This original trophy has now been shipped to the QTH of our Librarian and Historian WA2RXO for safekeeping and we will continue using the smaller plaques.

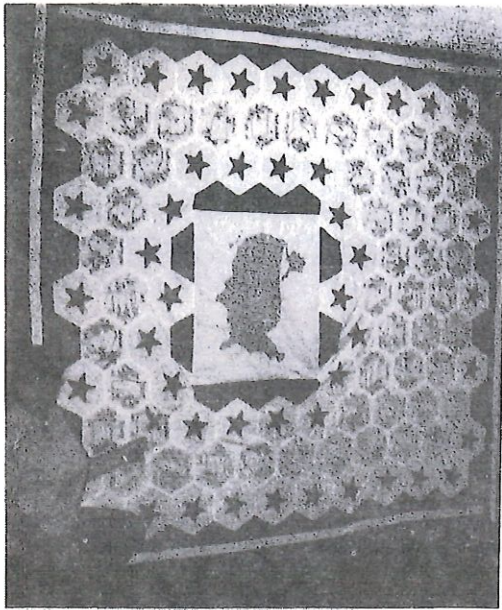

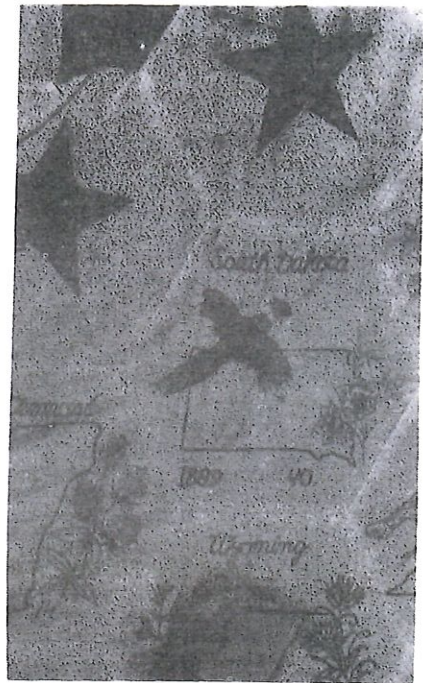

The Ontario Trilliums (TOT)

CANADA'S FIRST LADIES' AMATEUR RADIO CLUB
VE3TOT

IN THE BEGINNING...

The Ontario Trilliums evolved out of the YLs who attended the Scarborough Amateur Radio Club for gatherings. They discussed the possibility of forming a YL club in Canada, mostly Ontario, and on May 19, 1965, seven YLs met for the purpose of formally organizing the YL Radio Club. The founding members were: Doree Pettifer (then Butler), VE3EUV; Jan Burgess, VE3BII; Ivy Post (then Smyth), VE3IV; Doreen Aston, VE3FUR; Doris Taylor, VE3FRN; Jean Evans, VE3DGG; and Doris Cody, VE3BBO.

They had a lot of help from the OMs, both financially and with supplies, so much so that Bert Titmarsh VE3FPJ is known to the TOTs as the "Godfather of the TOTs".

When the YLs first became active on the air they were called the Ontario CW YL Net. Doreen VE3FUR and her daughter did a lot of work in setting up the Trillium Certificate, along with Doris VE3FRN. Jan VE3BII set up CW net procedure. Doris VE3BBO was the best treasurer and held the position for many years, pinching the nickels we had and getting reinforced by OM Dave and Steve VE3BAR and VE3BBC, Bert VE3FPJ and others. QSL cards for the TOTs were also made available.

The NIBs fund was started by Trilliums with their OMs, working to get 5 licensed white caners at the same time. Many received their licenses afterwards and were helped to get on the air. The RSO then offered to take over the job, so the TOTs stepped aside.

In September 1967 The Ontario Trilliums decided it would be nice to have an All Canada YL club. So, as a Centennial Project, the TOTs (with a lot of preparation and meetings) formed "CLARA", Canadian Ladies' Amateur Radio Assn.

In 1969 they tackled the first convention at the Canadiana, with Doris VE3BBO as chairman. It was a success. It was here that Bert VE3FPJ gave the Trilliums the phrase, "GET INVOLVED AND PARTICIPATE".

In 1971, the Ontario Trilliums, via Doree VE3EUV and her boss at Sunnybrook Hospital, started a class for veterans and, with the help of Metro Club OMs, set up a station. After many hours of work by faithful YLs and OMs, station VE3SBH was finally on the air with special gadgets for paraplegics to use, with forehead to turn the dials, etc. The women's Auxiliary at the hospital made a large donation which made it possible. They eventually formed their own club, Sunnybrook ARC. Touch Operated Selector Control unit was incorporated into the station by OM Larry VE3FXQ.

On August 7, 1975 the Trilliums took on another vast project. They agreed to accept the work of the ARRL VE3QSL Bureau. The previous QSL Mgr was ill and unable to carry on. So the TOTs appointed Jean VE3DGG as the QSL Mgr and a committee was set up to advise and consult. The Ontario Trilliums still manage the VE3ARRL/CRRL QSL Bureau. Quite a number of the Trilliums look after various files and now involve OMs also. The TOTs are very grateful to the many clubs and persons who have made donations to the Bureau, to help with some expenses not covered by the ARRL/CRRL group. Donated postage and such helps to keep our files cleared.

Trillium members are also involved with CARF, Canadian Amateur Radio Federation. Jean VE3DGG is also QSL Mgr for that group. Many Trilliums and OMs help her. Thanks to all the helpers.

AND NOW...

On May 11, 1985 The Ontario Trilliums will be celebrating their 20th Birthday at Howard Johnson's Hotel, Progress Court, Scarborough, Ontario. The founding members are still active, with the exception of Doris VE3FRN. The Trilliums have the TOT-TOPICS which is published four times a year, in June, September, December, and March. The Editor (for 16 years) is Thelma VE3CLT.

The Trillium Net meets every Saturday (except during July and August) on 3.770 MHz at 2000 GMT in summer and 2100 GMT in winter.

I would like to mention all the faithful and hard-working TOTs. They are valued.

YL - OM "MIDWINTER" CONTEST

(The first YL-OM contest in Europe on the HF bands has been organized by 3 YL-Clubs. Every year another Club is organizer. For 1985 the Dutch YL Club (DYLC) is organizer. DYLC is affiliated by VERON. The other participants are the English YL-club BYLARA and the Belgium YL Club BYLC which is affiliated by UBA. All licensed amateurs throughout Europe are invited to participate.)

MIDWINTER-CONTEST RULES

DATE and PERIOD: Each second full weekend in January. For 1985, Jan. 12/13.

CW Saturday January 12: From 0700 UTC till 1900 UTC.

PHONE Sunday January 13: From 0700 UTC till 1900 UTC.

BANDS: All bands may be used, 3.5 to 29.7 MHz, CW and SSB (no cross-mode). Please use the band-sections according to IARU-recommendations-(Region 1).

PROCEDURE: YLs call "CQ Contest", OMs call "CQ YL".

YLs work YLs and OMs. OMs work YLs only.

EXCHANGE: Station worked, RS(T) + QSO-serial number, OMs start at 001, YLs start at 2001, Country. Entries in log must also show time, band and date, YL or OM.

POINTS: Each QSO with a YL, confirmed, counts 5 (five) points. Each QSO with an OM counts 3 (three) points. One station may be worked only once per band. Stations worked outside Europe also count.

MULTIPLIER: 1 (one) point for every worked DXCC country.

FINAL SCORE: Sum of QSO-points of all bands multiplied by final multiplier.

SWLs: Each different heard YL station counts 5 (five) points, multiplier as above. Logs must also show the foreign station worked with.

LOGS: As usual, a score-calculation is required. Please use a multiplier-column and insert multiplier only if it is a new one. A log has to be signed for observations of the contest-rules. Please print or type!

From Joan Upton, KD7YB . . . **EXCITEMENT!** - during Public Service Event

On 28 July 1984 members of the Marion-Polk Counties ARES group, Salem ARC and some non-affiliated hams provided communications for the 6th annual Willamette River (Oregon) Raft Race for the Muscular Dystrophy Assn. We manned 6 "guard" boats, 3 portable land stations, and the Polk County Sheriff's boat, and had 1 home station on standby to make phone calls, if needed.

We practiced the use of tactical callsigns using the designation "River 1", etc. for the boats and the portable land stations used location names. The procedure we used provided an efficient calling routine.

The race started at 8:00 a.m. and continued till 5:00 p.m. Most of the day was taken up with transfers of people from land to boats and vice-versa, and very commonplace communications.

Around 3:30 p.m. River 1 (N7FLE) called in and asked Control to notify the Polk County Sheriff's boat that they were going to be moving up the river

at full speed to transport a child who might be suffering from blood poisoning up river to the parent's car. The child's mother had declined our offer to call for an ambulance. KA7QQV who was aboard the Sheriff's boat overheard the exchange between Control and River 1 and informed the deputies who cleared a path for River 1.

While this run was being made, River 6 (WB7OEX) called in saying they were coming in with a young woman they had pulled from the water, and that she was having trouble breathing. The Medic assigned to the race from the city of Salem was at a land station close to River 6. He had been on River 3 but was deposited on land when that boat ran into some motor problems. The medic's location proved to be the right place at the right time for the victim.

Within a very few minutes River 6 reported the victim had stopped breathing. I handed the mike to the Medic and he asked if anyone aboard knew CPR. Fortunately, Barb, the skipper of River 3 had had CPR training. She stopped the boat and got the victim breathing again.

The Sheriff's boat had just about completed clearing the path up river for River 1 when KA7QQV, overhearing the communications and realizing that the situation on board River 6 was becoming more serious, held a quick conference with the deputies and they decided to turn around, pick up the medic and rendezvous with Boat 6. The Sheriff had a jet boat with a shallow draft and could really make knots. And, they did.

Meanwhile, River 4 (N7DSL & KA7NYL) drew up to River 6. The skipper is a police officer and had CPR training. He climbed aboard River 6 and he and Barb both worked on the victim while Russ, a passenger on River 6 got the boat going again and headed for our land station.

As the boats headed towards each other, the medic gave me the number to call direct for an ambulance and the rescue squad. I was just about to bring up the auto patch when KA7CUI, a member of the Marion County Fire Department, called to tell us that he had used his fire-frequency HT and had called for the emergency equipment. It was on its way.

Hearing this, KA7RZG left the Control site on the river bank and headed for the road, which is about 400 yards uphill from the beach, to flag the medics and direct them down to the beach.

The Sheriff's boat picked up the medic and headed north to rendezvous with River 6. Upon examining the victim and after working on her, the medic said, "transport immediately", and the victim was transferred to the Sheriff's boat because of its greater speed and its relatively flat position at that speed which would enable the medic to continue emergency treatment. KA7KDM then rushed to the beach and cleared away rafts and people so the boat could beach quickly and safely. He also stood there and signaled them in. Willing hands gently lifted her onto the beach and about that time the ambulance arrived. It seemed that the ambulance crew had barely started oxygen when the rescue squad, Medic 2, arrived. The victim was taken to Salem Hospital where she was treated, and released later in the evening. We were thrilled when the medic told us, "You've got a save". And, it was my pleasure to QST all the boats with the good news.

We were told that our ability to communicate from on site told the difference.

From Rachel Nelson, WA6EQA . . . A Visit to Newfoundland and Labrador

We visited Newfoundland and Labrador--accent on the last syllable of both words. Before we went, we heard that the place was barren, had impossible roads, terrible prices, but friendly people. Actually, even the south coast of Labrador is mantled in green. Wild flowers bloom freely in the summer.

The roads are better surfaced than ours and paved roads go to far more isolated places. The prices are no joy, but can be dealt with, like our own. Ferry fares do require planning ahead.

The people are great! Just routine contact often produces family hospitality and unbelievable generosity. The land defies description. Along the northern peninsulas which bristle into the Atlantic, it is like a series of Yosemite's with the top 1000 feet ground down by glaciers, now flanked by forest and brush. Some valleys are dry-floored, some are lakes (called ponds), others are fjords filled with sea water. The tablelands on top have lakes in rocky saucers and thick muskeg and tundra. The wildlife go with it too. There are caribou herds there, though we didn't see them.

And the whole island has the Labrador current! In mid-summer the temperature lingers in the high 50s and low 60s on sunny days. It is as northerly as our boundary with western Canada--the 49th parallel.

A famous Newfoundland item is nearly extinct--the Newfoundland dog. We found three of the huge creatures in a private kennel in Harbor Grace.

The Provincial trailer parks are free to senior citizens from anywhere. The provincial sales tax is 12% and rising.

Upon seeing our Texas license a teenager asked, "Do you own an oil well?" Everyone knows "J.R."

The Newfoundland radio amateurs were equally delightful. a 2-meter contact usually produced an invitation to the home. Almost always a ham or two drove out unannounced and stopped us for an eyeball in town. A ham can easily identify our truck or the trailer. If you ask for directions, somebody supplements the instructions by leading you in his car!

In Red Bay, Labrador, we watched crews of archeologists from their one University in St. John's unearth the facilities in which Portuguese barrelled whale oil for shipment home. The archeologists computerize their findings at the University. A 1565 shipwreck is being raised.

Since the 1500s the people in Newfoundland and Labrador earned their living by fishing and still do. Over the centuries they developed skills in fixing fish and seafood that is just a delight. Strangely, you have to search a bit for native cuisine, or maybe learn it yourself and find the ingredients. Restaurants offer mostly mainland dishes.

On the east coast of Newfoundland you see specialized vessels and helicopters serving the oil platforms on the Grand Banks--but it is not Newfoundland's oil. Labrador has the biggest hydroelectric plant in the world at Churchill Falls. All of the power goes to Quebec and the U.S.A. and none to the Newfoundlander who must cut enormous piles of wood to supplement his winter heat. Huge foreign paper companies own most of the forests.

We had an introduction to Jim Strong, a big man in the town of Little Bay. He once owned, with his family, a 50-vessel sealing fleet. Now it's all gone and none of them live on the island that was their base.

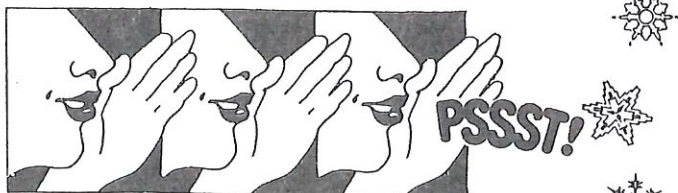
St. John's, the capital of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador hosted the Pope while we were there. In past centuries people have been hanged here for practicing Catholicism but now they are the majority. The entire city throbbled. Everything was being cleaned, painted, and decorated. In three locations, major altars were constructed. Unfortunately, the visit was the occasion for weather that was terrible, even by Newfoundland standards. Hurricane Diana was blowing out on the Grand Banks.

Much of our visit was good photographically. We have put together a brief slide program should anyone wish to see it.

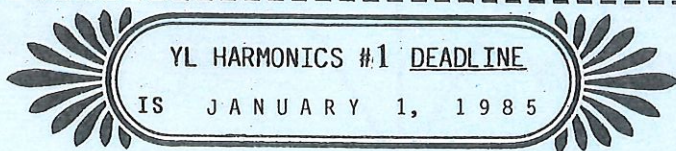
