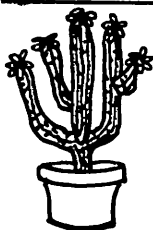
W6TCN, Mary, checked into the Ironing Board Net a couple weeks ago and announced she was celebrating her 84th birthday, congratulations.

Eight mimeographed issues, 8½ x 11. October edition largest with
seventeen pages.

"YLS & Where to Find Them," a listing by States, was started in July,
1948.

September issue contained an ARRL bulletin regarding mobile operation.

Also in September issue an item thanked a Mr. Stowe of Bartlesville,
Okla., who had been doing "Such a fine job of mimeographing
Harmonics." He had been doing the job since February of 1947.
Lou, W5IKC, was given credit for the July issue.

A membership list was contained in the October issue, to tie in with
the Anniversary Party rules.

January, 1949, announced that Howy, W2QHH (an OM), worked WAC/YL.
Lenore, W6NAZ, made him a beautiful certificate.

MEMBERSHIP: 310 as of September 30, 1948

July, 1949 - June, 1950

Barbara A. Houston, W3OQF, Editor and Publisher;
resigned after Anniversary Edition. Mae Burke, W3CUL, took over
for balance of the term.

Five issues, 8½ x 11 in size, and two single sheets, 8½ x 14.

Tenth Anniversary issue (October - November) was largest, with 31 pages.
It contained pictures of all officers, district chairmen and
publicity chairman. It had special items on YLRL's ten years of
life; a feature story, "The YLRL Story," with picture of founder,
Ethel Smith; a crossword puzzle; anniversary greetings from
George E. Sterling, W3DF, Commissioner, FCC; Wm S. Paley, Chair-
man of the Board, CBS, Larry Lekashman, W2IOP, F. L. Ankenbrandt,
Maj. Gen. WSAF, Dir. of Communications, and Howard Bonham, V. P.
for Public Relations, the American Red Cross; and numerous other
special and different articles.

The June-July issue started a "new look" with the 8½ x 11 size sheet
divided into two vertical columns. New features were started in
the June-July issue: "Let's Get-Together" was to be the report
of all kinds of get-togethers from gabfests to conventions; "How
Did it Happen to YOU?", a feature of how the individual YLs be-
came interested in getting their own amateur license.

WB8MFD-Joan is from Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio. A retired R.N. the OM is Paul- not licensed.

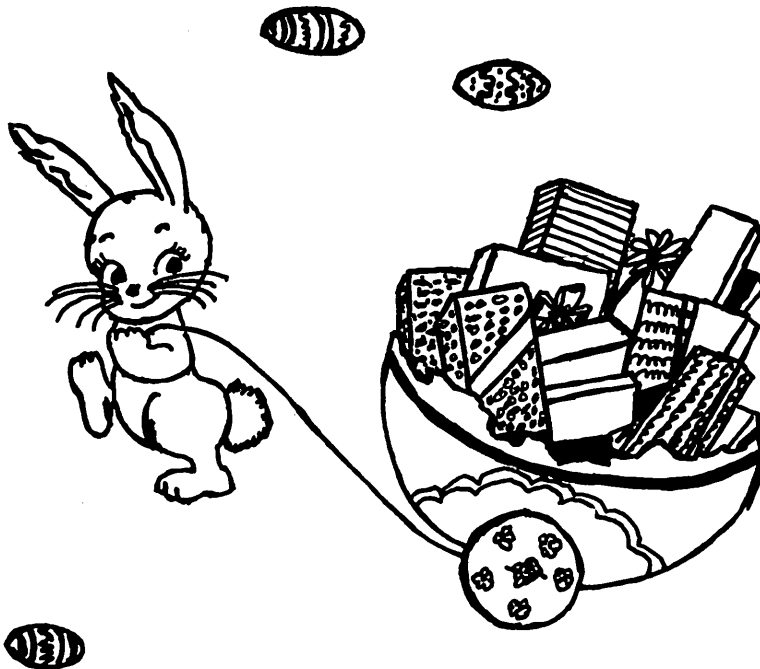
