WHAT MAKES YLRL RUN?

YLs, of course! The opening of nominations for 1974 officers, and the urging to accept them, brings up the point that perhaps some YLs might hold back because they were not sure just what they would be getting into if elected. Our Constitution and By-laws state what is expected of our officers-but perhaps a less formal approach will be more readable and enable more of you to picture yourselves in one job or another.

The various jobs with YLRL have different requirements, but there are some things pertaining to all-and the YLs in them have several things in common. First, they are the ones who realize that we get out of anything just about what we put into it-they really want to be a part of what is going on. Then, they realize that YLRL cannot run by itself and that they must "plow back in" some of what they are deriving from it. Then, too, there is just plain curiosity-the desire to know what makes it tick. This last is one of the greatest dividends we offer-hi-because with our scattered membership and our officers miles apart, YLRL is different from any organization you might know about-and that's half the fun. How do we keep together? Where do we keep our things? Who does what, and when? Where do the certificates and trophies come from? Who prints the paper? How do some of the YLs get wise in a hurry-hi-and enjoy every minute of it! Chances are you have said to yourself at one time or another, "I wonder why they don't....?" or "J'll bet J could do a better job than she does." Well, YOU're the ones we want! We <u>need</u> your ideas - we <u>need YOU</u>! Even YLRL can be improved upon, or or at least be kept up to date. So come on in-get your feet wet-try it out, as many of us have done-you won't be disappointed!

Here are some brief descriptions of some of the offices. Why not try them on for size?

DISTRICT CHAIRMAN: The starting point for most YLs, and a pleasant and interesting experience. The D/C is YLRL in her District, and she is kept up to date in YLRL matters so she can help the YLs in her area derive the very most from their membership. She may preside at YL meetings at local Conventions, and she will publicize YLRL and be always on the lookout for possible new members. She keeps in touch with YL Clubs and spends as much time as possible on the air picking up news for her column in YLH - just five News Letters during the year (we do not carry news in the Directory Issue). She receives letters from YLs in her area-some with news, some questions she can answer, and some questions or suggestions to turn over to the proper officer for attention. She is a member of the Board of Directors, becomes familiar with YLRL proceedings, and has a vote in whatever decisions come up during her term. She may be asked to serve on the Nominating Committee. She will be more interested in some aspects of YLRL than others, and this will influence her consideration of one of the major offices.

DISBURSING TREASURER: A YL who is the type to enjoy keeping her own check book in order and managing the budget may be a prospect for Disbursing Treasurer. This formidable title does not mean she must be an Accountant. Our books were set up so that a "civilian" can handle them easily. It only takes a gal who is willing to be responsible for the YLRL bank account. will pay our bills promptly, and make up a simple Financial Statement two or three times a year. She is an ex-officio member of the Budget & Finance Committee and has their help when needed. She, too, is a member of the Board of Directors and has an active voice in YLRL decisions.

<u>RECEIVING TREASURER</u>: This YL collects the dues and sends out Membership Cards in return. She is final authority on who is and who is not a member during a given year. She makes up membership lists showing all names, addresses, etc., and must have some means of duplicating these for distribution-or have another YL willing to help her with this. She is almost the first one a new member meets, and she enjoys many interesting contacts. For this office, a YL should be the neat, accurate type who will keep correct records. After the dues-paying season, she makes up a Delinquent List of former members who have not renewed and sends out notices. She devises her own campaign for getting dues in on time. She, too, is a member of the Board of Directors.

SECRETARY: Here's a fascinating job that covers almost everything-and offers excellent preparation for a YL who

aspires to the Presidency. She keeps the most complete membership file, updated from information picked up here and there. She welcomes new members with a letter and other information; records all Amendments to the Constitution and other actions taken by the organization. She keeps special statistics as needed by the President and handles all general correspondence. She keeps records of our Affiliated Clubs, checks their credentials and issues certificates and stickers. She conducts all elections of officers, from checking on the eligibility of candidates to the final tabulation of the votes. She also serves on the Bd. of Dir. <u>VICE-PRESIDENT</u>: The V.P., of course, takes over in case

<u>VICE-PRESIDENT</u>: The V.P., of course, takes over in case the President becomes inactive-but under normal conditions she is most concerned with our Contests. She is responsible for planning and publicizing the contest, scoring the logs sent in by participants, making up the results, and sending the awards to the winners. She chooses a committee to help her in all this, as well as special projects. She also supervises the various YLRL-sponsored certificates and fills the positions of Custodians when vacancies occur. She is a member of the Bd. of Directors and assists the Pres. when necessary. Scoring contest logs calls for accuracy and much patience with details. She will be happier in this job if she has held some other position previously and has taken part in the contests.

PRESIDENT: Seldom does a YL start here-and ideally she would have held all the other offices, though I don't recall one who has. But she does need to have an understanding of what all the officers are doing, so she can keep all departments operating. Most Presidents will have some project for the year and will appoint YLs to help with this. At the beginning of the year she appoints her committees and gets them started on the year's work. She works with the Editor of YLH on publicity for her projects and any change in policy. She is concerned with keeping the Constitution up to date and the constitutionality of all YLRL actions. She finds willing YLs' to fill vacancies that occur, and carries on correspondence on a variety of subjects. She is responsible for Public Relations, appears often at Conventions to conduct Forums, and represents YLRL whenever and wherever called upon. To state what the President does briefly: She does whatever needs to be done!

Just one - the Continuous Nembership Continuate - is automatically sent to all YERL members who maintain continuous paid-up membership for five consecutive years. Then, at five-year intervals, stickers are added for 10, 15, 70, 25 and 30 years. Members who drop out and then re-instate later must start all over again to earn the award. It is not necessary to request the certificate, but correspondence in regard to it should go to the Custodian, whose name and address are listed in each issue of YI HARMONICS.

The other four certificates must be earned according to the rules which tollow. The DX-VI Corritionte is awarded to YLs only - the other three are available to both NLs and ONs. Here they are:

YL CENTURY CLUB CERTIFICATE (YICC)

1. Two-way communication must be established on authorized amateur bands with stations, mobile or fixed, operated by 100 different licensed women amateurs. Any and all amateur bands may be used.

2. All contacts must be made from the same locations. Within a given community, one location may be defined as from places no two of which are more than 25 miles anary.

3. Contacts may be made over any period of years, provided only that all contacts are from the same location.

4. Contacts with YIs anywhere in the second are recompized. provided only that all contacts are from the same location.

5. 100 QSI cards, or other written communications, from the stations worked confirming the necessary two-way contacts, accompanied by a list of claimed contacts, including the full name of the operator, alphabetically arranged (last name first), the call letters, and the date of each contact, must be submitted by the applicant directly to the VICC Custodian. Sufficient postage must be sent with the continuations to finance their return by First Class Nail. The YIRE will not be responsible for any loss or damage to same.

6. Endorsements: Confirmations of contacts, accompanied by alphabetical list as described above. from stations operated by additional YIs may be submitted for credit each time 50 additional confirmations are available. Endorsements will be made to the original certifications as application is approved. Gold stickers will be awarded to applicants who have worked their additional contacts from the same location (or within 25-mile radius). Silver stickers will be awarded, provided only that the holder of the certificate, in moving, retains the same call letters that appear on the original certificate.

7. Decisions of the YLCC Custodian reparding interpretations of these rules as here stated, or later amended, shall be final. All inquiries reparding cards, applications, or the certificate should be addressed to ber. The current Custodian is listed in each issue of YL HARMONICS.

WORKED ALL STATES - YL (WAS-YL)

l. Contact with a duly licensed YL in each State, D. C. may be substituted for Maryland. ARRL "Single Community" rule applies. No time or band limitations.

2. Send QSLs and alphabetical-by-state list, showing Call of station worked, Date, Band, and whether A1 or A3.

3. Sufficient postage must be sent to finance return of QSLs by first class mail to the Custodain, who is listed in each issue of YL HARMONICS.

WORKED ALL CONTINENTS - YL (WAC-YL)

The Young Ladies' Radio League issues a Worked All Con-1. tinents - YL Certificate to any licensed amateur in world.

Two-way communication must be established on the ama-2. teur radio bands with the six continents: North America, South America, Europe, Africa, Asia and Oceania.

3. Contatcts with all six continents must be made with duly-licensed women operators.

Contacts with all six continents must be made from the 4. same location. Within a given community, one location may be defined as from places no two of which are more than 25 miles apart.

Six QSL cards or other written confirmations, showing 5. proof of contacts should be submitted to the Custodian. list of contacts must accompany the cards and sufficient post-age (or IRCs) must be sent to finance their return by First The YLRL will not be responsible for any loss or Class mail. damage to same.

6. Decisions of the WAC-YL Custodian regarding interpretation of these rules as here stated, or later amended, shall be The Custodian is listed in each issue of HARMONICS. final.

DX YL Certificate

1. Available to licensed YL Operators only, for 25 confirmed contacts with licensed YL operators outside your own country, as defined in the ARRL DXCC Countries List. All contacts must be dated after April 1, 1958. For this Certificate, Alaska and Hawaii are considered DX for U.S. YLs. 2. Send log extracts showing date, time, station, band.

mode, RST reports and your own QTH and name.

Endorsements: Stickers will be awarded for each group 3. of ten additional DX-YLs, subject to the same confirmation as above. The Custodian is listed in each issue of YL HARMONICS.

1939 - 1940

Editor and Publisher: Enid Carter, W9NXB

Volume I, Number I, issued in November, 1939, called "YL NEWS", was one sheet $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ mimeographed on both sides. "YL HARMONICS" heads Volume I, Number 2 issued in December, 1939.

January, 1940, had two sheets (four pages). February was the first issue to have "Chatter" broken into call districts.

The size changed to $8\frac{1}{2} \times 14$ with the March, 1940, issue. It had four pages.

May, 1940, was the biggest issue, having eight $8\frac{1}{2} \times 14$ pages containing a Quarterly Financial Report, a QSO Party results, schedule of nets, rules for Emblem Contest, Proposal for an Amendment and the Membership List, beside the District Chatter and usual items.

June, 1940, gave the election results; FCC order (1) prohibiting foreign contacts by amateurs and (2) prohibiting portable operation; and news of YLRL affiliation with ARRI.

1941

Edited and published by Enid Carter, W9NBX, through February, 1941, succeeded by Leta Bush, W9DBD.

> There were twelve issues, one each month. The largest had sixteen $8\frac{1}{2} \times 14$ mimeographed pages, plus cover. It was the anniversary edition (November) and the first to have a special cover (employing the emblem). The average size issue was eight $8\frac{1}{2} \times 14$ pages.

July issue carried notification by FCC that all amateurs and commercial radio operators were required to file proof of citizenship. November had item that KC4USB at Antarctica wanted schedules with YLRI members. December issue pave news that Naval Station NAA and War Department radio station WAR were making contacts with amateur stations.

A picture was used for the first time in the December issue--a stamp-size photo of the cup to be awarded in the First Anniversary Party. Another stamp-size photo was used again in March--a picture of Enid. W9NBX. These pictures were clued to the pape.

"Chatter" was called "District Reports" in February, and "District News" thereafter. Leta Bush, W9DBD, Editor and Publisher

Twelve issues, one for each month, ranging in size from three $8\frac{1}{2} \times 14$ pages to 10. The largest again being the Anniversary Edition (November).

President's Column in August quoted from ARRL bulletin the limiting of certain amateur frequencies on 160, 80 and 40 meters.

December issue quoted letter from Eleanor Roosevelt, Asst. Director Office of Civilian Defense, written to W8TAY as result of article she wrote that appeared in October QST. Also gave notice that all hams were off the air.

June issue carried news of positions for women to work at Fort Monmouth (radio technicians), ARRL (secretaries: technical writers), and women's army.

1943

Edited and Published by Anita Bien, W8TAY

Six issues, one for each two-month period, the largest of which was the January-February issue with fifteen 8½ x 14 pages, plus cover. This issue included a membership list and copy of the constitution. plus a sheet that would have gone in the March-April issue had the January-February not been late.

July-August carried new of amateur operation allowed in connection with "War Emergency Radio Service." a Civil Defense or State Guard service. This issue also carried notice of FCC's order that all amateur radio trnsmitters were to be registered.

July-August had first "Liaison Officer's Corner," a "Help Wanted" column.

March-April started a "YL Honor Roll," listing the calls and names of the YLs in the armed service.

1944

Judy Caraway, W5FJW, Editor and Publisher

Five issues, the July-August and September-October being combined into one. It was mimeographed on four $8\frac{1}{2} \times 14$ sheets; the others were ditted on the $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ size. The largest issue of these was the November-December issue, with eleven pages.

A quote from November QST in the combined issue gave information of the reinstatement and extension for three years of all amateur operators licenses expiring between Pearl Harbor and May, 1943, and extension for three years the operator licenses due to expire between May 26th and December 7, 1944.

January-February issue told of the loss of the Corcoran Cup when lightening struck the home of the holder, W5HWK. She hoped to replace it as soon as wartime conditions would permit.

1945

Judy Caraway, W5FJW, edited and published the first two issues; Lou Lacy, W5IKC, and Mildred Marglin, W9ZTU, did the remaining four.

> Six issues altogether. The first two were done on a Ditto Machine on $8\frac{1}{2} \times 14$ paper. The largest was the January-February issue with nine pages, plus a blue cover.

1946

Lou Lacy W5IKC, Editor and Publisher

Ten issues; the first three were for two-month periods (starting with June-July), the remaining were monthly. All were mimeographed, except for the cover of May, 1946, which was printed (silver letter on blue). The first three issues were $8\frac{1}{2} \times 14$, the rest $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$. There were two issues with eleven pages, plus cover, that were larger than the others. One was the June-July; the other was the Anniversary Tssue, October-November, 1945.

Covers that had been entered in the contest during the previous year were used on the editions during this year, starting with the first place winner's on the June-July issue.

FCC orders and ARRL bulletins were quoted in almost every edition, giving notice of amateur bands being made available once more for amateur use and the changes of FCC rules governing amateur radio service.

1947

Clara Reger, W2RUF, edited and published four issues. Remaining editions done by Lou Lacy, W5TKC.

Eight issues, all mimeographed. Three were on $8\frac{1}{2}$ x 14 size paper, the remainder on $8\frac{1}{2}$ x 11. The first was the largest, with nine pages.

October issue contained an open letter to all members from the Editor saying the equipment was worn out. She asked for suggestions for raising the money for a new mimeograph machine. Lou Lacy, W5IKC, Editor Publisher

Twelve issues, all mimeographed on $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ size paper. The largest was the April issue, with thirteen pages besides the cover.

.

August issue started series of "Thought for the Month," written by Joanna, WØJWJ.

October issue quoted YLRL Constituion regarding affiliation of local clubs.

November issue listed "My Best DX", information gleaned from questionaires returned by members. Also contained report on holders of Code Proficiency Certificate. Monthly financial reports were discontinued, to be replaced by a report every six months.

Idea of YL-OM contest broached to membership in December, 1947, issue.

January issue, in a write-up entitled "A Bow to our President," had a stamp-size picture of Helen Cook, W6MWO. Also in January issue was a list of past officers, 1939 to 1946.

April issue had a full-page map of the United States, showing Call Districts--compliments of Evans Radio.

1949

Emily J. Schette, W9EXM, Editor and Publisher; resigned after October issue. Sec-Treas Leta Bush put our remaining issues.

Eight mimeographed issues, $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$. October edition largest with seventeen pages.

"YL & Where to Find Them," a listing by States, was started in July, 1948.

September issue contained an ARRL bulleting regarding mobile operation.

Also in September issue an item thanked a Mr. Stowe of Bartlesville, Okla., who had been doing "Such a fine job of mimeographing Harmonics." He had been doing the job since February of 1947. Lou, W5IKC, was given credit for the July issue.

A membership list was contained in the October issue, to tie in with the Anniversay Party rules.

January, 1949, announced that Howy, W2QHH (an OM), worked WAC/YL. Lenore, W6NAZ, made him a beautiful certificate.
