YLRL is a non-profit, fraternal organization comprised of Women Amateur Radio Operators, incorporated as such under the laws of the State of California. Dues are \$4.00 per year, due and payable March 1, and delinquent March 31. For new and reinstating members joining after August 31, the dues may be pro-rated by half the annual dues for that fiscal year (currently \$2.00). Dues for DX members are \$4.50, and may not be pro-rated for portions of years - this amount plus postage - \$2.00 additional for Surface Mail or \$5.00 additional for Air Mail. Dues for a "family member" are \$1.25; and subscriptions by non-members are \$4.00 per year, and may not be pro-rated for portions of years.

CHANGE IN EDITOR---PLEASE NOTE

There are no paid jobs in YLRL. All offices are held on a strictly volunteer basis. Since our membership has grown to where we average around 1400 members, some of the offices, such as Editor, have gotten so big, it becomes nearly a full time job. DISTRICT CHAIRMAN is responsible for gathering news in her district and mailing it to the YLH Editor by the magazine deadline. She serves on the Board of Directors. 3 of the DC's are selected to serve on the nominating committee.

DISBURSING TREASURER receives all YLRL money (EXCEPT DUES), pays YLRL bills promptly, makes up a simple financial statement two or three times a year. She is a member of the Board of Directors.

RECEIVING TREASURER collects the dues and sends out membership cards. She keeps an accurate membership list. She makes up a delinquent dues list, sends reminders to those who have not paid their dues. She is a member of the Board of Directors.

SECRETARY keeps a complete membership file, welcomes new members with a letter containing YLRL information, records all amendments to the constitution, other actions of the organization. She keeps records of Affiliated Clubs, checks their credentials, issues Certificates and stickers. She conducts the election of officers. She is a member of the Board of Directors.

VICE PRESIDENT is responsible for planning and publicizing the YLRL contests, checking the logs, making up the lists of winners for publication, and sending the awards to the winners. She supervises YLRL sponsored certificates, and appoints Certificate Custodians when vacancies occur. She assumes all duties of the President in case of her absence or disability. She is a member of the board of Directors

PRESIDENT should have held other YLRL offices and have a good understanding of the Constitution, By-Laws, and Procedure Policy, as well as the duties of the other officers. She appoints her committees. She works closely with the editor of YLH on publicity of projects and changes in policy. She sees that the constitution is kept up to date, and that YLRL functions as the constitution describes. She fills vacancies that may occur, carries on League correspondence with her Board of Directors, and keeping her officers well informed. She represents YLRL at Conventions, and runs YLRL forums when possible. Best qualified Presidents have been YLRL members for several years, active on the air, and at conventions getting to know the members and their ideas and feelings about YLRL.
