

CLARA and Family HF Contest

Why Albany?

The City

Miriam Lamb, AA2DX, continues her series of articles on Albany, New York, site of the 1996 YLRL Convention, to be held July 11- 14, 1996.

Henry Hudson entered New York Bay in 1609 and spent the following month exploring the river, which was to be named for him, from its mouth to about the present site of the city of Albany, about 150 miles north of New York City. The region's fertile valleys and abundant game attracted Dutch settlers. Fort Nassau, a Dutch trading post, was established in 1614. Fort Orange was built in 1624, but when it surrendered to the British in 1664, the city's name was changed to honor the duke of York and Albany (later James II). There are visible signs of these early Dutch settlers, most particularly at Quackenbush Square, location of the Albany Visitors Center.

The so-called Albany Congress met here in 1754, which adopted Benjamin Franklin's Plan of Union, a forerunner of the U. S. Constitution, thus firmly establishing Albany as the "Cradle of the Union." The city suffered heavy damage during the American Revolution. In 1797 it was chosen as the permanent state capital.

Albany is best seen on walking tours, all of which lead you eventually to the magnificent Empire state Plaza, built during the Nelson A. Rockefeller administrations, at a cost of two billion dollars. Its reflecting pools, museums, and art displays are not to be missed. From the observation platform on the 42nd floor of the Corning tower, one can see the Catskill, Adirondack and Berkshire mountains.

BYLARA AWARDS

The British Young Ladies Amateur Radio Association (BYLARA) offers some beautifully designed awards for working its YL members.

The basic certificate is the BYLARA Award, which requires Europeans to work 15 YL members of BYLARA, including 10 British YLs (G, GM, GW, GI, GD, GJ, and GU). For those outside Europe, 10 BYLARA YL members, including 6 British YLs are required.

For the Advanced BYLARA Award,

Europeans must work 30 YL BYLARA members, including 20 British YLs. Outside Europe, 20 YL BYLARA members, including 12 British YLs, must be worked.

The Scottish BYLARA Award requires Europeans to work 6 YL BYLARA members, operating with the GM prefix. Outside Europe, everyone must work 4 YL BYLARA members, with a GM prefix.

YLs must be BYLARA members at the time of contact. All bands and all modes can be used, with one contact per member.

These certificates are available to all YLs, OMs, and SWLs. No QSLs are necessary, but BYLARA membership numbers, dating from September 1, 1988, must be included. Send log data, signed by applicant, with a fee of 1.50 sterling, 8 IRCs, or US \$4.00 to Ella Tugwell, G0FIP, 67 Upper Kingston Lane, Shoreham-by-Sea, Sussex BN43 6TG, England.

Helping Hands in Laos

In August, 1994, my OM Dom and I went to Lao P.D.R. to visit and help my friend Sumiko Ogawa, JS6KEJ. Sumiko is a member of JLRS and JICA (Japan International Collaborate Agency), and she speaks the Laotian language very well.

When we arrived at the Sakhon-Nakhon Airport in Thailand, we found it is on an Army base. An officer saw my camera and shook his head at once. We had a 1 1/2 hour drive from the airport to Nakhom-Phanom, beside the Mekong riverside on the border of Thailand and Laos. It was exciting to see this famous Mekong River, and as we crossed it in a small riverboat, I touched the river, which was very brown water. We were then in Thakhek city of Khammouane prefecture in Lao P.D.R.


After a Laotian lunch with Sumiko, we left in her Mitsubishi jeep to visit a village where there was a VHF station. Sumiko is helping with Lao hygiene, but as there is no telephone outside Thakhek city, she would like to use the 2-meter transceiver instead of the telephone between the medical stations.

The medical stations are small hospitals without doctors. Some young people who took a short course in medicine are working instead of the doctor in Khammouane prefecture. Sumiko set the three radio stations by herself two years before, but she wanted to repair the antennas and set one more station so she asked Dom to help. Because of the bumpy road, it took 2 1/2 hours to drive 50 kilometers by car. It was the rainy season and the road was flooded with rain.

The first village we visited was Mahaxai, and the young people and some nurses managed the radio station there very well. Dom tested the transmitter and it was fine.

The next morning we went to Sebanfai and set a new 2-meter station. Many young men helped us and did a good job. This time, the road was very fine. After a Laotian lunch, we took a little rest and started to the next village. We got into a small boat and moved down the stream for one hour. We visited a house where there was a small medicine box (100 x 50×30 centimeters), which seemed to be the house of the village mayor, who was managing the medicine box. After coming back to Thakhek city, we went to the market, where almost all the sellers were women. They were very active and were selling everything. It was fun. We took dinner near the market.

The next morning (August 20), we went to another village to change the 2-meter antenna and cable. The road was fine. Most Lao women wear the lapping skirts called "shing," which are usually home spun. The



material is silk or cotton, and the color was so beautiful that I bought many shings, (Dom said, "Would you open the shop of shing?") Our suitcase was full of gifts from Japan, but it was empty now so I could buy anything! In the afternoon, I went to the market again. It was fun.

On the morning of August 21, we changed a 10 MHz inverted-V antenna on the Public Health Office to a new one which Dom had made. At the beginning Sumiko was stung on the hand by a bee, and she went home to apply some

Dom, JR6XIW, and Ton, JR6XIX went home to apply some medicine. So I had to tell the

young Lao men, who were on the roof about 10 meters high, about how to take off the old antenna and set on the new antenna, using body language.

In the evening, the Lao people held a special and traditional ceremony for us. They prayed and tied white cotton strings on our wrists. Then the big dinner party began, with many, many Lao foods. As we had to get up early the next morning, we returned to the hotel, packed our bags, and went to bed.

At 8:00 a.m., I touched the Mekong River again with special feelings. The Lao people who saw the white strings on our wrists said, "You did truly good job in Lao." Sumiko translated it on the boat.

We returned to Thailand in the afternoon and took the train to Ayutthaya, the old capital city. We stayed one night. The next day we went sight-seeing by "toktok" (taxi) and returned to Bangkok in the evening. We didn't feel tired in Laos, but we felt very tired in the Bangkok hotel. Dom had a fever, but I didn't.

On August 26, we met Mrs. Mayuree Sachati, HS1YL, and her beautiful daughter at the hotel lobby with two other OMs. She is a member of JLRS and came to Japan for the JLRS 25th anniversary convention in Tokyo. She treated us to a Thai dinner at the hotel restaurant, which was very delicious. I told her about the YL meeting in Berlin, and she was very interested. She had registered for the 1993 YL meeting in Osaka, but she couldn't come because she was in the hospital.

After sight-seeing and shopping for four days in Bangkok, we came home on August 27th. It was a short, but very special trip.

Operating hours on Wednesday, October 26, and Thursday, October 27, were from 1700 - 2000 UTC. Dot operated 20 meter phone and Deb worked 75 meter phone during the event.

We enjoyed our visit and the opportunity to spend so much time on the air at the world's best-known Amateur Radio station.

W1AW staff members Jeff and Scott helped us greatly in setting up the operating positions and by answering all our questions. Jeff even acted as our personal photographer for the outside pictures and Scott took the inside shots.

Our operating styles are very similar, and sometimes we both included brief conversations with contacts. Dot did a mini-survey among the mobile stations to determine the preferred type of mobile antenna. She also did a signal comparison for a ham in Minnesota as he was doing some antenna work! Some contacts even reminisced abut their own visits to ARRL Hq.

One interesting conclusion we made was that the pile-ups seemed not to be for W1AW alone—but for contact with a YL at W1 AW!

Most of Deb's contacts were OMs and, as always with Amateur Radio, many of the contacts were unique learning experiences. She talked to three fellows who were operating portable in a hunting camp in Township 24, somewhere in Maine—even they weren't sure where! Many of the OMs were older hams, some having been in the hobby for 30 years or more. In fact, Deb spoke with one ham whose first contact with W1AW had been with Hiram Percy Maxim himself! She even worked an 18wheeler, mobile near Philadelphia.

Deb also learned the meaning of several terms she had not heard before—"161" as a parting salutation, being the sum of 73 and 88, and "reading the mail," meaning just listening in, may be substituted for "sand-bagging."

Deb worked a total of 72 stations in 11 states, including several YLs. Dot worked over 100 stations (including 14 YLs), with some contacts from Canada and Great Britain.

I hope everyone had a nice Christmas and that you all got some new equipment.


