at an affordable price.

The old printer refused to make any extra copies unless I ordered 500; which amount we didn't need, and would be a waste of money. Our new printer printed 56 copies, and only charged for 50!

As I wanted to get the copies out immediately to the new girls who were not on my 1978 list; in order to expedite the mailing. I went down to the Print Shop and collated the pages myself and stapled them. I'm learning more and more about the Publishing business!! So, if any of the new ones are not up to par, I'm to blame, not the printer! I also found out at that time, that by me doing the folding, collating, and stapling, saved YLRL money. Every phase of labor involved, is included in the total cost of the finished product. Along with the above info, Marilyn, sent the following advice* DX QSLs. Marilyn is an avid DXer:

When working DX stations, please be patient. It does take time to receive his logs, sometimes months. It helps greatly to put the month in Roman numerals, with the date before it: 04 XII-1978. It also helps to put the name of the DX station, call, and the date worked on the lower left corner of the envelope....Helps in sorting my mailj also indicate if this was a contest contact.

To avoid damage to your envelope, which should always be SASE; fold the envelope in half and put the folded side to the bottom of the envelope. Folding the envelope back, helps to avoid sticking.

When working rare stations...THINK...perhaps he would like to chat a biti give them this pleasure. Most times, DX stations are on frq. to give us a new country. Let them chat a bit and finish the QSO; don't show rudeness by continuing to break in. When DX is calling by areaj LISTEN, and don't QRM him (her).

NEVER, NEVER, correct important parts of the QSL card, such as date, call, time, or bands ARRL will not accept a card that has been corrected in such a fashion. Please be fair to your DX station.

.....

YLs, I need help in setting up a column for "Upgrades".

In order to keep our files correct and up to date, YLH and the Receiving Treasurer has to record all changes in Call as well as other pertinent information. These changes are made on the records as soon as they are received by us. Now, a new situation is created, which presents a problem to me. After my records are corrected, I forward the changes to Carrie, to make sure that she too has the new change! in return. Carrie forwards the changes she has received, to me. to be sure that I have the correct info. Neither one of us know whether both of us were notified at the same time. Of course, if the YL would make a note on each change she sends in, telling us who else she notified, it would help every office; saving us a lot of duplication notes, save on postage, etc. Due to the small room I have set aside for YLH work; files, records, typewriter, etc., storage space is very limited.... What to do with these cards, notes, etc. after my records are corrected!

Due to the volume of mail I receive that has to be kept for insertion in HARMONICS, along with other mail that has to be filed for future news, or retained as permanent files; I don't have the space or energy to set these changes up for a column for "Upgrades". This situation is unfair to the YLs who have worked hard to earn a higher class of license from FCC; they deserve recognition in HARMONICS. I feel that all individual honors are a reflection on YLRL and what we stand for.

Therefore; a YL is needed to compile this information for YLH. It need not be "camera.ready" work, I will retype it. If the information is sent to you, would you be willing to "set it up" by call area and in alphabetical order? I would prefer to have this typed, but if your handwriting is legible and easy to read, by all means, write it!

Now; on the other side of the ledger, if a YL is kind enough to take on this task: It will be the responsibility of each individual who upgrades, to send this information directly to the YL in charge of this column; in ADDITION to sending the same changes to the Receiving Treasurer and YLH Editor. Call changes will not be forwarded a third time!

The results obtained by this plea will be published in YLH, hopefully in our next issue.

FIRST CLASS MAIL VERSUS BULK

An explanation as to why First Class Mailing has been deleted from HARMONICS: Now at dues paying time, this has become quite an issue, and I feel the members should know why we, the Editors, have decided not to mail HARMONICS at First Class rates.

This deletion does not affect the mailings to DX who have paid the extra- charge for Air Mail, nor to YLRL Officers .

When I took over the duties of YLH, I had no idea of what work was involved: I quickly learned that the Editor "wears many hats" and the ability to type did not make an Editor! One "hat" is called 'mailing' and related requirements. Bulk mailing, as I soon found out, required learning regulations and rules about the Postal Service; plus finding my way around to the back of the Post Office, where to my surprise, was a large room in which bulk mailing was handled. My first trip to the bulk mailing room was to apply for our Bulk Mailing Permit ("Authorization to Mail Without Affixing Postage Stamps"). At this time I talked to the Tech, in charge of Bulk Mailing'as to the forms I would need to apply for a Non-Profit permit.

I won't go into all the requirements needed, at this time; but thanks to Eila, WA8EBS, and Ione, WA2DMK, who sent me the paperwork requested by the Post Office, I filled in all the forms and sent the entire package off, as instructed.

NOW the GOOD NEWS: A permit arrived in the mail, authorizing YLRL HARMONICS to be mailed from the Burbank Post Office at Non-Profit rates. The monetary benefit to YLRL is tremendous; our current mailing list is over 13001!

The current postage rate for HARMONICS to be mailed at First Class rate is 28 cents per issue, if weight is below 2 oz. YLH mailed at NP rate is 2.7 cents per issue.

The cost of producing YLH is climbing steadily. The printing cost is higher, paper and other related supplies needed for publication has gone up in price.

It is the responsibility of the Editor to keep all expenditures as low as possible, and stay within the allocation of funds available for HARMONICS.

Besides the monetary value, there is another aspect to be considered: The extra work involved, not only for the Editor, but also the Receiving Treasure. Another set of records and/or files to be kept by each office. The actual labor involved in putting two stamps on each piece of 1st class mail. (NP mail does not require a stamp as we have an imprint permit.) First Class mail cannot be mailed at the Bulk Mail Station, which necessitates going to another part of the Post Office, which usually means driving around to the front of the Post Office. Frankly, it is just to much of a hazzle, especially after all the work involved getting the mail sorted and bundled, per Postal Regulations.

No real benefit is gained by sending YLH 1st class to U.S. residents. If all copies are mailed the same day. should be received at the thev about same time, unless there delay in your mail your local is a distribution office. or office. After all, there is no guarantee of deliverv post on 1st class mail either!

I will do our best to keep our deadline, and Marie and get HARMONICS out on schedule. once we iron out the diffiare culties we are now experiencing. We flexible. and if problems arrive, we will be glad to work with you to resolve themi just send me a letter and let me know.

problem This created decision has another that has to The First Class fees be solved: that were sent in by some of the YLs with their dues. before notification sent was All the out. suggestions we received were evaluated. and we now have two ways in which the over-payment can be adjusted; with each YL choosing one of the following:

1. Request a refund of of the overpayment from the Disbursing Treasurer, Sandra, WA6WZN. DO NOT send this request to Carrie, as all monies received by her are immediately forwarded to Sandra.

a. One objection to this suggestion is the amount of extra postage and extra work that will be required.

2. Donate the \$1.25 to YLRL towards the Scholarship Fund, or to be used for buying new tapes for the blind YLs; leaving the final decision to the Board of Directors, to use these funds where it is most needed.

a. This decision is the most practicable one for all concerned. The \$1.25 is tax deductible for the YL, as well as saving the amount of postage, and extra work for all concerned.

BACK ISSUES AVAILABLE: Anyone wanting back issue from 1973 thru 1978, I do have some available. Let me know which one you need, and if still available, I will mail it out to you.

Individual copies must be mailed 1st or 3rd class; cannot be mailed bulk. HARMONICS "budget" would appreciate your sending the necessary postage: US mail, 28/ 1st class, 20/ 3rd class, per issue. Do not send envelope, we have YLH printed envelopes for mailing. Mail stamps, if available.
