YLRL is a non-profit organization, granted under section (501)(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, comprised of women amateur radio operators, incorporated as such under the laws of the State of California.

Dues are \$8.00 a year, due and payable March 1, and delinquent March 31. For new and reinstating members joining after August 31, dues are prorated by half the annual dues for that fiscal year.

Add \$4.00 for first class postage, if desired, in the U.S.; it is required for Canada and Mexico. Add \$8.00 for air mail for all other DX.

Dues for a licensed YL family member (residing at the same address) are \$2.00. Subscriptions for non-members are \$8.00 per year and may not be prorated for portions of years. Subscribers may add the same extra postage, if first class or air mall service is desired.

THE INCREASE IN DUES TO \$20. HAS BEEN VOIDED

This means, that the dues for 2000 will remain the same and the outcome of the vote will take place in 2001. If you have any suggestions or positive comments you would like for me to consider, please let me hear from you. This is a reprieve, but if we are to survive, we have to have an increase to cover the greatly increased costs of Harmonics. For those who didn't vote, you now have a second chance. Please participate this time, so we have an expression representative of ALL the members.

Presidents Letter

Welcome to the millennnium!

We survived Y2K without any major glitches. This is just as well, since I didn't stockpile any food, water or go out and buy a generator. What will the year 2000 and the succeeding years bring for YLRL? Will we survive as an organization and grow? I would like to address some concerns and my objectives for the next two years.

Who we are and what we want is an easy question for me to answer. We are women who are licensed amateur radio operators. That was the easy part, but beyond the obvious, most of us are very intelligent achievers who are unusually busy with jobs, community and family. At Long Beach and even before the members made it known that Harmonics is a big drawing card for most of the members. We also decided in Long Beach that we could not continue to publish Harmonics, whose cost has risen considerably without raising the membership dues. This was absolutely necessary for our survival. Our membership has fallen off the past several years, and we need to work very hard recruiting new members. I spend a great deal of time at the Dayton Hamvention every year talking to YLs explaining to them the benefits of belonging to YLRL. First, is the camaraderie of women who share a common interest and want to promote their activity in amateur radio. Secondly, learning what other women are doing, meeting the challenges of new and old modes of operations, giving themselves to their community and sharing their experiences with other women.

It is up to each and every one of us to spred the word and provide membership information to other YLs in the area where you live. How many licensed women do you know in your city, county, and state that do not belong to YLRL? Tell them about us, tell them about the nets, contests, certificates, and give them and application. Why not get them started by giving them their first year's subscription to get them started. Get on the nets! Open House, Tangle, the 40 mtr and 80 mtr nets. Work the contests! Make and give out contacts for our certificates! Some of the net controls could use help and relief. GET INVOLVED!!! If you are listening, who is calling?

I would really like to see the District Chairwomen have YLs who can take the responsibility for news in their area. It is really hard to know what is going on in North Carolina, if you live in Florida, for example. When I was DC for the 8th district, I never got any news from West Virginia, but we did have members there. E-mail have made it easier. I have been wondering if we could offer a contest certificate for SWL's. This would encourage YLs to upgraade or maybe those who listen to get licensed.

Every officer and committee member serving YLRL is a volunteer who gives of their time and energy without pay. Their service is greatly appreciated, so give them your support and any help you can. If you have any questions, helpful suggestions, or problems, please let me know! I will do my best to help.

Quarterly Issues

Because of the failure to increase the dues this year, I consulted with my advisors and have made an executive decision to put Harmonics out on a quarterly schedule. This was been voted on by the membership several years ago but it was not found necessary to implement until now. Please bear with us until our financial situation improves.

Beth Taylor Membership Award

It was suggested to me that we honor Beth Taylor, **W7N JS** who was YLRL membership chairwoman for many years. She was instrumental in bringing many new members to YLRL. She was blind and lived alone on a fixed income, but spent her own money for YLRL in many ways. To honor her, whoever brings in the most new members this year and next year, I will personally pay their dues for one year. This does not enclude Seapac or Dayton.



perhaps some areas of ham radio could use a bit of restructuring help, but this is going to an extreme.

This issue's district 10 spotlight focuses on a young ham who did it all the hard way, Rebecca Rich, **KBOVVT**. Rebecca lives just outside of Kansas City in Raytown, Missouri. She turned 11 last May and her other hobbies include her school's Math Club, playing violin, tap dancing, jazz dancing, ballet dancing and playing YMCA basketball. (Whew, she is active!) As for how she got into ham radio...here is her story.

"When I was 7 years of age my dad made a computer program to help my mom study for her license. I thought the program was neat so I started playing with it. Pretty soon, I stared getting answers right and my parents asked me if I would like to really study to get my license. I said, 'yes.' So I started studying for the tests and in a year or so I passed all of the tests and held the top license at the age of 8 on March 22, 1997. This is how I got started in Amateur Radio."

She has worked several phone contests in the last couple of years and in Fall, 1998, she worked both the phone and CW portion of the CQ Worldwide, ARRL SS, and 10 meter contests. She was able to get both the ARRL SS Phone and CW pin for making over 100 contacts during each contest.

Rebecca's favorite mode of operation is CW and she is usually on the fifteen-meter band. She thinks there are some very kind people on CW and many are very happy when the find out they have contacted a ten-year-old girl on CW.

She and her family were introduced to contesting by Steve Lufcy, **KMOL**, a neighbor who lives a few blocks away. "Steve jokes with me that I can use his swimming pool during the summer if I can just make 300 contacts in the next contest."

Rebecca says, "Copying high speed CW seemed impossible at first, but became easier toward the end of each contest. I had to send QRS many times and almost every operator was very nice and slowed down. My dad thinks there should be at least one contest during the year with a slower speed limit to help encourage new CW contesters." (I agree and regret the loss of Novice Round up. CAM)

I know Rebecca is a true contester! I heard her during the ARRL 10-meter phone contest this year. In fact, I heard a lot of YL voices during the contest. Keep up the good work ladies.
