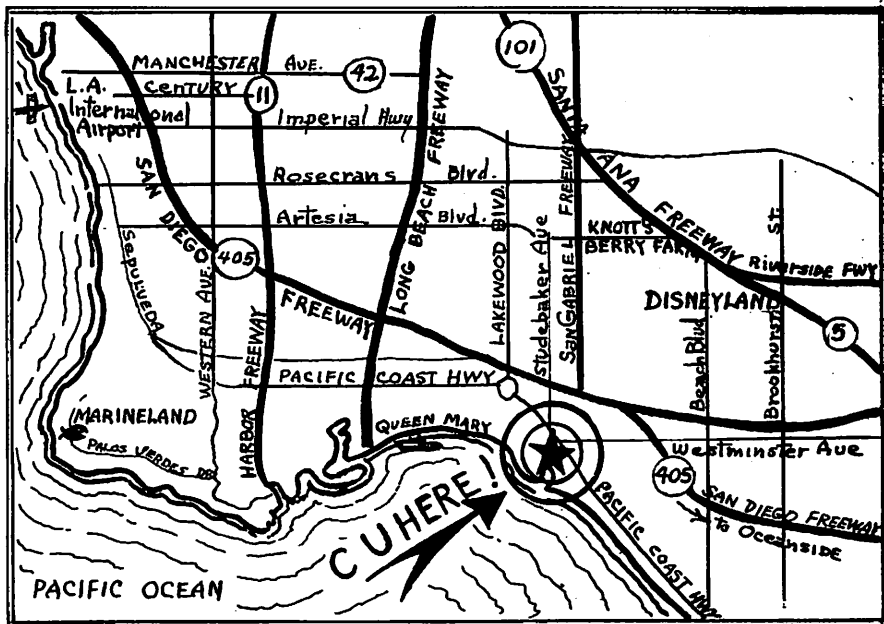
## MORE CONVENTION NOTES

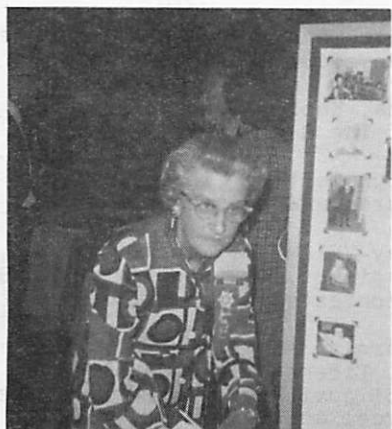

**HOW ABOUT YOUR MEASUREMENTS - QSL cards, that is?**

Perhaps you saw the letter in Feb. '72 QST Magazine from K6PO in San Diego about his problem with the Post Office on QSL cards to DX stations. He had a batch rejected because they did not meet the size requirements for foreign mailing.

So we looked into the matter - and, sure enough, a domestic postal card may be  $3 \frac{1}{4} \times 5 \frac{1}{2}$  inches; but a card to a DX country must measure  $3 \frac{1}{2} \times 5 \frac{1}{2}$  inches. The domestic postals sold by the Post Office for 8¢ and 11¢ are the smaller size; but the ones for DX mail - 10¢ for surface mail and 15¢ airmail - are the larger ones. The difference in size is hardly noticeable until you put the two of them together, and we are grateful to K6PO for calling this to our attention.

It would be a good idea to measure your own QSL cards to see which size you have. If they are of the smaller variety, better mail them in an envelope. It will cost you the regular 1-ounce rate for surface mail and the 1/2-ounce rate for airmail. But it is worth it, because if they are rejected by the Post Office your postage will be used up getting them back to you and you'll have to start all over again with a new card and new stamps.

So, use envelopes for DX mail, if necessary, until your current supply of cards is used up and then be sure your next order is made the correct size. The larger size is good anywhere.

Please keep those letters coming. I have a couple of girls looking for sponsors, so if you are interested in adopting one, please let me know.

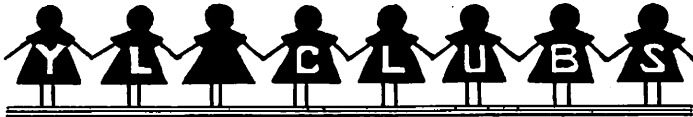
