

Inge, PJ2JY, Inge, sent info on the Brazilian YL Awards via Bert. W3TNP. BRYLA is starting a new net at 2330Z each Wednesday, especially for stations in the USA and Canada on 14.288 MHz. Look for the Brazilian YLs there. Good luck!

BRYLA - "Brazilian YL Award": Radio Amateurs are eligible for this award after two-way QSO's with:

DX - 12 YL stations from different countries (3 continents) 8 YL stations from Brazil

PY - 20 YL stations from Brazil

5 YL stations from different countries (3 continents) Contacts must be made from the same QTH, in any band or any mode and in accordance with international regulations on amateur radio. QSO July 75 on. Applicants must send a standard log certified by a recognized amateur radio association, mentioning stations worked, date, time, mode, report, and band. This award may also be earned by SWL's. When applying for the BRYLA, please send a QSL for BRYLA's files and 10 IRCs for return postage

WBYL - "Worked Brasilian YLs": Requires application to 8 YL Brasilian stations, totaling the name BRASIL YL, which can be formed by the call letters of the suffix. Example - PY2JY, PY2ATL, PT2LS, PY4AKL, etc. Valid contacts only after January 1, 1983, all band, phone or CW. It is obligatory to contact one PY2 station. Contacts must have been made from the same QTH, in any band, or in any mode and in accordance with international regulations on amateur radio. Applicants must send a standard log certified by a recognized amateur radio association, mentioning stations worked, date, time, mode, report and band. This award may also be earned by SWL's. When applying for the WBYL, please send a QSL for the files and 10 IRCs or equivalent US \$ for return postage to:

> Elizabeth, VE7BIP, sent this information on the beautiful certificates offered by the Canadian Ladies' Amateur Radio Association.

#1 - CLARA Certificate: CLARA members work 12 YLs in 6 call areas (Limit 5 VE3). Other YLs and OMs in Canada: Work 10 YLs in 5 call areas (Limit 4 VE3). DX

stations, including USA: Work 5 YLs in 3 call areas (Limit 2 VE3). ALL BANDS. All QSLs dated September 12, 1972 or later may be counted. Send \$2.00 and a copy of log sheets (QSLs must be in your possession) to CLARA Certificate Custodian and have your log verified by one other currently licensed amateur.

#2 - YL DXCC: Work YLs in 100 different countries. (Use approved DX Country

List.) Open to all YLs and OMs. Send \$2.00 and a copy of log sheet (QSLs must be in your possession) to CLARA Certificate Custodian and have your log verified by one other currently licensed amateur.

#3 - CLARA Family Certificate: Families must reside in Canada. Work 2 or more members of the same family to get family status. They need not live at the same address. All bands and modes. All QSLs dated January 1, 1975 or later may be counted. Log sheets must also show the full names and relationships of contacts. I point for working the first member of the family, 2 points for each additional family member worked. (Remember, you must work 2 or more from the same family for points.) 22 points are required for the certificate. Endorsements are issued for each additional 22 points. Example - Hallie du Preez, VE6AUP = 1; Buddy du Preez, VE6ANC=2, and Tavis du Preez, VE6BMW = 2 for a total of 5 points. Send \$2.00 and log data complete with names and relationships to CLARA Certificate Custodian and have your log verified by one other currently licensed amateur. QSLs must be in your possession.

ENDORSEMENTS ARE AVAILABLE FOR THE ABOVE CERTIFICATES, AS FOLLOWS:

#1 - Endorsements are available for each group of 5, 10, or 12 Canadian contacts.

#2 - Endorsements are available for each additional 10 countries worked with YLs.

#3 - Endorsements are available for each 22 points.

So I did a little research and found the blue bird and the rose were the official bird and flower of New York and the yellow finch and the violet were the official New Jersey bird and flower. The

certificate has each of these, plus the butterfly which is the SAYLARC symbol. I colored the roses yellow in remembrance of my mother. We enjoyed many chats on CB before I upgraded to ham radio, and if she were still

alive, I believe she would really enjoy the nets with the YLs.

The 33 in the corner becomes an 88 when an OM earns the certificate. The ring of friendship ribbon is pink for YLs and blue for OMs. If you look closely, you will find my initials, my call letters and the date it was drawn, concealed within the picture. I hope you enjoy the certificate as much as I enjoyed designing it and hand coloring it.

Rules for Earning the SAYLARC Certificate: No 6 or 2 meter contacts are accepted. Anyone inside the 2-call area is required to collect 15 contacts of SAYLARC members and all the usual information; anyone outside the 2-call area need only contact 10 SAYLARCs and the information. Send a copy of the log and \$2.00 to Billie Robinson, WB2FNF, 270 Palmer Road, Churchville, New York 14428.

So listen for the SAYLARC YLs and start your log today. Contacts may not be made during SAYLARC nets, but can be made before or after the net. SAYLARC nets are held on Friday at 9 a.m. on 3945 and Saturday at 11 a.m.

Nita, W8TAY, suggested "QRV" (I am ready) as our Official slogan in 1940.

Our diamond emblem was designed by our founder early in YLRL history. Ethel, K4LMB, chose the deep blue and silver "because she liked them."


