

YLRL is a non-profit organization, granted under section (501)(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, comprised of women amateur radio operators, incorporated as such under the laws of the State of California.

Dues are \$8.00 a year, due and payable March 1, and delinquent March 31. For new and reinstating members joining after August 31, dues are prorated by half the annual dues for that fiscal year.

Add \$4.00 for first class postage, if desired, in the U.S.; it is required for Canada and Mexico. Add \$8.00 for air mail for all other DX.

Dues for a licensed YL family member (residing at the same address) are \$2.00. Subscriptions for non-members are \$8.00 per year and may not be prorated for portions of years. Subscribers may add the same extra postage, if first class or air mail service is desired.

From The President's Desk Carol Hah, **WD8DQG/7**

"Well, spring is just around the corner. We keep having beautiful days to tantalize us, but then the temperature drops and it snows some more. We have had more snow in the past month than all winter. That gave me the incentive to drive down to Phoenix to work with Phyllis, W2GLB on the YL-OM contest logs. Some of the Cactus Keys, YLs from the area joined us for lunch on Saturday which was very enjoyable. There are quite a few affiliated YLRL clubs in areas across the United States, if there is one in your area get involved and enjoy the friendship they offer. If you belong to a YL group you can affiliate with YLRL by contacting our Secretary, Donna Deyoe, K6DNG. If I get the chance, I plan to visit some of the other clubs while I am president.

I called a meeting of the Board of Directors, via snail mail, to present to them three issues. First the appropriate wording and choices for the ballot to increase the dues after our Parliamentarian, Jackie van de Kamp approved the wording and the Board of Directors approved it. There were quite a few excellent comments related to how much and why. The second issue was concerning the use of a "post card" style renewal. This was approved by the board for next year and does not need to be voted on by the membership. The third and final issue was my proposal for a SWL certificate for our contests which was to be for a trial period to expire at the end of my term if there is little interest which also passed.

I would like to discuss with you, the members, the options for an increase in dues. It is my belief and the belief of many other members, that the dues must be increased to \$15.00. Some of the comments regarding an increase to \$20.00 are that it will cost us members. They, and I feel that for some of our older members on a fixed income it is too much. We also have members who pay for family members and sponsor DX-YL's who will also be hurt. You must consider, that the first class postage is added to whatever the increase is. I believe, that raising the dues to \$12.00 for two vears and then to \$15.00 would solve our immediate and future problems with the least amount of pain to our pocket books. This would allow us to return to the bi-monthly issue of Harmonics with the annual Directory issue in the fall. The cost of Harmonics with first class postage is \$1.92, that is \$9.70 a year plus the directory issue which is between \$2.00-\$3.00. That means, the a membership with first class postage at the \$12.00 is \$16.00. That leaves \$2.70 for other expenses. That is tight! An increase to \$15.00 plus \$4.00 for first class leaves \$5.70 which is a little more that we need right now, but as costs have been going up it may be just right later. Please consider all the members when you vote. YLRL is a non-profit organization and if you can afford to make a tax deductible contribution it will allow those who are on a tight budget the opportunity to pay for their membership.

If, the dues increase fails, we would have to continue with quarterly issues of Harmonics and possibly limit the size the directory issue. It is extremely important that everyone send in their vote.

Please follow the directions!!! On the last ballot, many votes had to be voided, because they were done incorrectly.

VOTE FOR DUES INCREASE

The members who attended the Long Beach convention voted to put to the membership a vote to increase the dues. This would require a vote of the entire membership to change ARTICLE II of YLRL BY-LAWS. This is necessary due to the increase cost of printing and mailing of HARMONICS. It costs us \$1.56 to print and mail Harmonics bulk, and \$1.92 to print and mail Harmonics First Class. There is also the increase postage for mailing membership cards and certificates. The allowance for conventions is not adequate and a lot of YLRL board members are absorbing far too much serving in different volunteer positions. Because of the increase costs, and the drop in memberships, if an increase does not pass, we will have to continue quarterly publication of Harmonics and maybe eliminate the Directory issue. Some of the comments that came back to me were: the dues should be increased as the cost of living goes up, some of the older members on fixed incomes might have a problem with the higher rate,, but there was only one who wanted the raise to \$20.00. Most of the Board opted for the \$15.00 or \$12.00 now increasing to \$15.00 in 2003.
