BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING - SEPTEMBER 1981

Because YLRL expenses continue to rise,—printing up 15% since July 1; postage may go up, again, soon; higher overall cost of running YLRL continue upward, that YLRL's operating capital is not far from depletion—the Board of Directors voted (after long deliberation) to publish YL HARMONICS quarterly instead of bi-monthly. The four issues are to be known as the <u>Winter</u>, <u>Spring</u>, <u>Summer</u>, and <u>Fall</u> editions.

This necessitates changes in the By-Laws and Procedure Policy section of the CB&P (Constitution, By-Laws and Procedure Policy) which the

board voted.

A ballot can be found in the centerfold of this issue for you to also vote on these proposals. Please mark you ballot and return to the 1982 Secretary (Rose Ellen Bills, N2RE) immediately. Your ballot must be received not later than January 30, 1982.

PROPOSED CHANGES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

BY-LAWS: ARTICLE X - ELECTIONS

Now reads: Sec. 4. The Nominating Committee shall check on the eligibility of each candidate and shall cause to be published in the May/June issue of YL HARMONICS, or a special bulletin, a slate of candidates for office together with a brief review of each candidate's qualifications.

<u>Change to read</u>: Sec. 4. The Nominating Committee shall check on the <u>eligibility of each candidate and shall cause to be published in YL HAR-MONICS</u>, or in a special bulletin, a slate of candidates for office together with a brief review of each candidate's qualifications.

 $\underline{\text{Reason}}$: This omits the designated issue of YLH that the slate of candidates must appear in, thereby leaving it open for any future changes that may occur.

Now reads: Sec. 5. Prior to July 1, ballots for the general election shall be provided for each member. Ballots may be included in the May/June issue of YL HARMONICS if desired, provided each Family Member shall also receive a copy of the ballot.

<u>Change to read</u>: Sec. 5. Ballots for the general election shall be provided for each member and may be included in YL HARMONICS if desired, provided each Family Member shall also receive a copy of the ballot.

<u>Reason</u>: Again, this omits the designated issue of YLH that the ballot must appear in, thereby leaving it open for any future changes that may occur.

PROCEDURE POLICY:

Now reads: Sec. 5B. The Receiving Treasurers shall issue membership cards upon receipt of dues. They will forward membership cards of all new members, with their application forms, to the Secretary, who will send them a letter of welcome along with the membership card and a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws. The Receiving Treasurers shall type a complete membership list before July 1st each year, which will be submitted to the Editor of YL HARMONICS for annual "Directory Issue." During the months of March, April, May, and June, they shall send Membership Lists, including New Members, Renewals, Changes and Corrections to the Circulation Manager; Secretary; Continuous Membership Chairman; Vice President; Disbursing Treasurer; WA4BVD and WIZEN every two weeks and at least once a month the other months of the year. In addition, they shall submit to the Editor a list of "Official Notices" for each issue, giving additions to the membership and any changes or corrections. The Receiving Treasurers shall also cause the publication of dues reminders in YL HARMONICS

two months prior to the end of the fiscal year. Receiving Treasurer #3 shall notify subscribers of the expiration of their subscriptions.

Change to Read: Sec. 5B. The Receiving Treasurers shall issue membership cards upon receipt of dues. They will forward membership cards of all new members, with their application forms, to the Secretary, who will send them a letter of welcome along with the membership card and a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws. The Receiving Treasurers shall type a complete membership list which will be submitted to the Editor of YL HARMONICS for the annual "Directory Issue." During the months of March, April, May, and June, they shall send Membership Lists, including New Members, Renewals, Changes and Corrections to the Circulation Manager; Secretary; Continuous Membership Chairman; Vice President; Disbursing Treasurer; WA4BVD and WIZEN every two weeks and at least once

a month the other months of the year. In addition, they shall submit to the Editor a list of "Official Notices" for each issue, giving additions to the membership and any changes or corrections. The Receiving Treasurers shall also cause the publication of dues reminders in the Winter issue of YL HARMONICS. Receiving Treasurer #3 shall notify subscribers of the expiration of their subscriptions.

Reason: This omits the <u>July 1st</u> date that the Receiving Treasurers must type a complete membership list for the Editor for inclusion in the annual "Directory Issue" of YL HARMONICS, thereby leaving it open for any future changes that may occur; and changes the publication of dues reminders in YLH from "two months prior to the end of the fiscal year" to publishing it in the "Winter" edition which is, actually, three months prior to the end of the fiscal year.

YLRL Convention 1982 June 18-19-20

The response to the YLRL convention has exceeded our wildest dreams. We already have over 100 YLs pre-registered and indications that over 45 OMs, family members and some Harmonics will be coming along. This is eight months in advance of the convention!

We recognized that we were outgrowing the facilities at the original hotel and we have arranged to move to larger quarters. The hotel will now be the brand new Crystal Gateway Marriott just south of the Pentagon and at the Crystal City stop on the D.C. subway system. Special convention rates will be \$40 per night - single or double. Add 9% tax, and the total bill will be \$43.60. That's less than \$22 each. The Marriott has much to offer. There is a beautiful indoor/outdoor swimming pool, a large parking lot that will accommodate the largest RVS, direct access to the subway system, and everything accessible by wheelchair. Courtesy buses will provide transportation to and from National Airport.

The major convention activities will be concentrated on Saturday, but we have big plans for Friday and Sunday and suggested sight-seeing for you to do on your own for a whole week. General Registration for the convention will be \$18. That will include the YLRL Forum and luncheon for the YLs or the Goddard Tour and luncheon for the OMs. If the OMs don't want to take the Goddard Tour, or accompanying ladies and family members aren't interested in the YLRL Forum, they can register for \$10 to be eligible for prizes and participation in all other activities. The YL/OM Banquet will be \$18 each. See the following page for the Early Bird Registration.

Registration and a small Hospitality Suite will be open all day Thursday and there will be an informal get-together Thursday evening. "Bip" Bachman, W6BIP, will make a presentation on "Simple Methods Used to Reduce Hi-Fi, TV, Radio and Telephone Interference."

We will start out bright and early Friday morning (June 18) with a special tour of the White House arranged by Senator Barry Goldwater, K7UGA. Then walk or take the Tourmobile along the Mall to the Washington Monument, Lincoln Memorial, Air and Space Museum, Museum of Natural History, National Gallery of Art and as long as your feet will hold out! Then on to the Capitol Building about 2:00 p.m. where we hope to sit in on a session of Congress. Back to the hotel in the evening for a getacquainted party, swaps, etc. Jean Chittenden, WA2BGE, will present a slide show on her recent trip to China.

Saturday is going to be strictly business for the YLs. That is the purpose of the convention and we only get together every three or four years. The YLRL Forum will be the first order of business Saturday morning. This is your opportunity to voice your opinions on YLRL matters and the future direction of YLRL. If you have any input you would like to make, get in touch with Kay Eyman, WAGWOF. We plan a light lunch Saturday noon and a talk by Lenore Jensen, W6NAZ on Public Relations and what we owe to the Amateur Service. There will be more meetings and speakers in the afternoon, prize drawings, a cocktail hour and the YL/OM Banquet in the evening.

For the OMs on Saturday, there will be a special tour of the Goddard Space Flight Center at Greenbelt, Maryland. This will be an all-day trip.

They will make the tour of the Center, visit the Goddard space museum, have lunch and return around 3:30 p.m. - just in time to get ready for the YL/OM Banquet. We expect to have FCC Commissioner Ann Jones as our Banquet speaker and we have an outstanding, audience participating, magic show by Hal Diamond and Company to amaze and amuse you. Prize drawings for an ICOM IC-2A hand-held two meter transceiver and other prizes will be held.

Sunday morning there will be "Dutch treat" breakfasts and group meetings or time for you to attend church or do extra sight-seeing. (Churches of several denominations are within three blocks of the hotel.) At 1:00 p.m. we will leave for the boat cruise down the Potomac River to George Washington's mansion at Mount Vernon. Return will be about 6:30 In the evening, we suggest a visit to the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts and, perhaps, take in an 8:00 p.m. performance there. You will have to arrange for seats well in advance. They are usually sold out months in advance. Check your registration to obtain full information on the performances that will be showing that week.

We will have a radio station in operation at the hotel throughout the convention, using the call of "Liz" Zandonini, W3CDQ. Special QSL cards will be issued to all contacts.

For those who can stay longer, we have outlined about five more days of recommended sight-seeing. And if you are driving, you may want to take in many more of the exciting and historic sights that are within easy driving distance of D.C. You may want to go down the Skyline Drive to Monticello and over to Williamsburg and Jamestown. See your Exxon map and have a talk with your travel agent.



Applications containing log details certified by one other licensed amateur, to the Awards Manager, <u>Vicki Shaw, ZL10C, P.O. Box 2088, Whakatane, New Zealand</u>. Applications should contain sufficient postage for return of certificate.

MAIN AWARD:

ZL and VK stations work 12 WARO members resident in New Zealand. DX stations to work 6 members. Contacts to date from 1 June 1969. For endorsement seals, ZL and VK stations require contacts with 12 additional members; DX stations require 6. Both to include at least 3 ZL contacts.

VHF AWARD:

10 two-way contacts with WARO members on the VHF bands are required dating from 1 January 1979. Either or both stations may be home station, mobile, or portable; and each member contacted counts only once. Endorsement seals available for each additional 5 members worked.

SWL AWARD:

ZL and VK SWL's to list details of 20 contacts heard with WARO members. DX SWL's to list 10. Both from 1 January 1979. Full log details are required including call signs of both stations. Each member heard counts only once. Endorsement seals are available to ZL and VK SWL's listing 10 additional members heard, and DX SWL's listing 5 additional members heard. WARO membership list available on request.

LETTER FROM CLARA, KA2DYC: (Condensed)

"I received this YLRL Scholarship with much appreciation and pleasure.

Thank you and the Foundation for it."

"There are five 'HAM'S' in my family, four generals and one novice. We all started in amateur radio at approximately the same time, two and a

half years ago."

'After receiving our licenses, we didn't start directly with communications. We had bought an old Heathkit receiver and transmitter which we had to check very well before we tried to use it on the air. This gave me my first practical use of the theory we had to learn. It took us a long time to finish testing but it was interesting and we learned a lot from it."

"Our first QSO was made on this radio and a homemade dipole strung between two trees. In the next two years our station changed very much. We no longer have the first radio. We all helped in building the Heathkit SB104A with the speaker, power supply, and remote VFO of the same line. We also built a Heathkit Watt-SWR meter. This has helped us in finding ans-

wers to the troubles we occasionally have with them."

"Our antenna system has also improved. We constructed a tower from an old tree-trunk and a wooden extension. This is raisable and lowerable with a pully system we deviced. This tower is being used to make our original dipole into an inverted V. We also have experimented with a vertical antenna." "We bought a 3 element beam and a crank-up tower. The load for

when we want to bring it down for tests, checks, or repairs."
"I enjoy ragchewing on the radio. I find that I can make friends all around the world this way. At the same time, I learn about different customs and ways of life and can see the world through the eyes of others. I occasionally enter into contests. These are not as interesting but can be enjoyable. Here, I learn to work fast and clearly. It is amazing how many people and places that can be reached. My family is also involved in Ten-Ten International. We have gone to participate in field day "Emergency Preparedness Day" activities with a local group of amateurs. Last year, I helped in the Boy Scout Jamboree on the air. I had a Boy Scout working third party with me. He talked to other Boy Scouts in United States and Canada. They compared procedures and activities. I enjoyed this as much as did my visitor."

"Since in school, I enjoyed mathematics and science very much, I have decided to study engineering. From my enjoyment of the electricity (electronics) I have worked with and learned from radio and Physics in school,

I am planning to study electrical engineering."
