PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As many of you already know, I have been traveling a lot this year, and it has been especially enjoyable because I've been able to meet so many wonderful YLs around the country. The warm hospitality of the Houston GAYLARKs, the Buckeye Belles, the Georgia YLS, and so many individual YLRL members is very much appreciated and will never be forgotten. Being so deeply involved this year with YLRL has let me rediscover something that we all know but sometimes forget: the more involved we become, the more pleasure we receive. That has certainly been my experience this year. And since we've now reached the mid-point of the year, it seems an appropriate time to bring you up-to-date on current YLRL projects.



YLRL Convention: Certainly the most exciting news right now is our Convention. Even as this issue goes to press, YLs around the world are beginning to pull out the suitcases and make preparations for the trip. Many are combining sight-seeing and visits with friends and relatives with the trip to Washington, D.C., and everyone is looking forward to this momentous occasion. Talk on the YL nets reflects the special feelings of warmth and friendship that embody the YLRL spirit.

Convention '82 Chairman Ethel Smith, K4LMB, and the WAYLARCs have organized almost a full week of activities for those who can stay for a few extra days, and they have attempted to cover every contingency. The speakers have been carefully selected and will be addressing issues of special interest. Saturday will be devoted to conducting YLRL business, and a free and open discussion at the Forum should help correct any problem areas and keep YLRL running smoothly. Please join us if you can, but if you can't, keep in touch via Convention Station W3CDQ on 14.284 MHz. 146.31/91 will be used locally also. There's still some room on a few of the tours, but Ethel needs to hear from you right away if you haven't already made reservations. YLH #1 and #2 contain all the pertinent info.

Election: And, of course, the other big news in YLRL right now is the election of officers and district chairmen for 1983. The Nominating Committee did a wonderful job, and we are grateful to Chairman Phyllis Douglas, K7SEC, Jo Anne Dow, WA6ZGM, and Hilda Law, KC5SG, for their hard work and perseverance. They wrote countless letters and made many telephone calls and on-the-air pleas to assemble this superb slate of candidates.

We're also grateful to the YLs who have volunteered to run for office and to give of their time. Please send in your ballot now to show your support and appreciation. Even after the election, there may still be opportunities to serve YLRL as the new President will have some appointive positions to fill. Offer her your support and let her know you're available to help.

Scholarship Fund: YLRL's Scholarship Fund is growing steadily. The generosity of clubs and individual members has brought our goal of eventually reaching a self-perpetuating level closer to a reality. Applicants for YLRL's \$300 scholarship, offered to any YL who intends to pursue studies in communications and electronics or related arts and sciences, are now

being actively solicited. Applications go to the Foundation for Amateur Radio (FAR), which administers the scholarship, and inquiries may be directed to Ethel Smith, K4LMB, YLRL's Liaison with FAR.

Board of Directors Meeting: FAR has recommended that we eliminate the requirement that study be in communications and electronics or related arts and sciences because eligible applicants are so scarce. The issue was brought before YLRL's Board of Directors and was defeated. In other matters, the Board voted to add a specific date for publication of the general ballot (details on p. 7), and they approved the allocation of \$500 to reprint 100 copies of CQ YL, to be sold for \$5.00 each. However, because the price of reprinting the book has increased since the original quotation, this matter will be shelved temporarily while alternatives are being explored.

Tape Topics: One of YLRL's outstanding services is the furnishing of tapes of YLH to blind YLs. Any blind YL ham, whether a member of YLRL or not, is eligible, and any interested unlicensed blind woman is eligible for a reasonable length of time. Our three Tape Topics Librarians, Diane Haigh, N1YL, Thelma Bolvin, WB4AUR, and Cleo Bracket, KØJFO, read YLH into a reel recorder and then duplicate sets of cassettes, which are sent out. They have found that usually one 90-minute and one 60-minute cassette are required for each issue. 120-minute cassettes were tested, but the tape was so thin that it tangled easily and broke often, creating problems for both the Librarians and the listeners.

As you can imagine, it takes a little while for each Librarian to settle into the program and figure how best to utilize the equipment she has at hand and the best mailing sequence. The duplicating aspect has caused the most problems, but Diane, Cleo, and Thelma all report that the bugs have been worked out and that they are enjoying this task. All three expressed a concern that there may be blind YLs who would enjoy the tapes but don't know about the program. If you'd like to help in this worthwhile project, spread the word on the air and in club newsletters. The cassettes are mailed postage-free to U. S. addresses. The Floridoras furnish tapes and mailers for the 4th District; YLRL furnishes them for all other districts. Some individual members have also made sizeable contributions. A similar program exists in Canada so Canadian YLs don't participate, and since postage is not free to DX YLs, cassettes are not sent out of the country.

Now you are completely up-to-date on YLRL projects. Announcements are made regularly on Open House on 14.288 MHz on Wed at 1800Z and on Tangle Net on 14.295 MHz on Thur at 1800Z. Check in when you can and if you don't have operating privileges on 20 meters yet, start upgrading so you can talk to us and listen in now. You'll enjoy getting acquainted with these YLs and will discover a whole new dimension of amateur radio. And if you've just become inactive through the years, blow the dust off the rig and tune it up. You will be very welcome.

And please don't forget to tell YL acquaintances about YLRL. Beth, W7NJS, and Minerva, WB2JNL, our Membership Chairmen, will gladly furnish you with application blanks to take to local hamfests. YLRL now has beautiful patches to wear on your jacket to those hamfests and there are decals and a nice selection of jewelry to show your pride in belonging to YLRL. Remember to make 1982 the year for YLRL and you!

(1) YL-CW-AJD Certificate: Contact with a licensed YL in each of 10 districts in Japan from 1 to 0.

(2) YL-CW-WAJA Certificate: Contact with a licensed YL in each of 43 prefectures (ken in Japanese), Tokyo-to, Osaka-fu, Kyoto-fu and Hokkaido.

(3) YL-CW-JCA Certificate: Contacts with YLs in 10 different cities (shi in Japanese) in Japan. Endorsements shall be made for each group of contacts with 10 additional different cities.

(4) YL-CW-JDA Certificate: Contacts with YLs in 10 different guns in Japan. Endorsements shall be made for each group of contacts with 10 additional guns.

(5) YL-CW-10 Certificate: 10 contacts with different licensed YLs anywhere in the world. Endorsements shall be made for each group of additional 10 contacts.

(6) YL-CW-Alphabet Certificate: 26 contacts with licensed YL operators in the world. The last letters of the call signs of the contacts should contain all 26 letters of the alphabet.

Apply in accordance with General Certificate Rules (GCR) for each certificate to Nobuko Nishigori, JA3UPR, 2-6-11 Hirose-dai, Kaai-machi, Kitakatsuragi-gun, Nara-ken, 636, Japan. 10 IRC's for each certificate must be sent to finance the fee and the surface mail postage for application from outside Japan. The certificates for multi-band and each single band contacts shall be issued separately.

YL-10 Certificate

(1) JLRS issues the YL-10 Certificate for 10 confirmed contacts with licensed YL operators in the world including at least one Japanese YL. All contacts must be dated after January 1, 1953.
