

#### Also From District 5 - Galapagos Adventure

The Galapagos Islands deserved the label of strange and exotic, this was discovered by KC5SJS, Mary Lou Pacheco and her OM, Vito when they traveled to Ecuador in February to visit his family. A comfortable two-hour flight from Guayaquil leads to a landing on a small island. Aliens pay a hundred-dollar entrance fee and Ecuadorians six dollars to the National Park.

A bus takes you to the other side of the island where a small ferry awaits to take you across the channel to the Santa Cruz Island. Another bus awaits to take you to the town and your hotel. The entire trip takes a little over an hour.

The land is very dry on the north (leeward) side of the islands. On Santa Cruz there are some low mountains. The tops of the mountains and the south side receive more moisture from the clouds and rain. In the dry area there are very tall cacti like the pear cacti found in Texas. There are so many fish that the white tip sharks that live in the area are no threat to humans. A glass-bottomed boat takes one to an area where one can see the sharks slowly swimming about in a small cove. The same boat will take you to Tortuga Bay for a swim at a lovely secluded beach. In the bay are tortoises, marine iguanas, and a variety offish.

Here the populous crabs are gray, in other areas they are black, and in others the crabs are bright red.

The giant tortoises, like the other animals of the Galapagos, are not afraid of humans. You are taken to a finca (a large farm) where the tortoises live in their natural setting. One may approach the animals to within three feet. The same can be said of the blue-footed boobies and the frigate birds.

These stark, rugged islands, far from the continents and to other islands, are rich in life. Life insists on being. Each plant and animal has found its own particular niche. All creatures, great and small thrive where mankind have let
