





1968 MEMBERSHIP CONTEST RESULTS

From Ivy, VE3EZI, our busy Secretary, comes a nice tabulation showing by Districts the sources of our 69 New Members and 36 Re-instated Members during 1968. We find that 40 of our members took part in this effort, with at least 1 credit each. We thank each and every one of you, and also thank those who boosted for YLRL membership but whose efforts did not bear fruit in time to be counted.

The winner in this category was Vada, W6CEE, who secured 7 memberships, and she has been awarded one of the new Callbooks donated by Maxine-WA6AOE. Thanks and congratulations go to her from all of us.

Honorable mention is due to Edith, W7LIZ, and Beth, W7NJS, who both secured 5 memberships within the contest time. It should be noted that Beth was not at that time serving as Western Membership Chairman, so was eligible. Other officers and Membership Chairmen were disqualified.

The other part of the Contest was the % of increase in membership for a District - based on a combination of % and actual number of new members. This prize was for the District Chairman of the winning District, so another Callbook went to Carol, K7WUR, Chairman of the 7th District in 1968.

The story of the marvelous record of District 7 really revolves around the State of Arizona, which seemed only to need a good blast-off to put it in orbit. Even Vada, the winner, secured most of her memberships at the ARRL Southwestern Div. Convention in Phoenix. Over all, the 7th District showed a gain of 18.3% over 1967 figures, followed closely by the KL7s and the 5th District.

They say figures don't lie, but they don't fully express the efforts made by all of you, and they can't possibly tell how much your work is appreciated. But let's not linger over '68 - we're well into '69 now, so let's see how well we can do this time.

UP-GRADING OF LICENSES

We were not attempting to list all YLs holding higher-classed licenses. YLRL is most proud of all our Extra and Advanced Class YLs, and it might be interesting here to list the breakdown prepared by Ivy, VE3EZI, of the classes of license making up our membership for 1968. We had: 10 Extras; 111 Advanced Class; 382 Generals; 110 Conditionals; 94 Technicians; and 7 Novices. In addition there were the Canadian YLs with 19 Advanced and 7 Amateur (when is someone going to tell us how these compare with ours?); plus our DX members licensed according to the rules in their own countries.

It should be remembered that quite a few YLs have held their Advanced licenses from the time a few years back when the license was available. Of course, there followed a time when Advanced licenses were not issued.

And now we are beginning to receive new members who went all the way from Novice to Advanced in no time at all. Congratulations to these YLs, as well as to those who took a little longer.

One who recently went up real fast was WA3LEQ, Louise. She joined as a Novice and before we turned around she had her Advanced ticket. Also, we

hear that W8NAL, Carmella, and WA7DSW, Sharon, are now eligible to work down there in the high-rent district - hi! And congratulations to Cathy, VE3GJH; Bonnie, VE3GSW; and Mary, VE5OH, who have received their CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL! Advanced tickets.

KL7 DISTRICT


