Happy Holidays! As my term of office draws to a close, I have many happy memories of a full year of service to YLRL. This traditional season of peace and good will seems an especially fitting time to complete a term because YLRL is truly an organization of peace and goodwill. The new officers will begin their terms with the new year and all it promises. I hope that each one of you has felt the love and warmth and friendship that comes from being an active member of YLRL.

There are currently several projects underway that will continue into next year under Sandi's able leadership. WAYLARC has donated \$400 to reprint 50 copies of CQ YL, as reported in YLH #5. The book will be available through the YLRL Supplies Chairman as soon as possible. Quotes from the jeweler who supplied the nicer line of YLRL pins and charms in past years have been obtained, and we hope to have those items available soon at about the same cost. New items for the inventory are also planned.

The results of the general ballot from YLH #5 are not yet known and will be reported in YLH #1. The Board of Directors voted to delete the 25-mile restriction of five of YLRL's certificates and is currently considering other modifications. This issue will be voted upon by the general membership when all avenues have been explored.

In 1979, proceedings were initiated to register our Girl-on-the-World as a Service Mark. The attempt was renewed this year, and I have just received Certificate of Registration No. 1214412 from the Office of Patents and Trademarks in Washington, D. C. It was approved for association services--to promote the interests of women amateur radio operators.

One of our members made special arrangements to have the Worldradio issue with the YLRL Convention coverage mailed to every DX YL who was a member at that time. Those copies were mailed some time ago and should have been received by this time. If any DX YL has not received a copy by now, please let me know. (This generous and thoughtful member has asked to remain anonymous. I have come to know her well during the year and I know this is typical of her. She makes many quiet contributions to YLRL's welfare. And she is typical of many other YLRL members who have donated so much time and effort to keep YLRL a strong organization.)

Thanks to all of you who have demonstrated such concern for the future of YLRL. Your ideas and suggestions have been welcome. I am especially grateful for the wonderful office-holders this year. Each of you has been a joy to work with and has served YLRL well.

In addition, there are many who serve without recognition. Ron Mayer, K7BT, has printed YLRL Information Sheets/Membership Applications free of charge for several years. Vi Grossman, W2JZX, has painstakingly handlettered YLRL's Certificates of Appreciation for retiring office-holders for many years. She has also created beautiful plaques for each out-going President. For Ron, Vi, and all the others, Kipling's poem is for you:

YLRL SCHOLARSHIP

Susan Beth Solomon, KA2FLL, was awarded YLRL's fifth annual scholarship. Her acceptance letter is printed below:

"It is with great honor and appreciation that I accept the YLRL fifth annual scholarship. I am quite pleased to be the recipient of this great distinction and thankful to the YLRL for once again promoting such an outstanding form of community service.

"In compliance with the request of Mr. Hugh A. Turnbull, W3ABC, of the Foundation for Amateur Radio, I here present a short biographical account:

"I first became involved in amateur radio through a science fair project in the ninth grade concerning radio astronomy signal detection near 140 MHz. I prepared myself for the novice exam with little outside assistance, receiving the original ticket in the spring of 1979. Ten weeks later, I passed the General license exam on my first try, at the age of 15. My primary interests at that time were in DXing and CW operation. Since then, I have held membership in the following organizations at one time or another: LIMARC, ARPSC, 10-10, ARRL, NCARC. I have received awards for Ragchewers Club, WAS, and ARRL 20 WPM. I have 93 countries confirmed, but my DX hunting has appreciably slowed due to academic pressures. I have been most active on the 15, 20, and 40 meter bands (SSB and CW), but am also active on 2 meter FM and 6 meter AM.

"During high school, I was actively involved in Varsity athletics and debate. I am presently "debating" playing Varsity Tennis on the college level (bad pun, I know). I have played the violin for ten years in and out of several orchestras. I graduated Valedictorian of a high school class of

565 in June of this year, with a GPA of 97.93%.

"I am currently a freshman at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, MA, and intend to major in the Dept. of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science. This past summer I worked as a Computer Programmer/ Consultant for the Uniondale School District Science Department in Uniondale, NY.

"Once again, I extend my heartfelt thanks to the YLRL for sponsoring this stipend. It will indeed be both useful and necessary in financing my current academic pursuits.

YLRL issues six attractive and popular certificates. The rules for earning them are printed below.

CONTINUOUS MEMBERSHIP CERTIFICATE (CMC) - This is automatically sent to all YLRL members who maintain continuous paid-up membership for five consecutive years. Then at five-year intervals, stickers are added for 10, 15, 20, 25, and 30 years. Members who drop out and then re-instate later must start all over again to earn the award. It is not necessary to request the certificate, but correspondence in regard to it should go to the Custodian, whose name and address are listed in each issue of $\underline{\rm YLH}$.

YL CENTURY CLUB CERTIFICATE (YLCC)

1. Two-way communications must be established on authorized amateur bands, with stations, mobile or fixed, operated by 100 different licensed women amateurs. Any and all amateur bands may be used, except contacts made through repeater devices or any other power relay method cannot be used for YLCC confirmation.

All contacts must be made from the same location. Within a given community, one location may be defined as from places no two of which are

more than 25 miles apart.

3. Contacts may be made over any period of years, provided only that

all contacts are from the same location.

4. Contacts with YLs anywhere in the world are recognized, provided only that confirmations clearly indicate the stations were operated by duly licensed women amateur radio operators.

5. Application must be accompanied by 100 QSL cards or photo copies of both sides of each QSL used to confirm contacts for the application or other written communications from the station worked confirming the necessary two-way contacts. The application must be accompanied by a list of claimed contacts, including the full name of the operator, alphabetically arranged by LAST name, the call letters, and date of each contact.

6. Sufficient postage must be sent with the confirmations to finance their return by First Class mail, plus sufficient postage to mail the certificate. YLRL will not be responsible for any loss or damage to

confirmations.

7. Endorsements: Confirmations of contacts accompanied by alphabetical list, as described above, from stations operated by additional YLs may be submitted for credit each time 50 additional confirmations are available. Endorsements will be made to the original certificate as application is approved. Gold stickers will be awarded to applicants who have worked their additional contacts from the same location (or within 25 mile radius). Silver stickers will be awarded, provided only that the holder of the certificate, in moving, retains the same call letters that appear on the original certificate.

8. Decisions of the YLCC Custodian, regarding interpretations of these rules as here stated or later amended, shall be final. All inquiries regarding cards, applications or the certificate should be addressed to her.

The current Custodian is listed in each issue of YLH.

WORKED ALL STATES--YL (WAS-YL)

1. The WAS-YL certificate is available to all amateurs, U.S. or foreign. Contact must be made with a duly licensed YL in each state. The District of Columbia may be counted for Maryland. No time or band limitations.

2. Contacts must be made from the same location or from locations, no two of which are more than 25 miles apart. The call used is immaterial, provided it is licensed to the applicant.

3. Contacts made through repeater devices or any other power relay

method cannot be used for WAS-YL confirmation.

4. Application must be accompanied by QSL cards or photo copies of both sides of each QSL used to confirm contacts for the application or other written communications from the stations worked, confirming the necessary two-way contact.

The application must be accompanied by an alphabetical-by-state list, showing call of station worked, date, band, mode, RST and YL's first

name.

6. Sufficient postage must be sent with the confirmations to finance their return by First Class mail, plus sufficient postage to mail the certificate. Send sufficient postage on an $8\ 1/2\ x\ 11\ 1/2$ envelope for their return.

7. Decisions of the WAS-YL Custodian, regarding interpretations of these rules as here stated or later amended shall be final. All inquiries regarding cards, applications, or the certificate should be addressed to

her. The current Custodian is listed in each issue of YLH.

WORKED ALL CONTINENTS--YL (WAC-YL)

1. The WAC-YL certificate is available to any licensed amateur in the

world.

2. Two-way communications must be established on the amateur radio bands with the six continents: North America, South America, Europe, Asia, Africa, and Oceania. Any and all authorized amateur radio bands may be used. Cross-band contacts are permitted. Contacts may have been made over any period of time. Contact made through repeater devices or any other power relay method cannot be used for WAC-YL confirmation.

3. Contacts with all six continents must be made with duly licensed

women operators.

4. Contacts with all six continents must be made from the same location. Within a given community, one location may be defined as from places no two of which are more than 25 miles apart. The call used is immaterial, provided it is licensed to the applicant.

5. Applications must be accompanied by 6 QSL cards or photo copies of both sides of each QSL used to confirm contacts for the application or other written communication from the station worked, confirming the necessary two-way contact. A list of contacts must accompany the cards.

6. Sufficient postage or IRCs must be sent with the confirmations to finance their return by First Class mail, <u>plus</u> sufficient postage to mail the certificate. Send sufficient postage on an 8 1/2 x 11 1/2 envelope for their return. YLRL will not be responsible for any loss or damage to confirmations.

7. Decisions of the WAC-YL Custodian, regarding interpretations of these rules as here stated or later amended, shall be final. All inquiries regarding cards, applications, or the certificate should be addressed

to her. The current Custodian is listed in each issue of YLH.

DX YLCC

1. Two-way communications must be established on authorized amateur bands with stations fixed or mobile, operated by one hundred (100) different licensed DX-YLs with not more than two (2) YL contacts from any one country, to total the 100 contacts for the certificate. Contacts made through repeater devices or any other power relay method cannot be used for DX-YLCC confirmation.

2. All contacts must be made from the same location or community,

not to exceed 25 miles from base station.

Any band or mode (except cross-band contacts) may be used.

4. Contact with all DX YLs located in countries on the present ARRL Countries List to be counted, provided that the confirmation clearly indicates the station was operated by a duly licensed woman amateur radio operator.

5. Applications must be accompanied by QSLs or photo copies of both sides of each QSL used to confirm contacts for the application. The application must be accompanied by a list in alphabetical order by countries

of call, name, band, and mode.

Sufficient postage or IRCs must be sent with the confirmations to finance their return by First Class mail, <u>plus</u> sufficient postage to mail the certificate. YLRL will not be responsible for any loss or damage to

7. The YLRL DX-YLCC Certificate Custodian, with the approval of the YLRL President and Vice-President in charge of contests and certificates, may designate a YLRL member as a sub-custodian in DX countries to check QSL cards of an applicant for the DX-YLCC certificate or sticker and confirm the list of contacts to the certificate custodian in the U. S. A.

Endorsements: After receiving the certificate, a silver sticker will be awarded for ANY 25 different DX YL contacts, representing 5 DX countries. Same list and postage requirements as on the original applica-

tion.

Decisions of the DX-YLCC Custodian, regarding interpretations of 9. these rules as here stated or later amended, shall be final. All inquiries regarding cards, applications or the certificate should be addressed to her. The current Custodian is listed in each issue of YLH.

DX-YL

Available to licensed YL operators only, for working 25 other licensed women operators outside your own country on or after April 1, 1958. U.S.A. and possessions are counted as separate countries, as well as Alaska and Hawaii. Any and all amateur bands may be used, but contacts made through repeater devices or any other power relay method cannot be used for DX-YL certificate confirmation.

2. Contacts do not have to be with 25 different countries, just 25

DX YLs. All contacts must be made from one QTH or within a 25 mile radius. The call used is immaterial provided it is licensed to the applicant.

4. QSL cards must be in your possession, but do not send them to the DX-YL Custodian. Another amateur must sign the log, verifying that the

QSL cards are in possession of the applicant.

5. Send copy of log to the DX-YL Custodian. Log must show date, time, station worked, frequency, her report, your report, mode, her name, and her OTH.

6. Endorsements: Stickers will be awarded for each 10 additional

DX-YLs, subject to the same confirmation as above.

7. No charge is made for the certificate, but sufficient postage for First Class mail or a stamped legal-size envelope must accompany the application to cover the cost of mailing the certificate.

> The Continuous Membership Certificate goes to YLRL members only, the DX-YL Certificate is awarded to YL operators only, and the other four are available to both YLs and OMs.

The special YL contests, Activity Days, and the YL nets all provide excellent opportunities to make new YL contacts. And YOU may help others complete their certificate requirements by giving out that elusive state or country. Make time to get on the air!

Howy, W2QHH

Who has worked more YLs than any other operator in the world? Chances are that if you've been licensed very long and are active on the HF bands, you'll answer, "Howy, W2QHH" at once! YLRL is pleased to pay special tribute to Howy and a few of his spectacular achievements in this issue of YLH.

Howy, W2QHH, was first licensed in 1933 as W8JIW, before West New York was transferred from the 8th to the 2nd call area. YLs on the air were few and far between, but largely with 10 - 17w input, the first WAS-YL was assembled. This was followed by the first WAC-YL and first DXCC-YL. Only a YL contact in Zone 24 is needed for the completion of WAZ-YL #1.

All operation has been with low power from a very poor QTH in the bottom of a 1500' hole, with all manner of local commercial QRN to contend with and with a simple end-fed wire for all bands from 160 through 10 M. A brief trial of a TA-33 Jr. on the roof proved fruitless, likely due to a lack of height. A maximum of 55 watts input to any final stage has been utilized through the years, and currently 20 watts to the longwire is the normal power used.

Being a 90% CW op has made the YL search more challenging, and as noise sources have ruined the ability to copy choice DX, more effort has been diverted to contacting YLs. The extensive efforts of others aiding

in the quest have been most rewarding and greatly appreciated.

In 1973 W2QHH was pleasantly surprised by the gift of a silver bowl from YLRL for confirmed contact with 2000 different lady operators. It has since been endorsed for YLCC-2500 and 3000. A recent submission of 50 YL cards has earned the 3250 sticker. At the 2000 and 3000 plateaus, Howy thought of giving up the quest, but urging from various YL sources convinced him to continue, and the results have been favorable.

Over 300 awards have been earned. Many such as "All British Counties," "All Swiss Cantons," 7-Band WAS, and Worked 500 Puerto Ricans have been the first achieved in the USA. All 3080 counties of the US have been confirmed,

along with all countries currently on the DXCC list--a total of 363.

Since only QRP AM phone serves for the A3 mode, a great majority of YL contacts are made on CW where it's often difficult to "unearth" the gals! The Novice bands are unusually productive of YL contacts and steady listening for the exchange of names and "88" often results in tracking them down.

Howy was employed by the Post Office, delivering local mails for some 30 years, walking from 17-22 miles a day often in 2-3' of snow, with temps ranging 20°-30° below 0°, leaving little time for hamming and precluding operation from 0100-1000Z for the most part. A brief interlude occurred in 1969-70 when a fire destroyed about 90% of his worldly belongings. He retired in late 1970.

Hunting, fishing, trapping, gardening, and botany have remained serious hobby interests for many years, and a botanical collection of many rarities is maintained. Propagation of these allows the plants to reach the hands of others who hold similar interests in the flora native to the U. S. A. A special interest is devoted to "alba" forms (white "sports" of

flowers that are normally another color).

Many groups such as YLRL, YL ISSB, local clubs, and nets such as YL Open House and individuals have contributed greatly to the YL totals that represent a world's record at this point. Their continued interest helps to increase the score that otherwise could never be achieved alone under the existing local adversities of noise, low power, lack of a beam and SSB, and an unfavorable setup in relation to the surrounding terrain.

Howy writes that contacts with new YLs not already in the log, preferably on CW, via sked, etc., would be much appreciated, and he sends

thanks to everyone's helping hand!

Marge, K4RNS

Marge, K4RNS, currently has more than 1400 YL QSLs. She's a regular check-in on YL Open House on Wednesdays at 1900Z on 14.288 MHz and on YL Tangle Net on Thursdays at 1800Z on 14.295 MHz. If you haven't worked her before, drop by and say "Hi" and meet many of the other YLs on frequency. You'll be made very welcome by these two friendly groups.

As soon as Marge received her amateur radio license in 1957, she started operation as a Novice, then upgraded to General. She was pleasantly surprised to find so many other YL operators. Marge joined YLRL in 1958 and found out about the nets and contests. While working on the YLCC award, she noticed Howy listed with his high score of YLs confirmed and decided she would try and catch up to him. She was doing pretty well until her OM Jim, K4RNR, became a SK and she went back to the business world for about eight years.

Marge's score is still behind Howy, but she discovered that she had more YL contacts confirmed than any other YL operator. She says it's a wonderful project and it's been so much fun meeting so many YLs. Some have become friends through the years. She has enjoyed their QSLs and the

help they have given her on the nets and in the contests.

Marge has earned approximately 250 different certificates. She has made additional contacts but is neglecting to keep count now. One award that she is particularly proud of is for being the second person to work All Florida Counties. She even phoned operators and got them out of bed for that one. One of the most difficult to get was the Hawaiian YL. Many have tried unsuccessfully for that one as there just aren't that many Hawaiian YL's, but she finally made it. She also has fond memories of Mary, W9RUJ, the originator of the Grandmother's Certificate, which is now handled by Martha, WØZWL. Now Marge is a great-grandmother and a charter member of both the Grandmother's and Great-Grandmothers Certificates.

Right now her total score is 1400+ YL QSL cards, but she says, "I don't deserve any credit. The girls do for sending me their QSLs, and I had all the fun contacting them. All the certificates are beautiful. I only wish I could put them all on display. What a good time I had working for them!"

(3) SAYLARC net contacts may not be counted. (4) Work all legal HF bands and modes but no VHF - cards need not be exchanged. (5) Send log to Billie, WB2FNF. (6) Include the following: her name, call, QTH, time, date, number of contact, frequency, signal report sent and received. (7) Sign your name to certify it is correct. (8) Send \$2 with the application to Billie Robinson, WB2FNF, 270 Palmer Rd, Churchville, NY 14428.

The Young Ladies' Radio Club of Los Angeles issues the Lads 'n' Lassies certificate under the following rules: (1) Work ten members of the YLRC LA since January 1, 1952. (2) A copy of the log. showing name, call, date, time, band and type of emission may be sent in lieu of QSLs. (3) Special recognition will be shown on the certificate if all of the contacts are CW. (4) It is not necessary for all contacts to have been made from

one QTH. (5) Only one certificate shall be issued to an individual. (6) Endorsements are not issued. Certificate Custodian: Irma Weber, K6KCI, 165 North Marcello Avenue, Thousand Oaks, CA 91320.

Buckeye Belles: The requirements are (1) Ohio stations, 12 confirmed contacts with Buckeye Belles. Other U. S. stations, 8 confirmed contacts. All DX stations, 4 confirmed contacts with Buckeye Belles. (2) Send complete log data: Name, call, time, date, mode, frequency, and Buckeye Belle numbers, along with \$1.00 to help cover cost of mailing to: Marge Farinet, K8ITF, Certificate Custodian, 809 Decker Drive, Miamisburg, Ohio 45342.

Polar Amateur Radio Klub of Alaska (PARKA) - Rules will be in 1983 YLH #1.

Grandmother's Certificate - (1) Grandmothers work ten other grandmothers to earn the certificate. Work five great-grandmothers for the seal. (The list of great-grandmothers is on p. 27 of 1982 YLH #3.) Certificate Custodian is Martha Shirley, WØZWL, 907 North 7th Street, Rapid City, SD, 57701.

DL-YL: DX stations (outside Europe) work 10, Europe work 25 YLs of German Federal Republic. A QSL of a YL working at a club station (DFØ, DKØ, DLØ) counts extra, if this QSL and the own QSL of the YL show different dates. All bands, all modes, no date limit. Award also available for SWLs. Send QSLs or photocopies of QSLs and list showing call, first name and date to custodian DL3LS, Ursula Burger, 12 Furberger Str., 5630 Remscheid, West Germany. (For W-land: Cards or photocopies and list showing call, first name and date may be sent to subcustodian WAlUVJ, Karla A. Holmes, 2 Belfast Street, Nashua, NH 03063. Porto for sending back QSLs is requested.) Available also higher class and stickers. Fee: \$3.00 or equivalent. For DL extra rules.

<u>Canada</u> - CLARA offers YL-DXCC but details were not available. The Ontario Trilliums YL ARC offers the Trillium Award for working club members. Each member station counts as 1 point; Club Station VE3TOT counts 2 points. W/VE stations must earn 6 points; DX, 3 points; members, 12 points. <u>Band/Mode Endorsements</u>: Seal endorsements for each additional: 6 (W/VE), 3 (DX), 12 (members). Fee is \$1.00 or (for DX only) 10 IRCs. <u>Application</u>: Send list of calls, TOT#, and full log data with fee to: Custodian Mrs. Marion Course, VE3CLP, Oxford Ranch, R. R. #1, Walland, Ontario Canada L3B 5N4. GRC rules apply. QSLs must be in your possession.

Japan - The JLRS offers the YL-CW, YL-10, and YL-Alphabet Certificates. Details are in 1982 YLH #3.

Netherlands - The Dutch YL Club (DYLC) offers the 88 Certificate, which is available to all YL, OM, and SWL. HF 88 and VHF 88 are separate certificates. 88 points are needed to obtain the 88 certificate. Contacts from 9/5/1981 are valid. Score: HF: Contacts with DYLC members - 8 points; contacts with Dutch YL non-DYLC member - 4 points. VHF: Contacts with DYLC members - 2 points. DX YLS (YLS living in another continent than you): 11 points. So when you live outside Europe you only need 8 contacts. In Europe you need 11 contacts. To obtain the award, QSL cards must be in your possession.

Send a GCR of worked stations, signed by two radio amateurs, to: Mrs. M. Wolf-Wildeboer, PEIDZO, Pilotenweg 14 b, 8303 EJ Emmeloord, Netherlands.

Include 8 IRCs for postage. The award itself is free of charge.

There are three members of DYLC outside the Netherlands: DJØEK and VE3MRS, who both have Dutch nationality, and ON6RW, who is Belgian but a VERON member.

South Africa - Two certificates are offered: The Key Keen Klub (KKK) and Worked All YL (WAYL). No details are available.
