Have you been licensed for several years and have an HF rig that no longer excites you like it did when you made your first HF contact? Are getting bored with just calling the OM on the radio? Or are you newly licensed and are wondering, what can I do with my ham license? Well, amateur radio is a hobby full of variety. 1 - **National Traffic System.** Try to find a traffic net near you and send an radiogram message to a friend or contact me and I'll send you a radiogram message.

2 - Operate and learn about one of the various digital modes in ham radio - **PSK31, Amtor, RTTY, Pactor** or learn about and try to operate **packet**.

3 - Listen to or try to contact someone on **Amateur Satellite**. Did you know that there are satellites that you can contact or hear using only a handheld?

4 - Try operating **QRP** for a day. If you are using an HF rig, don't go above 10 watts on voice or 5 watts on CW, on VHF try to operate only 5W on repeaters.

5 - CW - Prior to 1991, you had to know CW before getting your ham license. Now its only needed for upgrading but it's a lot of fun. Re-learn CW if you forgot or try learning it for the first time. Or else just learn enough to be able to send your callsign.

6 - Find someone operating **Amateur Television (ATV)** and learn more about it.

7- **Volunteer** to help during a public service event that uses amateur radio. Here in Ohio, hams are used during bike races, benefit walks, parades, etc.

8 - **Fox (Transmitter) Hunting** is an activity where someone hides a transmitter (hence they are the fox) and everyone else tries to find them. Find a club who sponsors this activity or set up one as a program for your club.

9 - Work a **YLRL contest as a group**. Get together with YLs who do not have HF privileges and operate with you as the control station, that is they operate using your call. Don't forget the YLRL club call K4LMB is available for use during contest and special events. It's available to YLRL members and YLRL affiliated clubs, on a first-come first served, by asking permission from me, the YLRL club call trustee.

10 - **Introduce a new YL to ham radio**. Tell them how fun it is and all the new things you've been doing all year long.

11- Learn about **Microwave or EME** (or moon bounce) operation.

12- **Build a kit** and learn a little bit about the technical aspect of ham radio. Kits include building an attenuator for your fox hunting adventure, building a morse code key for working CW, building a QRP kit to operate QRP, building a portable antenna (j-pole) for your handheld and much more. Why not ask for a kit for Christmas which you can work on during the holidays!
