A Proposed Raise In Dues

It appears that an increase in YLRL dues is necessary due to the rising cost of postage, etc., and other ever rising expenses in the running of YLRL and the various

programs we support.

Part of your dues are spent on contest awards, part on administration and other YLRL activities, and part on YLH. YL Harmonics is the largest single expense and the largest part of your dues is spent on this activity. (The CB&P limits YLH costs to 2/3 of the amount received from dues, and based on 900 members this would be \$300 per issue.) Here is a summary of the expenses for YLH #1-1974.

\$231.75 Printing

21.46 Mailing envelopes

5.00 Pro-rata share bulk-mailing fee

37.25 Bulk mail postage

- 10.56 First class mail (for Officers, Alaska, & Canada) Air mail (Canal Zone, Puerta Rico, & Hawaii)

39.90 DX air mail

Misc. (Address plates, ink, glue, paper, etc.) (This is not all inclusive. For instance, there was in this issue a mimeographed form which cost 3.00 \$7.50 in addition to the expenses listed)

\$351.12

As you can see, this exceeds allowable expenses by \$51. and it's going to get worse. From the postal rate increase that we already know about, postage will be up (if this was applied to YLH #1) \$11.24. This means that YLH #2 will be about \$62 over budget. It is still not know (at this writing) about increases, if any, in DX air mail rates—currently 40¢, 50¢, or 60¢ (depending on location) per issue per DX member. When this excess expense is applied to all six issues, we are in excess of \$372 over allowable expenses for YLH alone. And, of course, all other YLRL expenses are going up, too.

We must set the wheels in motion now if we are to have

an increase in dues, so that it may become effective for the

dues which are due March 1, 1975.

Some members of the Board of Directors have favored a straight "across the board" increase, others favored a prorated increase, or an "across the board" increase coupled with a postage surcharge for any member receiving YLH in any way other than bulk rate (with the exception of YLRL officers).

These are the three alternatives to be offered, and will be placed on the ballot for your vote in the next issue-YIH #3. Study the proposition and think it over carefully before time to vote.

AFFILIATION WITH YLRL

ARTICLE XIII - AFFILIATED CLUBS, from the CB&P

Sec. 1. Local clubs of women radio amateurs shall be eligible for YLRL Affiliated Club Membership when 50% of the licensed members of such club are YLRL members in good standing. Written application for affiliation shall be made to the Secretary, accompanied by a roll of the membership of the club and designation of the geographical area covered. Election shall be by vote of the Executive Board. A Certificate of Affiliation shall be issued by the YLRL Secretary.

Sec. 2. Affiliation of the YLRL affiliated Clubs shall be renewable annually at the beginning of the club year and shall require submission of an up-to-date membership

list and affirmation of eligibility.

Sec. 3. YLRL Affiliated Clubs shall be independent organizations and shall pursue no course of action in the name of YLRL without first obtaining written permission of the Board of Directors. If the name "Young Ladies Radio League" or "YLRL" is incorporated in the name of the local club, it shall be qualified as to location or territory served by the local club.

Sec. 4. Any action or policy pursued by an affiliated Club which is in opposition to the Constitution or policy of YLRL shall be cause for cancellation of affiliation

within the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Sec. 5. For contest purposes, the membership of Affiliated Clubs shall be limited to those members actually residing within the geographical area specified in the application for affiliation.


