THE SAGA OF AN EXCITING 6 DAYS WITH ELIZABETH YBØADT AND REG YBØADS.

On Saturday 11th October 1980, Poppy, VK6YF; Les, VK6EB; Bob, Mandy, and I, assembled at the Perth Airport to meet Elizabeth, YBØADT, and Reg, YBØADS, whose plane arrived on time at 1:50 PM. The Jumbo was packed to capacity so the only means of identification through the incredible crowds was a 2m Hand Held which I positioned on my shoulder for what seemed to be an eternity. Finally, an OM with a big grin on his face approached clutching an envelope with YBØADT across his chest—needless to say we were all gleeful. We collected the baggage, stacked the cars,—I had my first contact with VK6AYL, Elizabeth's Australian call, in the car park. Reg as ever, was elusive with his VK6ARA call. A scenic drive home, introductions to the Guinea Pigs, our pink and grey parrot, Elizabeth, the four pussycats and Charcoal's two tiny one-week-old kittens, a mug of homemade soup, then off to set the Fox.

Two miles from home we cut the bottom wire on a very old and broken down fence which was well hidden by weeds and bushes. I fed the two cut wires with coax leading down to the Fox and battery buried beneath—well camouflaged. Didn't need to use the grounding spikes with terminating resistors and copper rods which had been made to attach to both ends of the fence wire about 100 feet either side of the Fox as the SWR was quite good, and it appeared to radiate quite well. We turned the Fox on at 8:00 PM with eight hound teams ready to start the nine-mile hunt. By 8:30 PM the first team arrived giving Elizabeth, Reg, Poppy, Les, Mandy, Bob and I much pleasure watching them racing up and down the fence trying to locate the transmitter. (We were sitting on chairs in the bush around forty feet away trying not to giggle too loudly.) Each team took at least ten minutes to discover the Fox with the second place team leader conducting the fence as you would an orchestra—with his snoop loop for a baton. By 9:00 PM all the hounds were home so we packed up and hurried back to our QTH where several other guests were waiting to meet the visitors.

A super BBQ tea was had by all. The Awards Manager for Western Australia, Jack, VK6JS, presented Elizabeth with her Zone 29 Award, and many photographs were taken of Elizabeth wearing the Brass Tiara that Bob and I had made for her with YBØADT stamped thereon. (Quite some time ago Elizabeth wished to speak to a YL, but didn't have the propagation as she had an important function to attend—she retired to dress in her finery returning to say on air that she had the headphones positioned over her Tiara. This brought much fan-mail, so we decided to make one for her with shim brass, welding rod and a brass electrical connector, the result was very pleasing.)

Poppy, VK6YF, provided a picnic lunch for Sunday as we convoyed—chatting on 2m, of course,—to Mundaring Weir followed by a scenic tour of the hills. INTERNATIONAL COMMUNICATIONS REGULATIONS - (continued from page 22)

Amateurs who wish to apply for a reciprocal operating permit should write to the radio licensing authorities in the government of the country to be visited. Applicants may get the addresses of these licensing authorities either from foreign embassies or from radio clubs listed in the Foreign Amateur Radio Callbook.

An amateur who is a citizen of one of the countries above may apply for a permit to operate in U.S. territory by completing an FCC Form 610-A, available from an FCC office or in some cases, from U.S. missions abroad. The completed application and a photocopy of the applicant's current amateur license should be sent to: Federal Communications Commission, Gettysburg, Pennsylvania 17325, USA.

A reciprocal operating permit issued by the FCC is valid for one year or until the date of expiration on the applicant's license, whichever comes first. For more information, call the office in Gettysburg at (717) 334-7631.

NOTICE: BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING: (August 1, 1980)

The board voted on the PROCEDURE POLICY - Sec. 5A. (Ballots to be returned by September 2, 1980.)

It was voted to: Half way through this section, and after the words "Directory Issue," to add an additional sentence. The entire section now reads:

Sec. 5A. The Receiving Treasurer shall issue membership cards upon receipt of dues. She will forward membership cards of all new members, with their application forms, to the Secretary, who will send them a letter of welcome along with the membership card and a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws. The Receiving Treasurer shall type a complete membership list before July 1st of each year, which will be submitted to the Editor of YL HARMONICS for the annual "Directory Issue." During the months of March, April, May, and June, she shall send Membership Lists, including New Members, Renewals, Changes and Corrections, to the Circulation Manager; Secretary; Continuous Membership Chairman; Vice President; Disbursing Treasurer; WA4BVD and W1ZEN, every two weeks and at least once a month the other months of the year. In addition, she shall submit to the Editor a list of "Official Notices" for each issue, giving additions to the membership and any changes or corrections. The Receiving Treasurer shall also cause the publication of dues reminders in YL HARMONICS two months prior to the end of the fiscal year. She shall notify subscribers of the expiration of their subscriptions.

REASON: With our membership over 1500 and rising, it is imperative that these lists be sent on a regular and set basis. During the busy months of renewals, the lists every two weeks is essential.

International communications regulations (From WorldRadio)

International communication has been a special privilege enjoyed by radio amateurs since the early days of radio. The amateurs' contacts with other "hams" all over the world has given them a "unique ability to enhance international good will," as expressed in Part 97 of FCC regulations. Because their communications cross so many national boundaries, however, they are governed by international radio regulations, which state in part:

When transmissions between amateur stations of different countries are permitted, they shall be made in plain language and shall be limited to messages of a technical nature relating to tests and to remarks of a personal character for which, by reason of their unimportance, recourse to the public telecommunications service is not justified. It is absolutely forbidden for amateur stations to be used for transmitting international communications on behalf of third parties...[except] by special arrangements between the administrations of the countries concerned. (Article 41, Section 2, of Radio Regulations Annexed to the International Telecommunication Convention, Malaga-Torremolinos, Spain, 1973)

Third party agreements

The United States has made special arrangements to permit U.S. amateurs to exchange third party communications with amateurs licensed by any of these 28 other governments:

The United States also has a special arrangement with the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) permitting third party communications with its station 4U1ITU in Geneva, Switzerland.

Reciprocal agreements

The United States has also made special arrangements with 55 other governments to grant reciprocal operating permits to visiting foreign amateurs. These reciprocal agreements enable a U.S. citizen who is a licensed amateur to apply for a permit to operate in one of 55 other countries, and an amateur who is a citizen of one of these other countries to apply for a permit to operate in the United States.

An extra \$2.50 should be mailed with the dues if a sponsor wishes to have her DX adoptee receive YL Harmonics by surface mail, OR \$6.25 if by air mail. FAMILY MEMBERS - when more than one YL in a family, living at the same address, joins YLRL, the first member pays full dues and the second and subsequent members each pay \$1.25. Family members are entitled to all privileges of membership, except that only one copy of YL HARMONICS is mailed to a family. Subscriptions by non-members are \$6.00 per year, and may not be pro-rated.
