## PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGES

These proposed changes affect only the By-Laws and Procedure Policy. This page explains the reasons for the proposed changes. The ballot will be on a loose insert in this issue of HARMONICS. Please take the time to read about the proposed changes and send your vote to the Secretary (her address is on the ballot). Ballots must be postmarked not later than Dec. 1st, 1987-

### BY - LAWS

#### ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Sec. 1 - "The President shall at least twice a year. Prior to taking office on January 1st, she shall appoint one of the newly elected District Chairmen to serve as Chairman of the Nominating Committee"

CHANGE TO READ: "The President shall...at least twice a year. The President shall appoint one of the District Chairmen to serve as Chairman of the Nominating Committee during her first year in Office and no later than July of that year. "

REASON: This should have been changed when the President's length of office was changed from one year to two, because she no longer needs to appoint the Nominating Committee Chairman prior to taking office as President.

#### ARTICLE X - ELECTIONS

Sec. 1 - "Prior to taking office on January 1st, the President shall appoint one of the newly elected District Chairmen to serve as Chairman of the Nominating Committee"

CHANGE TO READ: During her first year in office, and no later than July of that year, the President shall appoint one of the District Chairmen to serve as Chairman of the Nominating Committee"

REASON: This should have been changed when the President's length of office was changed from one year to two, because she no longer needs to appoint the Nominating Committee Chairman prior to taking office.

#### ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Sec. 5 - "Each District Chairman and member of the Board of Directors. District Chairmen shall be responsible for making a convention kit available."

DELETE the final sentence "District Chairmen shall be responsible for making a convention kit available."

REASON: This sentence has created a problem ever since it was added to the By-Laws because there were no financial details arranged such as who should pay for the kits and the shipping expenses to and from ham gatherings. There are 15 District Chairmen and the Board does not feel 15 kits are necessary. Very few of the present

District Chairmen assembled convention kits because of all the questions that arose.

The Board of Directors feels it would be better for the Publicity Chairman to have several assistants with convention kits, each located in different areas of the United States. The Publicity Chairman at present has a convention kit which she sends to YL groups who request it, but often two or more groups ask for it for the same date.

PROCEDURE POLICY

If the vote to delete the final sentence of By-Laws Article VII, Sec. is approved, it is proposed to add another paragraph to the Procedure Policy, as follows:

"The Publicity Chairman shall appoint four assistants located in various areas of the United States, who will each have a convention kit to send to conventions and other amateur gatherings when requested. The kits will be financed by YLRL, including the shipping charges."

REASON: To make the handling of convention kits the duty of the Publicity Chairman and her Assistants, instead of the District Chairman.

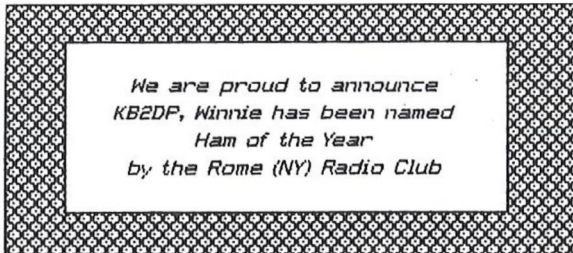
