In 1984 Ruth K1IIF, a longtime member of YLRL, moved with her OM, Jack W1PRT, from Connecticut, where they had been active in emergency work, to Panorama City, a large retirement community in Lacey, Washington. Thanks to Ruth, Panorama City now has an active emergency > organization ready to jump in whenever the inevitable earthquake strikes or another emergency arises.

In her words **Ruth** says: "About 12 year's ago our resident council member asked me to set up an emergency radio group here at Panorama making use of CB Channel 3. It took some soul searching for these two dyed-in-the-wool hams to face the fact that these "old folks" could put up with "citizens band" for their communications, for many neighbors already had it in their RVs. We started a CB net with weekly roll call, had an occasional potluck in our house, and are still going strong! We had to teach many how to tell if the squelch is working, and to expect some QRM, for instance. Some others needed antennas installed, but in general it has been a successful 12 years as newcomers replace the oldsters."

Ruth is the trustee for K7EF - Panorama Residents Radio Club which she organized and which meets once a month for lunch. She reports: "We have about 18 or 20 members - of these, about ten are licensed, six or so still active, and some of the rest somewhat interested but have let their licenses expire. Recently when the Resident Council chairman asked if we wanted to join with the emergency manager for a "Health and Fitness Fair," I jumped at the chance. The police, the Red Cross, local medics, clinics would all be participating with handouts and information. The hams of our local group voted to set up 2-meter and citizens band rigs at the inside lower level fair location. We put up temporary outside antennas with coax through a window where the screen had been removed. Using our club call, K7IF, members manned the tables with operating rigs on

both bands. Some of the hams talked with us from home, and our citizens band group had a roll call that morning. We think our exhibit was good PR and very successful."

Hats off to Ruth, who instead of giving up on ham radio activities after moving to a retirement community, is still making a significant contribution in the Amateur Radio World!

There are so many facets of Amateur Radio, and it is impossible to try them all. One aspect of Amateur Radio that I enjoy is emergency communications and weather spotting. Oddly enough, at most ARES (Amateur Radio Emergency Service) meetings, I am the only female under 21, and sometimes, I am the only female.

The fact that I am one of the only females involved in emergency communications in my area puzzles me. After all, it is an excellent way to give back to Amateur Radio and your community. Some of the skills gained from experience in

For example, last week, I was a counselor at a summer camp. Some staff members were using FRS (Family Radio Service) radios to communicate. So, I used my own FRS radio to monitor their communications. During free-time one day, we looked up and saw that the sky was getting very dark and cloudy. So, I went up to my room and retrieved my HT. Next, I tuned it to the National Weather Service frequency of 162.55 MHz. I monitored that frequency and gave the rest of the staff updates via the FRS radio.

Luckily, the primary hazard was "heavy downpours," and the storms never became severe. But, had it reached severe limits, I could have tuned into a local Skywarn Net and had access to even more up-to-date information.

This is just one example of how training in emergency communications and weather spotting can come in handy. Because of my knowledge from Amateur Radio, I was able to figure out what frequency the staff was using, know the local National Weather Service frequency, and monitor both frequencies at once, serving as a relay station.

It is times like these that make me proud to be an Amateur Radio Operator. But, why are there not more of us? Where are all of the other young, female hams, when it comes to emergency communications? Get involved. You will not regret it!


