Project Goodwill Albania

Kay Goodwin, KF6GW

At a Phoenix meeting of the Cactus Net, I met and talked with Marenglen "Geni" Merna, ZA1B. He is one of the first radio amateurs to be licensed by Albania in thirty-eight years, and is much sought after as a DX contact. Members called him "the most famous ham in the world." There were thousands waiting to talk when he first got on the air, and he handled a somewhat daunting situation very calmly. He admitted he was nervous but excited.

He had just had the first of two surgeries, which were responsible for his being in the country, as his medical condition could not be handled in Albania. When word of his plight reached outside, an international plea for assistance was answered by other amateurs and resulted in an eight-month scurry to line up visas, donations for plane fare, medical care, surgery, housing, etc. Japanese amateurs were particularly helpful.

It was Martti Laine, OH2BH, who organized Project Goodwill Albania when he learned that his friend Genie needed life-saving medical treatment that was not available in Albania. He found assistance from amateurs in Europe, North America, and Asia. In addition, Valley Lutheran Hospital, in Mesa, Arizona, donated its services, Swiss Air flew Geni to the U.S. and back home for free, and even the politicians and diplomats helped out.

Senator John McCain, of Arizona, helped to expedite Geni's visa through the U.S. Embassy, and when Geni arrived at the airport in Los Angeles, a U.S. Customs and Immigrations supervisor met him and whisked him past all the long lines. Geni was only slowed by the well-wishes of several of the other Customs agents.

Dr. Warren Hill, KF7AY, of Mesa, coordinated events in Mesa. He was one of Geni's hosts, as was the surgeon who performed the needed surgeries. Geni is learning the Finnish language from his surgeon and also speaks fluent Russian, English and French. He's in charge of Albania's telecommunications.

News of YLRL Members



YLRL members and the entire Amateur Radio community lost a tireless advocate and a dear friend with the passing of Lenore Jensen, W6NAZ, on May 5, 1993. Lenore was first licensed in 1939, and she promoted Amateur Radio and gave selflessly of her considerable talents for the past 54 years. She was honored many times for her public service.

In 1983, Lenore received the Special Achievement award at the Dayton Hamvention for her public relations work. She recorded many celebrities for ARRL public service announcements, wrote the "Who's Who in Amateur Radio" column for *Wordradio* magazine, and for decades ran phone patches for military personnel, including 68,000 for Army MARS during the Vietnam War.

Lenore was a charter and lifelong member of YLRL, serving as Second District Chairman in 1946, as Vice-President in 1947 and 1948, and as Editor of the first two YL directories. Active on CW and voice. Lenore set a shining example for all of us and will be remembered as a very special YL.

Hazel Cain, K9QGR, started YLRL's Tape Topics program back in the '50s, when she first recorded materials for the blind YLs. Her husband Claude, K9HRC, is blind, and that led to her idea, which has been of benefit to many YLs for over 40 years.

In the early days, large tape reels were used. Postage was free, and each tape had labels that were pre-addressed so that when a YL received it and listened to it, the tape could then be sent on to the next one, eventually returning to Hazel.

Hazel has made many of the banquet table gifts and many handmade gifts for past YLRL conventions and has made some very nice surprises for YLs attending this year's meeting. She hopes to be there. Hazel was 88 on April 30, and has been a YLRL member since the 1950s.



Asian YL Meeting '93



YLs from Germany, Switzerland, Korea, Italy, Norway, Finland, Sweden, Netherlands, Wales, the U. S., New Zealand, and from all across Japan came to Osaka to meet old friends and to make new ones in April. The organizers of this very successful meeting were Kyoko Miyoshi, JR3MVF; Nozomi Gohara, JH3SQN; Hiromi Hishiki, JJ1CAS; Hiroko Inui, JH3CIB; Taeko Shirasu, JR3HII; and Nobuko Uchiyama, JR6XIX. Many other JA YLs helped make this an exceptional meeting.

Registration opened at noon on April 3, and each attendee received a bag loaded with gifts, including a beautiful scarf, with callsigns of all the registered YLs printed on it. A Japanese tea ceremony was arranged so that small groups of three or four YLs could learn about and enjoy this traditional activity. And if you've attended a YL meeting before, you can imagine all the QSLs and small presents being exchanged as the visiting and photo-taking began.

That night, a welcome party was held, with dinner and several slide presentations of past YL DXpeditions. Miyo, JR3MVF, talked about operations in Vietnam and Laos; Jeanie, WA6UVF, talked about the BT4YL operation, which Miyo was also a part of; Nobuko, JR6XIX, talked about the 8Q7YL operation, and Greta, HB9ARC, showed slides of her Swiss countryside.

The next morning, everyone gathered for the official meeting. Each YL was presented with a station plaque with her own callsign from Yaesu, and everyone introduced herself, with many YLs using a second language, for this international group. At noon, the group photo, shown on page 10, was taken, and then it was back inside for a delightful luncheon.

Later that afternoon, we visited Osaka Castle, and in the evening, a spectacular banquet was held. Sayoko, JJ3WWS, and Hiroko, JH3CIB, were the charming MCs, and there were prizes for everyone. Both the Korean YLs and the European YLs sang beautiful songs in their native languages, and everyone joined in singing a German song. YLs in kimonos and wearing Korean or European traditional costumes added to the festive spirit.

After a visit to the Icom factory on Monday morning, the meeting came to an end, but not the good time! Special sightseeing had been arranged in Nara and Kyoto for those who could stay over. It was a great privilege to see shrines, temples, dances, tea ceremonies, and other events that would not have been possible without the efforts of many Japanese YLs, who not only pre-arranged all the details, but also spent their days and evenings with us.

Very special evenings were spent in the homes of Nozomi Gohara, JH3SQN, and Takako Takeuchi, JR3HGX, in Kyoto. We had a kimono party at Ken and Nozomi's, where all the visitors had a chance to be dressed in a kimono, and on another night there was traditional music. Takako and her OM also had a wonderful party, with many delicacies, singing, and much joy, conversation, and laughter. Some of the group then went on to Tokyo and were warmly hosted by Fumi Abe, JA1AEQ.

The purpose of this meeting was to give YLs a chance to make friends from around the world and to contribute to international friendship, and that goal was certainly achieved. It was a perfect time and place for making friendships and for enjoying them.

Adopt a DX YL!

The objective of YLRL's DX Sponsorship Program is to promote friendship and support for YLs and YL groups around the world. This is how it works: through my correspondence with YLs in other countries and personal letters of inquiry. I get names of DX YLs who would like to join YLRL.

I then send them an application, on which they can indicate if they would like a sponsor. If so, I try to find a sponsor in the U. S. Often the DX YLs wish to reciprocate the sponsorship by making their sponsor a member in a YL organization in their own country.

This is convenient for payment of dues since it is costly for DX YLs to send an international money order. In some countries, it has been difficult, if not impossible, to pay in U. S. dollars.

The sponsor who accepts reciprocal sponsorship in a foreign YL group will receive newsletters from that organization and encouragement to get acquainted with other DX YLs through their contests and nets. This is a good way to learn about activities of YLs in other countries and a good way to build friendships. Usually there is some exchange of correspondence.

Dues are payable now for 1993. The cost of sponsoring a DX YL is \$16.00 a year, which covers the cost of air mail postage for *YL Harmonics*, as well as dues. We now have quite a few DX YLs whose sponsors were unable to renew their membership this year. If you are interested in adopting one of these YLs or a YL from a country of your choice, please let me know. It should be a very rewarding experience for you.

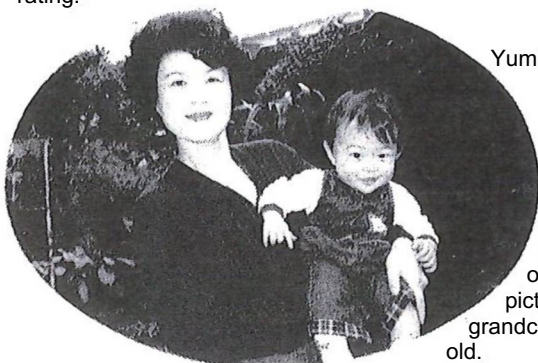
