

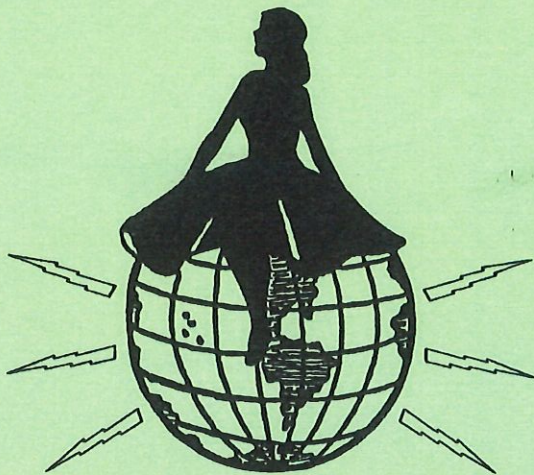

YLRL is a non-profit organization, granted under section (501)(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, comprised of women amateur radio operators, incorporated as such under the laws of the State of California.

Dues are \$12.00 a year, due and payable March 1, and delinquent March 31. For new and reinstating members joining after August 31, dues are prorated by half the annual dues for that fiscal year.

Add \$4.00 for first class postage, if desired, in the U.S.; it is required for Canada and Mexico. Add \$8.00 for air mail for all other DX.

Dues for a licensed YL family member (residing at the same address) are \$2.00. Subscriptions for non-members are \$12.00 per year and may not be prorated for portions of years. Subscribers may add the same extra postage, if first class or air mail service is desired.

In the April/May/June issue of The Harmonics, a vote was initiated regarding increasing the YLRL dues. The results of the balloting were 86 votes for increasing the dues, and 2 against the dues increase. Of the 86 "yes" votes, the option to increase dues to \$12.00 in 2001 and 2002 and then increase to \$15.00 annually in 2003 was the preferred choice by only one vote over the option to increase dues to \$15.00 annually starting next year.

PLEASE NOTE: It was very satisfying to receive a total of 113 ballots by the deadline indicating your interest and participation in this important issue. It was very disheartening to have to toss out 25 of your votes because the rules for voting on the ballot were not followed. I know that you all wanted to be heard and have your vote counted, however, we have to abide with the election guidelines. Your vote is important to us so please read your ballot and instructions carefully in the future so your vote will count. Thank you.

Charlotte, KQ1F, and Ann, WAI S, presented slides of their Dxpedition to Micronesia and CQWW CW in Grenada. Diane, K2DO, spoke on YL Activities and the feedback that she received from her August "YL News and Views" in QST. Anne, WB1ARU, presented information on YLRLand WRONE, including a bit of the history of each organization. Arline, W1 LIO, wrapped up the session with the Girl Scout Ham Radio Patch program. Attendance was not as large as we would have liked; perhaps the early time schedule (9 AM) was part of that. Those who attended had a good time, and in two years we hope to do it again! Overall attendance at the Convention was quite good and over 50 YLs signed our guest book.

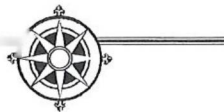

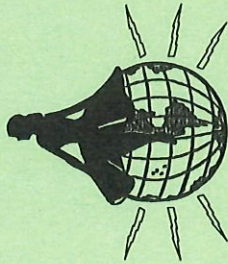
