

## Canadian Information de Helen VE2YAK Archibald

Ed. Note: This came in as an e-mail answer to a query on YL-Hams about the Canadian ham's license requirements:

If anyone is interested in Canada, the license levels are: Basic - theory and regulation test - VHF 6M and up. 5 wpm plus the basic gives you full HF privileges Advanced - more theory - allows you to run high power and build transmitters or rim home-built transmitters, plus be in charge of a repeater.

In Canada you keep the same call sign as your level goes up. All are two letters, then a number, then either two or three letters. Ordinarily, you have to have an

advanced ticket and 5 wpm and five years experience to get a two-letter call. You can tell immediately which province someone is from by higher call. The call areas are east to west by province, with a few complications because some areas split up after they were counted. VE1 is Nova Scotia, VE2 is Quebec, VE3 is Ontario, VE3 is Manitoba, VE5 is Saskatchewan, VE6 is Alberta, VE7 is British Columbia, VE8 is North West Territories, VE9 is New Brunswick (eastern, but a late split off from Nova Scotia!). VA calls are used in provinces where there aren't enough VE calls left. The numbers match (i.e., VE 3 and VA3 are both Ontario) VO1 is Newfoundland, because it was still a separate country from Canada when it got the call letters, VO2 is Labrador (part of Newfoundland), VY1 is Yukon Territory, VY2 is Prince Edward Island (another recent split from Nova Scotia), VYO is Nunavut, the new territory,

More than you ever wanted to know, right! Guess which part of the ham course I teach? Oh, and we can use SSB in any part of the band. So there are places where we can operate SSB that is only CW for US hams. WE call it the 'Canadian Portion!' Especially on 20M. It is a quiet place to get away from the crowds with the kilowatts. If you listen on 14.133 on Tuesdays at 1700 zulu, there is a YL net in SSB, 33, Helen VE2YAK
