



They did have to close during the night for a few hours because of storm. The lightning was really bad. The reporters for paper came and had an interview, and took a picture of Marte and her husband Pete at the rig.

Summer season has started once again, and with it the myriad bicycle and walking/running events that weave through the mountain by-ways, out of reach of cell phones. That is when the ham radio operators get called on to provide health and safety communications—good practice for us, good service for them. What does it take to assist in an event such as the MS 150?

In this area, an army of volunteers which includes some 40 hams supports about 3,000 bicyclists as they travel 150 (or more) miles up hill and down, stay overnight in a college dorm, and stop on the way at 11 rest stops (two of them lunch!) which provide the riders with water, snacks, and facilities, as well as access to first aid and bicycle care.

Ham radio operators go in SAG (support and gear) vehicles that drive along the course and give assistance, including rides, to cyclists in need. They sit at rest stops to communicate mundane requests such as more water and urgent requests such as ambulances. They shadow event officials, providing supplemental communications (sometimes with people at sites without cell phone coverage, but mostly because you can't get a hold of someone who is already talking on the phone!) They ride with a state patrol officer and with the medical coordinators.

Because everyone hears the traffic on the air, they are useful in re-uniting people whose groups have become separated, and objects that have become separated from their people (such as cell phones). And, while doing all this, we are practicing the same skills used in an emergency net.

Modes used are mostly 2 meter and sometimes 70 cm. voice, sometimes APRS or packet, and in occasional events, HF (usually using NVIS, to get out of canyons). Much of the time is spent in relaxation just listening, if you are at a rest stop--bring a chair and an icy drink. If you haven't tried supporting a local public service event, be it a fund-raiser for a non-profit organization, a Fourth of July parade, or your local annual big event, I urge you to do so!

- 7. Decisions of the custodians regarding interpretations of the rules as here stated or later amended shall be final.
- 8. Certificate custodians and their addresses are listed in each issue of YL Harmonics.
