FAR Scholarships

The Foundation For Amateur Radio, Inc., a non-profit organization with headquarters in Washington, D.C., plans to administer sixty (60) scholarships for the academic year 1997-1998 to assist licensed Radio Amateurs. The Foundation, composed of over seventy-five local area Amateur Radio Clubs, fully funds five of these scholarships with the income from grants and its annual Hamfest. The remaining fifty-five (55) are administered by the Foundation without cost to the various donors.

Licensed Radio Amateurs may compete for these awards if they plan to pursue a full-time course of studies beyond high school and are enrolled, or have been accepted for enrollment, at an accredited university, college or technical school. The awards range from \$500 to \$2500 with preference given in some cases to residents of specified geographical areas or the pursuit of certain study programs. Clubs, especially those in Delaware, Florida, Maine, Maryland, New Jersey, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia and Wisconsin, are encouraged to announce these opportunities at their meetings, in their club newsletters, during training classes, on their nets and on their world wide web home pages.

I'm not a typical amateur radio operator, but who is these days? I don't have a great interest in electronics, nor have I ever built anything radio related. The reason I hold a ticket is that I had to quit work (at age 32), and my grandfather Hy Cohen, W7EOE talked me into getting licensed so I'd have something enjoyable to do.

Additional pertinent personal information includes: 1) the fact that I'm married; 2) OM DickKC7DPI, whose passion is the Internet, not ragchewing, provides all of my fine motor control, meaning he does everything that requires some coordination; 3) I have had relapsing-remitting Multiple Sclerosis for eleven years; 4) I am 37 years old.

Two and a half months ago I had a major relapse. I couldn't see, couldn't walk, could barely sit up, and worst of all, I couldn't hunt-and-peck (type). I'd been corresponding with lots of people all over the world, and particularly with YLs in the U.S., many of whom I'd met on the YL Packet Net.

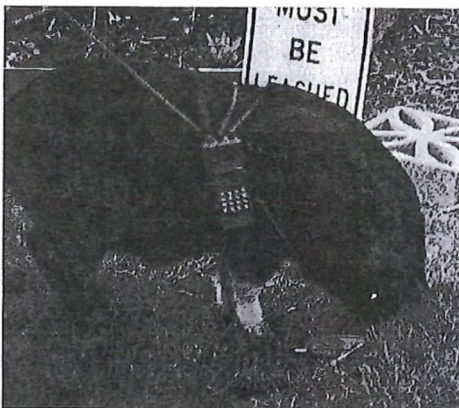
About two weeks after the first of many relapses during this unstable period, Dick downloaded to floppy everything in my packet mailbox at K7IQI. I was so overwhelmed by the 50 or so messages requiring my attention, I went back to bed and didn't tackle that job until weeks later when there were another 50 messages awaiting my response!

Now you get the gist of my dilemma—what to do about all the folks waiting to hear from me? I hadn't had a major relapse in over two years, and all these people knew only the "well me".

None of my new friends had yet met the "incapacitated me".

I had shared our e-mail address with two or three people, so Dick began receiving e-mail, as well as packet messages, asking about me. Gradually, news of my relapse spread world wide. The "get well" packet, e-mail, and National Traffic System messages, as well as notes and cards via U.S. mail began to arrive. Never once during this particular ordeal did I feel isolated, forgotten, or lonely, feelings which I've often experienced when I "drop out" due to a serious relapse. The miracle of communication proved to be exactly that: a joyful, loving miracle in my life which maintained my ties with others. One of the neat things that is coming out of this

Trip To The United Kingdom

A Presidential Editorial

I feel the need to make some general comments about Amateur Radio. I am concerned that in another 10 years, Amateur Radio will be used mainly for emergency communications. The FCC is trying to sell away some of our frequencies to the highest bidder, and I think that in the future, we will see more of this.

Our frequencies are not being used as much as they could be, including local two meter frequencies. I find it disturbing that many YLs especially are not fully using their license. If this continues, I don't see a bright future for Amateur Radio. I know that propagation isn't what it once was, but hopefully it is improving. I know that many people have found the Internet more interesting, although for quality friendships, I don't think you can beat the ones found through Amateur Radio. There's an old saying, "Use it or lose it." I'm afraid that is what is in the future for us if we don't become more involved. I have heard from YLs around the country. They have tried to start local two meter YL nets and got little or no response. And what about our HF YL Nets? They need our support, too.

I would recommend that you become aware of what is happening in Washington, DC regarding bills before Congress relating to the Amateur Radio bands. Write to your senators and congressmen and let them know that we want our frequencies protected.

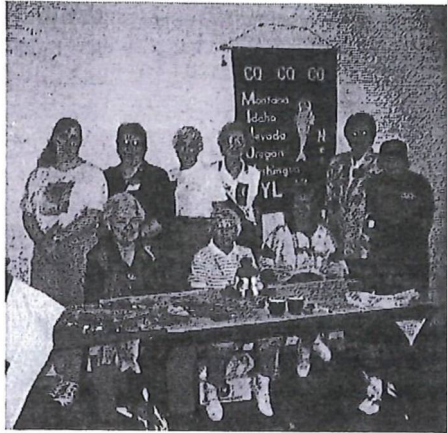

Thank you for all your news and please keep it coming. 33, Betty

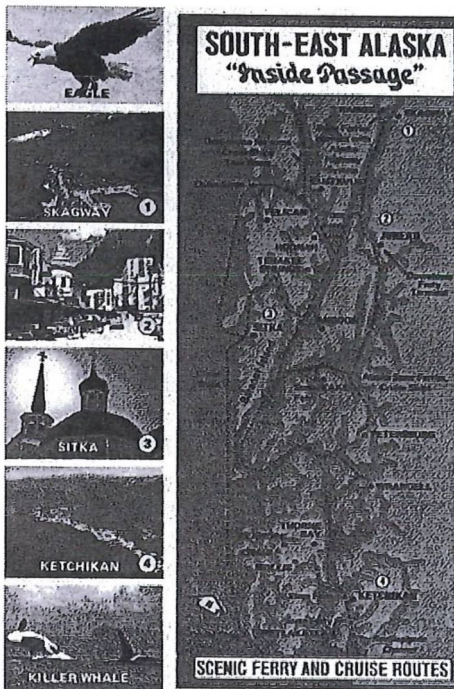
