

YLRL is a non-profit organization, granted under section (501) (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, comprised of women amateur radio operators, incorporated as such under the laws of the state of California. Dues are \$15.00 a year US and \$25.00 per year DX, (which included airmail) due and payable January 1, and delinquent February 1st. For new and reinstating (lapsed more than 2 years) members joining after June 30th, dues are pro-rated by half the annual dues for that fiscal year. An additional \$4.00 required for Canada and Mexico airmail. Dues for a licensed YL family member (residing at the same address) are \$3.00. Subscriptions for non-members are \$15.00 per year and may not be pro-rated for portions of years. Subscribers must add the same extra postage, for mailing outside of the United States of \$10.00.

THREE SD DX CLUB MEMBERS ACTIVATE ZF1A IN IARU CONTEST

A few months ago Joe, W6VNR said to Gayle, K6GO something like "hey. I'm not going to be on Cayman at ZF1A during the IARU contest this year - would you like to take it?" Gayle (and new hubby Mike, NA6MB) enthusiastically said, "Yes!"

Then Gayle asked Jim, K6ZH and his wife Joan, N6KIM if they'd like to come along - especially since the trip would include Gayle & Mike's first anniversary, and a delayed honeymoon. They also said "sign us up!"

So airline tickets were purchased; lodging arrangements were made (at the lovely Turtle Nest Inn on the south coast of Grand Cayman - a 10 minute drive from the shack); and callsigns were obtained

from the "Cayman FCC:" Jim, ZF2ZH; Gayle, ZF2GO; and Mike, ZF2NA.

We all met with Joe and with John I<6AM to learn what we needed to know about the logistics of using the station plus the technical details to get it all running. Jim, Mike, and Gayle used the "house equipment:" an Icom IC-756, and a very old (but very capable) Collins 30L-1 tabletop linear.

The antenna farm is legendary: a 40-through-10 meter log periodic at close to 200 feet, and a C3 and a PRO 67 at over 100 feet! There was also an 80 meter inverted Vee as the Yagi was not working. The plan was: arrive on Cayman on Tuesday July 8th before the contest; use Wed, Thurs, and Fri to get setup and to get on the air with our own callsigns, and then hit the contest full speed on Sat. And that/s pretty much what we did.

Prior to the contest we made a combined total of over 600 QSOs with our own callsigns - including SSB, CW, and RTTY. In fact with Jim's tutelage, Gayle made her first-ever RTTY Qs, using a Signal Link and computer sound card. We used Jim's laptop, and a variety of peripherals that we each brought along to interface with the IC-756. Ed. Note: Great job, Gayle! Always fun to learn a new mode, isn't it?

The contest started at 7 a.m. local time on Saturday. We traded off shifts of either 2 or 3 hours each, and covered the full 24 hours - Gayle and Mike on SSB, and Jim on CW. Everything was going along fine - with over 1000 Qs in the log when Mike took over at 7 p.m. on Saturday.

And then came a very close lightning strike. *ZORCH Ka-BOOM!* Mike saw a flash in the shack, and all of the equipment quit working. He then powered things back on carefully; the last item to "come up" was the antenna control switch - which then restored connection between the radio / amp and the antennas.

But there were two "casualties:" the connection between the computer and radio (both control and CW) quit working and could not be restored - and we spent a lot of time trying. Also, the log periodic could no longer be rotated. But it was pointed essentially north, which was fine - and we had other antennas to choose from! So we essentially logged manually on the computer, and Jim used his Win-Key as a "CW memory keyer" for his last time slot. No biggie, but it broke our stride and cost us about an hour of QSOs.

Otherwise all was well - we ended up with over 2000 QSOs and 1.3 million points. The whole contest time was "pileup practice" which we all dealt with to the best of our abilities. It is such a treat to operate from a big station like this in a "DX" location - i.e. it's fun to be on that end of the pileup sometimes!

We owe much gratitude to Joe, W6VNR for not only "loaning" us

the time slot for this contest, but also helping us with the logistics of getting licenses, coordinating with the station owner, etc.

And we want to also thank John, K6AM for his very specific technical advice, which helped, is to get everything setup properly and quickly upon our arrival - and it went

fine! And, of course, we thank Andrew, ZF1EJ, the station owner for allowing us to the use the station. He was graciously available whenever we needed his help.

This was fun - and a great way to celebrate Gayle & Mike's first anniversary. Cheers!!

In Hvergerdi there was an exhibition of the earthquake in May 2008 (+6 Richter). We could experience it in a simulator.

We remember Eyjafjallajökull 2010, when the airplanes couldn't start because of the ashes. We saw a movie from that occurrence, with fire, black ashes and lava. It's unbelievable that life can go on there after such a disaster.

Hekla is the biggest volcano in Iceland and we saw it at a long distance.

The waterfalls in Skogafoss were splendid. The water fell 60 m. We took a lot of photos.

14th May We were ordered to put on warm clothes. This days adventure was a glacial lagoon boat tour in Jok'ulsárlón. Vatnajókul, the biggest glacier in Europe, has retreated and this lagoon had arisen.

The amphibian passed among the blue icebergs, and we could take photos of the seals. We felt it was like an Icelandic saga.

In the neighbourhood we walked on the bridge, built between the two tectonic plates that divide Iceland, the Eurasian plate and the North American plate. The bridge was built as a symbol for the connection between Europe and North America.

We came to Reykjanes, the first lighthouse In Iceland, the end of the peninsula and the end of our Icelandic adventure.

Keflavik, the airport, was just near and luckily the strike was cancelled.

We had to say goodbye and THANKS to ANNA and VALA.

- 8. Certificate custodians and their addresses are listed in each issue of YL Harmonics.
