

ELSIE

Hi .This is Judith KC8BOM. I have a little info for the Harmonics. The weekend of March 26 and 27 my OM, Robert WA1FXT, a friend, LEE KB8WEV, and myself went to Maryland for Atlanticon.

The Atlanticon QRP Forum is a weekend of QRP fun, presentations and social gathering hosted by the NJQRP Club and sponsored by the AmQRP Club each year in the spring. QRPers from all over the US (and Internationally) show up for this annual event held in Baltimore, Maryland.

There is always a special Atlanticon kit for those attending. This year's kit was ELSIE a low cost L-C Meter. This kit is built Manhatten style.



Elsie's Brains


The heart of ELSIE is an ATmel microcontroller that reads the frequency of a tuned circuit formed with the inductor or capacitor being measured. The controller computes the values of the component-under-test and announces the readings in Morse code via a miniature speaker and seven segment LED display. When the user presses the "C" pushbutton, the capacitance is announced. When the "L' pushbutton is pressed, the inductance value is announced

There is always a contest using that year's kit. This year there were two. One was for how close the component readings were, the second was for beauty. (From the AMQRP Website): While up at the table, each contestant also had their ELSIE entry judged for a combination of construction quality, feature extensiveness and originality. It's interesting to note that most home brewers built the Advanced Features into their ELSIE (LED display, serial output, frequency counting, etc.) With so

Youth Column

Throughout the last several articles, I've mentioned the fact that youthful YLs are a bit scarcer than youthful OMs. Now, I have a question: Why is this? Is it because girls and ladies are not interested in ham radio? Is it because of the old tradition of women being housewives? Or, is it because young females do not know about Amateur Radio?

It seems that the answer to this question is a combination of all three of those ideas. Some girls are not interested in Amateur Radio, while others probably still believe in the old tradition, while still others don't know that ham radio exists.

You may be wondering how this relates to us. Well, if girls are not involved in Amateur Radio because they believe in old tradition, or for some other reason, there is probably not much we, as young females, can do about it. However, we can certainly "reel in" those who are currently uninterested or who have not heard of ham radio.

A good chance to introduce one of your friends to ham radio is just around the corner- Amateur Radio Field Day. Personally, although I had known about Amateur Radio several years before my first Field Day, it was not until after experiencing Field Day that I actually decided to earn my license. So, if you have friends who know about Amateur Radio but aren't really interested, maybe, if you can convince them to try Field Day, they will become interested. And, if you have friends who have never heard of Amateur Radio, what better time to show them how much fun it is?

If you yourself have never been to Field Day, make sure not to miss it this year: June 26 and 27. In case you don't know, Field Day is an emergency preparedness drill, sponsored by the American Radio Relay League (AJRRL). In a nutshell, hams all across the U.S. go to a remote location and set up communications. Then, they try to make as many contacts as possible in a 24-hour period. The best part (I think) is that operations continue all night, and many times, there is a midnight meal. There are several different ways that you can participate, such as with a club or by yourself.

Visit <u>http://www.arrl.org/contests/announcements/fd/</u> for all of the details and a complete Field Day package. Find a club Field Day to attend, or call CQ by yourself, but, most importantly, be sure to participate, and remember, you, being a female, have an advantage over fellow operators.

It is pretty obvious that male hams outnumber female hams, but what is not so obvious is that it is up to us to change that. Youthful females aren't going to just wake up one day and say, "Oh, I think I'll get my Amateur Radio license today." They need urging and encouragement from their peers. So, if you go to Field Day this year (and I hope you will), see if you can get a friend, or two, or more, to go with you. If they show an interest, set them up with some study materials and continue to support them. Maybe, if we work together, more youth (including females) will become involved in Amateur Radio.


