For new and reinstating (lapsed more than 2 years) members joining after June 30th, dues are pro-rated by half the annual dues for that fiscal year. President's Info De Doshia Kretke, KB0NAS



The year 2013 is racing by.

Flooding in September consumed a good deal of my energy, even though I only spent about 3 days directly on emergency communications. The first few days, I was unable to leave my immediate area due to all the flooded roads. In all the scenarios we had envisioned and practiced, we had looked at one creek drainage flooding. This time, unlike any other time in recorded history (admittedly, only about 200 years), most of them flooded, from south of Colorado Springs to Wyoming, with additional flooding in New Mexico, Arizona, and Utah.

Boulder got almost as much rain that week (18 inches) as we expect to get in a whole year; some of the worst hit areas also had suffered forest fires in recent years, so were especially susceptible to flooding, even with a couple inches.

The flooding was big surprise, in magnitude, duration, and breadth; it has been described as a thousand year event. It wasn't a hurricane or other anticipated storm; the forecast said afternoon thundershowers, then rain the next day. We are usually happy with 1 or 2 tenths, and my main concern had been getting back to Boulder from Denver before rush hour. Ah, life is full of surprises! Now comes the revising of flood plains and response plans. It is going to keep us busy for a long time. I'm sure many of you around the country know exactly what I mean.

(Editor's Note: You may have seen the Colorado Hams on such programs as Dateline helping out during the flooding!)

I've been recently playing with a couple new (to me) APRS programs. One I saw an article in QST, called "Yet Another APRS Client," has the interesting feature of being able to give the radio line of sight, and has messaging capability. I haven't yet connected up the radio to try it thoroughly, but one can download map tiles ahead of time so that being connected to the Internet is not required.

Another, APRS.fi (that's its address on the internet) does a really nice job of showing travel paths for up to the past 7 days, with the information coming off the internet and displayed on Google Maps, so that you can zoom to whatever level of detail you want. It's nice in that anyone, with or without a radio, can read the output; during the flood event, we used it to keep track of vehicles in the field. Its major disadvantage is that it relies on information on the Internet; one needs an Internet connection to use it, and the packets must be sent through an IGate to show up. If you haven't tried APRS, I highly recommend it as a sampler.



Certificate Custodian WAS-YL, YLCC, YL-DXCC, WAC-YL. DX-YL de Carolyn Donner, N8ST



Basic Rules Applicable To All YLRL Certificates

- 1. Contacts made through repeater devices or any other power relay method cannot be used for any YLRL certificate confirmation.
- 2. All contacts must be made **FROM** the same country.
- 3. **DO NOT SEND QSL CARDS TO THE CUSTODIAN!** Two other Amateurs must sign the log verifying that the QSL cards are in possession of the applicant.
- 4. No charge is made for a certificate, but sufficient postage for first class mail or a stamped legal-size envelope must accompany the application to cover the cost of mailing the certificate.
- 5. For the order in which the contacts must be listed, please check the rules for each certificate.
- 6. All inquiries should be addresses to the appropriate custodian.
- 7. Decisions of the custodians regarding interpretations of the rules as here stated or later amended shall be final
- 8. Certificate custodians and their addresses are listed in each issue of YL Harmonics.



In this issue, I would like to share with you an opportunity specifically for amateur radio operators under the age of eighteen - the Amateur Radio Newsline's Young Ham of the Year Award. I will cover the award details, the participating sponsors, and the eligibility requirements for this unique opportunity.

First of all, the Young Ham of the Year Award honors outstanding community, state, or national service accomplished through amateur radio. Created in 1985 by Bill Pasternak, WA6ITF, one of the founders of Amateur Radio Newsline, the award purposefully targets youth. According to the Newsline's website, Mr. Pasternak believes that "the real-life experience of being honored for their youthful accomplishments in Amateur Radio may lead the award winners...into technology based careers that will make them the scientific, telecommunications and educational leaders of the future." As a result, the Young Ham of the Year Award gifts qualifying individuals at the annual Huntsville Hamfest in Huntsville, Alabama.

The award is sponsored by a number of corporations and organizations including Yaesu USA Corporation, CQ publishing, Amateur Radio Newsline, and the ARRL education department. Yaesu, a faithful sponsor since 1985, remains the main underwriter of the award. As well, CQ publishing contributes an all-expense-paid week at Space-camp in Huntsville in addition to other rewards from Amateur Radio Newsline.

To be eligible; the only requirement is that the operators be FCC licensed youths under eighteen in the U.S., U.S. territories, or Canadian provinces. Personally, I would like to commend our very own Kaitlyn Cole, KS3P, for achieving this prestigious award in 2011, and encourage everyone to consider applying for the Young Ham of the Year Award.

YL News from Kosovo

Vjollca Belegu, Z61VB (ex-YU8AW), is SHRAK's vice president. She headed the license preparation program.

The equipment Laine used was given September 16 to Vjollca Belegu, Z61VB (ex-YU8AW), and she is expected to be the first female licensee active from the fledgling republic.

Other licensees who had been active years ago using YU8 prefixes when Kosovo was still a part of Yugoslavia, have adopted Z6 prefix call signs, often using their former YU8 suffixes. Kosovo declared its independence from Serbia in 2008.

OZ6SYL on the air

The group of SYLRA (Scandinavian Young Ladies Radio Amateurs) meets every two years in each case in another Scandinavian country. The meetings are always an occasion to be activated a special call sign. In 2005 in Reykjavik was it TF3SYL, in 2007 in Ostersund 8S3SYL and in 2009 in Oslo LA1SYL. Now was the meeting from 22 nd till 25 * August 2013 in Roskilde celebrated - the ten years anniversary of SYLRA.

At the conference hotel Prindsen a remote station was installed. Transceiver IC-7100 (ICOMs novelty of the HAM Radio in Friedrichshafen), power amplifier and antennas stood 30 km away near Ringsted. In a room of the hotel were only the operating device with a touchsreen display and the Internet access. Joana, DJ5YL, Linda, G0AJJ, and Marita, OH5KIZ, have used this radio in SSB and Rosel, DL3KWR, in CW. No one of the YLs had used never before a remote station. Thus irritated at first the effect of echo which results from the small time delay by the signal transference to the transmitter and back. In the short available time came off at least 48 QSOs in CW and 54 QSOs in SSB.

After the meeting Rosel, DL3KWR, has activated OZ6SYL two weeks more in the holiday-QTH near Faxe on Sjaelland. The equipment: IC-7000, tuner AH-4 and 9 m of vertical aerial (DX-Wire) and her result: more than 1000 CW-QSOs and some in SSB. Altogether was the OZ6SYL activity very successful with a total of 1121 QSOs with 981 OPs (under it 41 YLs) from 48 countries in the log. This special call would heard in 39 Europaen countries and in the DX countries 4K-4L-4X-7X-EA8-JA-RAas-VU-W.

Call sign owner and manager of OZ6SYL is Inger, OZ7AGR. All QSOs are with eQSL.cc uploaded. The paper-QSLs are brought at the end of September via office to the dispatch.


