DX - YL TO NORTH AMERICAN YL

CW: Starts: Wednesday, April 6, 1983, at 1800 UTC
Ends: Thursday, April 7, 1983, at 1800 UTC
PHONE: Starts: Wednesday, April 13, 1983, at 1800 UTC
Ends: Thursday, April 14, 1983, at 1800 UTC

ELIGIBILITY: All licensed women operators throughout the world are invited to participate.

PROCEDURE: DX YL's call "CQ North American YL," and N.A. YL's call, "CQ DX YL."

OPERATION: All bands may be used. No cross band operation. Net contacts, repeater contacts, and contacts with OM's do not count. Stations may be worked and counted once on each band and mode.

EXCHANGE: Station worked, QSO number, RS or RST, state or country. Entries in log must also show time, band, date, and transmitter power.

SCORING: A. Phone and CW will be scored as separate contests. Submit separate logs for each contest.

B. DX YL's, including Hawaii and Alaska, may contact all the North American continent, which includes the 48 contiguous states and Canadian provinces.

C. Contestants on the North American continent (including the 48 contiguous states and Canadian provinces) may contact DX YL stations, to include Hawaii and Alaska.

D. A station may be counted once on each band for credit and one (1) point is earned for each station worked once on each band.

E. Multiply the number of QSO's by the number of different states and provinces OR countries worked. A multiplier is counted only once in the contest. It is NOT counted on each band.

F. Contestants running 150 watts or less on CW and 300 watts PEP or less on SSB, at all times, may multiply the results of (E) by 1.25 (low power multiplier).

LOGS: All logs must show state or country to qualify for awards. Do not send carbon copies of logs. Please print or type. Logs must be signed by the operator, and no logs will be returned. Remember to file separate logs for each contest. Logs must show claimed score and be postmarked by April 28, 1983, and received no later than May 23, 1983, or they will be disqualified. Please send logs to: YLRL Vice President Rose Ellen Bills, N2RE, 17 Craig Place, Pennsville, NJ 08070.

DUPLICATES: For each duplicate contact that is removed from the log by the Vice President, a penalty of three (3) additional and equal contacts will be exacted.

AWARDS: Cup to 1st place DX Phone; Cup to 1st place N.A. Phone; Cup to 1st place DX CW; Cup to 1st place N.A. CW. Plaque to highest combined CW and Phone DX score; Plaque to highest combined CW and Phone N.A. score. 2nd and 3rd place DX and N.A. winners in each contest will receive certificates.

Newark surgeon saluted as a pioneer for women

When Dr. Christine Haycock graduated from medical school in 1952, women physicians were still a rarity--less than one-tenth of 1 percent of all physicians. Women surgeons were unheard of, but a surgeon was what Haycock decided to become.

She began her career at Walter Reed Medical Center as the first woman intern in the Army's history. Haycock went on to become a board certified surgeon and opened a private practice in Newark, New Jersey. Today she is an associate professor of surgery at the New Jersey Medical School in Newark. Her female medical colleagues have increased their numbers, and recently many of them gathered to honor her.

The New Jersey Medical Women's Association paid tribute to Christine's contributions to medicine during a theater party-fundraiser at the Paper Mill Playhouse. Her associates at the medical school joined in honoring her as an outstanding physician, and one who has pioneered for other women entering the profession. Newark radio station WNJR saluted Christine with a dozen roses for her contributions to a weekly radio program on health issues. The evening included a champagne dessert reception for Haycock and her husband, Sam Moskowitz, a noted author and editor.

Christine Haycock is president of the American Medical Women's Association and past president of the New Jersey Medical Women's Association, who honored her as "Woman of the Year" in 1976. Most recently she was the recipient of the Frank L. Babbot Alumni Award from Downstate Medical School and has received numerous other awards.

We salute you, Christine, as a surgeon and a pioneer. YLRL is proud to claim you as one of its most loyal and outstanding members. Despite your demanding career, you have always made time to enjoy and cultivate your many hobbies, including photography, raising and showing miniature Schnauzers, and ham radio. Your years of service have included YLRL President and Vice-President; 2nd District Chairman; and active membership in NY/YLRL, SAYLARC, ALARA, ARRL, S. African YLs, and Australian Wireless Association.

Thankyou, WB2YBA, for being our friend and our inspiration!

At a short business meeting in December 1982, twelve BAYLARC members in attendance cast a unanimous vote to place BAYLARC on inactive status. All members of record in 1980 through 1982 were voted "lifetime members." It was voted any money in the treasury be used to cover expenses of a final issue of SPLATTER and an accompanying roster of the lifetime membership. The remaining movies be used to cover YLRI annual fees for the club's two foreign adoptees, G8LY and ZL3AAB. The fund should last through 1990 if YLRI's current fee is not increased. Any monies not used for this purpose will go to the YLRI Scholarship Fund.

"HAM OPERATOR TUNES IN THE FAMOUS"

"Rose Ellen Bills has something in common with former Arizona Senator Barry Goldwater, King Hussein of Jordan and performers Arthur Godfrey and Andy Devine. They're all amateur radio operators--known as "hams"--and Bills has talked to them and other hams living in more than 200 countries.

A secretary in Petrochemicals in Wilmington, Del., Bills became a licensed radio operator 25 years ago. She is one of only about 11,000 women hams worldwide out of a total of 420,000. Six other DuPont women are licensed operators.

On the air, Bills is known as N2RE, call letters for her station at home in Pennsville, NJ, and a mobile unit in her car.

It isn't easy to become a ham, says Bills. Requirements include licensing by the Federal Communications Commission and passing tests for proficiency in Morse Code and theory. "But like any other hobby, you'll work at it if you want it badly enough," she says. Bills has achieved Extra Class status, an advanced classification which only a small percentage of amateurs have earned.

The lure of being a ham, says Bills, is talking with people around the world. "You know everyone by their call letters, not their last name or what they do for a living," she says. Bills says King Hussein never identifies himself except by his call letters, which she knows.

What do hams talk about? "Our rigs (equipment), who we've talked to, and the latest DX (foreign country) we've worked."

Bills met her late husband, Willis Bills (W2CDZ), a laboratory technician in the former Plastics Department, on the air 22 years ago. He was in Wilmington, and she was in West Virginia. They met face to face at a ham fest (meeting of ham operators), and were married three months later.

There is a serious side to being a ham operator: the help they can provide during a disaster or accident. Bills helped notify friends and relatives of victims of a Johnstown, Pa., flood and relayed information and messages after an explosion at an Amoco Chemicals Company plant.

Bills has been named 1983 vice president of the Young Ladies Radio League, the only international women's radio club."

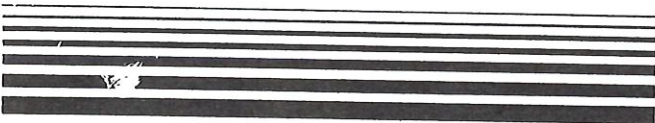

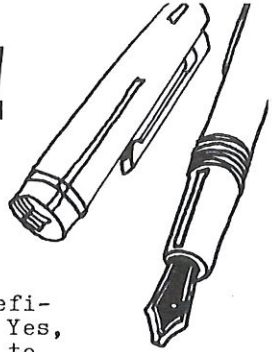

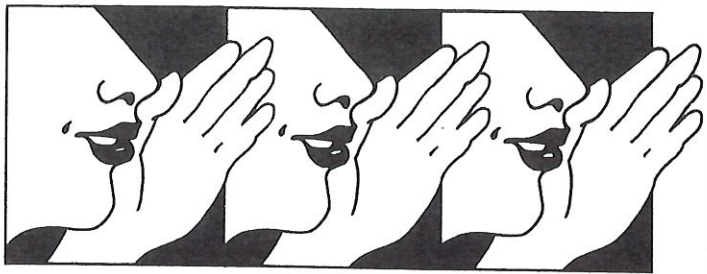

THE FOUNDATION FOR AMATEUR RADIO, INC., a non-profit organization with headquarters in Washington, D.C., plans to award ten (10) scholarships for the academic year 1983-1984. The Foundation, composed of fifty local area amateur radio clubs, fully funds two of these scholarships from the proceeds of the Gaithersburg (MD) Hamfest. 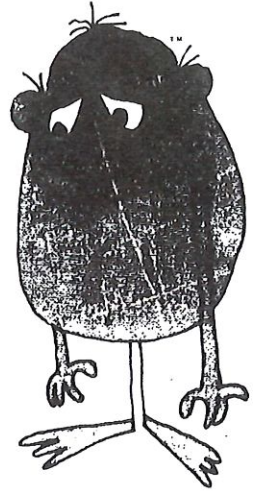
