## DE JAN WAGYQW

Our DXpedition to KH5 Palmyra Island, & KH5K Kingman Reef, began with high hopes, an investment of about \$25,000 by the 7 members of our team, and 5 months of long and difficult planing. As there is no other way to reach Palmyra except by charter boat and/or plane, we made exotic albeit expensive charter arrangements! Leaving California Jan. 2 with high hopes, and even higher expectations, we arrived excitedly Hawaii where the charter flight awaited. Jan 4 was take off time for KH5. Our first take-off was aborted 2 hours out over the Pacific enroute when the plane's HF radio went out...FAA says that once a flight plan is filed, you must make at least one transmission mid-air by HF. Turn around and go back to to Oahu! (Palmyra is about 1100 miles south of Hawaii, 7°N of the equator, almost dead center of the Pacific Ocean!) Add to the malfunctioning HF, that the pilot was somewhat apprehensive about the weight of the cargo. The plane was a Lockheed L-18 LearStar....24 hour delay....try it again at 2A.M. local time on 5 Jan. Added to our cargo was a crate of 4 dozen 2 day old baby chicks enroute to the Kiribati natives on the copra plantation at KH5. 2 seats and extra aircraft accessories had previously been removed to allow room for the four large portable generators that we rented in Hawaii, barely leaving seating space for our team of 7. I was the only YL operator, and would have been the first ever YL to operate KH5!! In front were pilot and copilot-9 people total in a plane nearly as large as a DC-3..twin engine, prop job! We arrived at Palmyra almost on sked-give or take an hour or so, and crash landed on the island, totally destroying the plane, and much of the gear loaded both in the under-belly cargo bay, and in the inner cabin. None of "my Guys", the 6 other members of our team, nor the pilot and copilot, except for minor scratches and bruises, were injured. I was nearly killed, and 2 of the baby chicks didn't make it! By some miracle of God, all of them had escaped with their bodies in one piece, though all were terribly traumatized, as anyone surviving an air crash would have been. Due to considerable pre-dxpedition publicity, hams from all over the world were waiting on frequency, only to hear a distress call to the Coast Guard to send a rescue plane for one critically injured YL. Among the W's, our personal friends waiting on freq.. got an awful shock. At first the "gang" wanted to quit it all and return, but I was concious and quite lucid, and insisted they stay, since they were not injured, and all this time and money were invested. Due to the distance from Hawaii, it was  $5\frac{1}{2}$  hours before the rescue team arrived, and almost that long before arriving at Tripler Army Medical Hospital in Honolulu. In all that time, I never lost conciousness, tho I begged God to knock me out, as the pain was unbearable. K6LPL the team member whose call sign we used, is Dr. Dave Gardner, a well-known Beverly Hills neurosurgeon. He had prepared an adequate medical kit to serve any contingency of either KH5 or KH5K, but he was only able to give me a periodic injection of demerol, as my injuries were of such a nature, and so numerous that the drug simply served to take off the edge, and not render me unconcious. At the crash, as we spun off the wet air strip, after ground looping and losing a wing and one engine, we finally came to

a full stop in a forest of hardwood trees. One of the tree trunks went under the fuselage of the plane, coming up directly under my seat, raising it 2 ft. into the air, and then folded it like a taco with me crushed in the center of the seat, on a grotesque angle, with my hip area about 10 inches wide -without any visible injuries, apart from horrible bruising on my arms and my face( a tree branch came through the window and hit the left side of face and head). Later at the hospital, the grim record read: Rt. leg crushed from knee to hip, femur in so many pieces they couldn't begin to count them; Left hip bone cracked, pelvis crushed94 breaks); pubic bone, (3 fractures), sacrolumbar displacement  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches, and my back broken 3rd lumbar vertebrae. Concussion with lacerations, and the mess on my left temple and eye, which Thank God, spared my eyesight(another miracle). Not counting the numerous scratches, bruises, lacerations, etc. Even after 15 hours, I still hadn't passed out!! Now, 2nd day, and my room was banked wall to wall, floor to ceiling with beautiful floral arrangements-txs coming in from far flung corners of the globe...YBØADT, Elizabeth in Jakarta, Indonesia, Bonn, Germany, Japan...by the 3rd day, mail began arriving in bundles, and the deluge of mail was a daily event! A large representation of YLRL gals...CLARA, ALARA, BYLARKS, YLISSB, WARO, NZART- and on and on. Heather, VK3HD phoned 2x week to pass love from Gill, VK6YL, Mavis VK3BIR, Peg, Polly, and the marvelous members of ALARA-many of whom had formed a real bond of friendship through long association via radio. Diana G4EZI. I apologize for not having a computerized memory, and it would break my heart to slight anyone in sending my thank yous. Amazingly I received 7 cards and letters from Russia!, they came through regular mail channels, with the Box 88 m Moscow return address. One was from UA3DEA, Val-To sum it up, over 4,000 beautiful, loving, caring and concerned people reached out to one very sick YL and said, in essence" We love you,....you're in our prayers...we care! The Army Med-i-vaced me back to the USA on Feb. 4 and I spent the next 10 weeks in the Anaheim hospital, returning to my own home about April 1. (Jan's address is 1542 Beacon Ave. Anaheim, Calif92802.-Jan Gould WA6YQW)

If you pronounced it Sizz'-ih-ge, with the "sizz" as in sizzle, the "i" as in "in", and the "ge" as in geometry, you have it correct. The "ultimate" syzygy is beginning this year, adn will become maximum in the period 1982 to 1984. It is expected to have a great effect, not only on radio propagation, but also on our environment.

Syzygy means a phenomenon in which the planets of the solar system come into alignment or "conjunction." If the Earth is on one side of the sun and the planet, or planets on the other side, we have a minor syzygy called "opposition." BUT approximately every 180 years, all of the planets in our solar system get in line, with the sun at one end, and the planet Pluto on the other. This means the total gravitational "pull" of the planets will be on the sun, and on Pluto. The result is expected to be tremendous solar eruptions, flares, tides, sunspots, and subsequent magnetic storms, ionization and anomalous propagation!

What is probably more important, especially to inhabitants of Florida and California, and most costal states- what tremendous tides might we expect? More volcanic eruptions? More earthquakes? Tidal waves?

History does not record much for the period 1797-1806, which we can blame on the most recent syzygy, except to note the tides were exceptional, and there were many active volcanoes and tidal waves. For some strange (?) reason, history doesn't mention anything about radio propagation anomalies!! But old Mother Earth came through that one okay, and there is no reason for alarm now. Of course, we did not have so many tall buildings or towers then!

The factor which will reduce the effect on Earth, and mitigate the force of the syzygy, is our position in the lineup of the planets. Our world will be in a sort of tug-of-war. On one side of us will be the sun, Mercury and Venus. On the other side will be Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune & Pluto. So we might be stretched a bit, but there is little likelihood we will be pulled out of orbit, which would greatly affect our climate!
