YLRL is a non-profit organization, granted under section (501) (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, comprised of women amateur radio operators, incorporated as such under the laws of the State of California.

Dues are \$8.00 a year, due and payable March 1, and delinquent March 31. For new and reinstating members joining after August 31, dues are prorated by half the annual dues for that fiscal year.

Add \$4.00 for first class postage, if desired in the U.S.; it is required for Canada and Mexico. Add \$8.00 for air mail for all other DX.

Dues for a licensed YL family member (residing at the same address) are \$2.00. Subscriptions for non-members are \$8.00 per year and may not be pro-rated for portions of years. Subscribers may add the same extra postage, if first class or air mail service is desired.

**Feb. 1, 1904** — The first radio distress signal, CQD, was established today. The CQ meant "stop sending and listen" and D meant "danger." Popular interpretation was "come quick—danger." It would be superseded four years later by SOS at the International Radio Telegraphic Convention in Berlin. (From American Chronicle, by Betty and Tom Roberts.)

#### YLRL CERTIFICATES

#### Basic Rules Applicable to All YLRL Certificates

- 1. Contacts made through repeater devices or any other power relay method cannot be used for any YLRL certificate confirmation.
- 2. All contacts must be made FROM the same country.
- 3. DO NOT SEND THE QSL CARDS TO THE CUSTODIAN! Two other amateurs must sign the log verifying that the QSL cards are in possession of the applicant.
- 4. No charge is made for a certificate, but sufficient postage for first class mail or a stamped legal-size envelope must accompany the application to cover the cost of mailing the certificate.
- 5. For the order in which the contacts must be listed, please check the rules for each certificate.
- 6. All inquiries should be addressed to the appropriate custodian.
- 7. Decisions of the custodians regarding interpretations of the rules as here stated or later amended shall be final.
- 8. Certificate custodians and their addresses are listed on page 1 of YLH ...

#### YL CENTURY CLUB (YLCC)

Available to all licensed radio amateurs. Two-way communications must be established on authorized amateur bands, with stations, mobile or fixed, operated by 100 different licensed women amateurs. The same YL, using different call letters, will NOT count. Any and all amateur bands may be used.

Contacts with YLs anywhere in the world are recognized provided only that confirmations clearly indicate the stations were operated by duly licensed women amateur radio operators.

List of claimed contacts, including the full name of the operator, alphabetically arranged by LAST name, the callsign, date, band, mode, and RS(T) of each contact.

<u>Endorsements:</u> Confirmations of contacts accompanied by an alphabetical list, as described above, from stations operated by additional YLs may be submitted for credit each time 50 additional confirmations are available. Endorsements will be made to the original certificate when application is approved. Gold stickers will be awarded to applicants who have worked their additional contacts from the same country; otherwise, silver stickers will be awarded.

#### WORKED ALL STATES YL (WAS-YL)

Available to all amateurs. Contact must be made with a duly licensed YL in each of the 50 states in the U.S. The District of Columbia may be counted for Maryland. There are no time or band limitations.

The call used is immaterial, provided it is licensed to the applicant. In qualifying for this certificate, it is possible to work the SAME YL in each of the 50 states.

The list of contacts must be arranged alphabetically by state and must include the call letters, date, band, mode, RS(T) and the YL's first name.

#### WORKED ALL CONTINENTS - YL (WAC-YL)

Available to any licensed amateur in the world. Two-way communications must be established on the amateur radio bands with the six continents: North America, South America, Europe, Africa, Asia, and Oceania (which includes Australia and New Zealand). Any and all authorized amateur radio bands may be used. Cross-band contacts are permitted. Contacts may have been made over any period of time.

Contacts with all six continents must be made with duly licensed women operators. It is not necessary for each contact to be a different YL.

The call used is immaterial provided it is licensed to the applicant.

Submit a list of claimed contacts, including the full name of the operator (alphabetically arranged by continent), her callsign, and the date of each contact.

#### YL-DXCC

Available to any licensed amateur in the world. Two-way communications must be established on authorized amateur bands with stations (fixed or mobile), operated by licensed YLs from 100 countries on the current ARRL list of countries.

Any band or mode (except cross-band contacts) may be used.

A verified list must be IN THE SAME ORDER as the ARRL countries list and NOT alphabetically in any other way. The log must show country worked, station worked, date, time, frequency, RS(T) reports and the YL's name.

<u>Endorsements:</u> After receiving the certificate, a silver sticker will be awarded for contacts with YLs in 25 additional DX countries. List requirements are the same as for the original application.

#### DX YL

Available to licensed YL operators only, for working 25 DIFFERENT licensed women operators outside your own country on or after April 1, 1958. USA and possessions are counted as separate countries, as well as Alaska and Hawaii. Any and all amateur bands may be used.

Contacts do not have to be with 25 different countries, just 25 different DX YLs.

The call used is immaterial, provided it is licensed to the applicant.

The log must show date, time, station worked, frequency, her report, your report, mode, her name and QTH and must be arranged alphabetically by her last name.

<u>Endorsements:</u> Stickers will be awarded for each 10 additional DX YLs, subject to the same confirmation as above.

#### CONTINUOUS MEMBERSHIP CERTIFICATE

This certificate is available ONLY to YLRL members. It is awarded automatically to any YL who has been a member, continuously for five years. Diamond-shaped stickers are awarded for each additional five years of continuous membership. No application is necessary, but if you have any questions, contact the certificate custodian.

# AN ALBANIAN EXPERIENCE - 1994

As we approached the terminal building, a familiar figure ran towards us: Geni, ZA1B, was welcoming us on our second visit to Albania. Formalities completed, we met other friends who awaited our arrival and were driven into Tirana. (Surely there's much more traffic, we thought!) On the way into Tirana, our friends proudly pointed out new buildings and commented on the many cars. We had heard that there were many changes in Albania, but we were not prepared for what we saw!

We first visited Albania in 1992 and stayed in the Hotel Tirana; in 1994, however, the hotel was under reconstruction, and we stayed at the apartment of a friend near the center of the city.

Shortly after arriving in Tirana, Geni accompanied us to get our licenses; once again we would operate ZA/G3MHV (OM Terry) and ZA/KA6ZYF. We carried our equipment and a G5RV dipole, which we put on the roof of the apartment building, and worked from this station on CW. From Geni's station, and using his 3-element tribander on the roof of Tirana's central hospital, we operated exclusively on SSB. From one station to the other it was an hour's walk—very good exercise, especially after several hours of operating! Although nowadays one often hears signals from Albania, our operation was enthusiastically received so that we worked pile-ups until the bands closed down. I remain the only foreign YL to have operated from Albania.

We were fascinated to go sightseeing around Tirana, discovering new things: sidewalk cafes, restaurants, street vendors, shops full of goods (but very high prices by Albanian standards), buildings under renovation. We visited the Botanic Garden; climbed up the minaret in the mosque; went for a picnic at Mount Dajti, a half-hour drive east of the center, and enjoyed the panoramic view of Tirana and its surrounding hills.



Travelling outside of Tirana to the north, we saw beaches, walked among castle ruins and visited a pheasant farm. Travelling to the south, we had a traditional lunch of lamb roasted in the open air; saw an ancient monastery, and drove along the coast and over narrow mountain roads, enjoying spectacular views of valleys, mountains and the sea.

Albania has many problems that will undoubtedly take many years to solve. But it is a beautiful land rich in history. When adequate tourist facilities exist, more people will be able to see Albania; it has much to offer the visitor. Once again, we must thank all our Albanian friends who helped to make this journey a memorable experience.




Hello, ladies. Winter is almost over. When you get this in the mail, tulips should be starting to bloom and spring will really be here.
