

CR7LU-Laclo, Mocambique. Rules for "Beira Interna-

tional DX Contest" 1959. A City celebration to honor top of first year club activities in Beira Mozambique.

Portigues East Africa.

1.) The contest will take place between 00.00HMT August 15 and 24.00 GMT August 25 and any fixed station in the world, amateur bands, CW or fone, can compete under terms of their licenses in their respective countries.

2.) Each station can be only worked in one band. No more than ten stations in each country will be considered, but a larger number of stations may by admitted to make up for any unforeseeing oc-

cur rence.

3.) Every station worked outside Beira will count the following points: CW, I point and Phone, 1,25 point. A multiplier will be granted by every country worked. Countries names are shown in ARRL official list.

4.) From stations operating in Beira contestants will obtain the following and special points which must be scored according to their zones:

CW-2 points; phone 2,50 points for stations located in following zones: 36 & 38; 37 (except VS9-Socotro Island); 39 (except FBS-Amsterdam, St. Paul, & Kerguelen Islands es VKØ-Heard Island.)

CW-3points; phone-3,75 points. Stations located in following zones: 3 (except VE & VO); 11 & 15; 13 (except CE9, LU/z & VP8, including

Falkland Islands); 14 (except CT2)

CW-4 points; phone-5,00 points--Stations located in following zones: 4 & 5 (except FB8, VE, & VO); 16, 20, 34, & 35.

CW-5 points; phone-6,25 points. Stations located in following zones: 14 (CT2 only); 21, 22, & 23, 37 (VS9-Socotra Island only).

CW-6 points; phone-7,50 points. Stations located in following zones: Stations located points; phone-7,50 points.

CW-6 points; phone-7,50 points. Stations lo-cated in following zones: 1 & 2; 3, 4, & 5 (FB8 only, but except Falkland Islands); 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30; 39 (FB8-Amsterdam, St Paul & Kerguelen Islands, es VKØ-Heard Island, only); All stations in Antarctic.

CW-7 points; phone-8,75 points. Stations located in following zones: 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, 17, 18, 19.

CW-8 points; phone 10,00 points. Stations located in following zones: 31, 32, & 40.

5.) Contestants scoring 1.000 points, as a minimum, will be awarded as follows:

(a.) City of Beira Cup for the top scorer.

(b.) Excepting to top scorer, "Gorongosa" Cup to the highest scoring in each Continent. It is understood, however, that both Americans are considered apart for the purpose.

(c.) Special certificate.

Amateurs living in Beira are not entitled for these awards.

6.) Listners controlling contacts with any station in Beira and scoring 1.000 points at least according to rules 3 & 4, will also awarded same certificate.

7.) Calls in this contest will be as follows:

8.) Contestant must send a list containing: (a.)

Name, prefix & QTH, in full es zone; (b.) Day,
hour, GMT of QSO & reports exchanged; (c.) Prefix of station worked; (d.) Band and type of
emission used; (e.) Station worked for the first
time must be especially marked; (f.) Score according to rules 3 & 4, points computation, multiplier and total; (g.) signature

9.) All lists must be addressed to P.O. Box 875, Beira, Mocambique, Portabuese East Africa, and must reach the C.C. DX no later than 31st Oct. 1959, with 10 IRC and QSLs concerning stations worked for the 1st time; if these QSLs are not produced, contact will not be considered.

10.) Correspondence, certificates, cups, and QSLs will be posted, by C.C.DX registered, ordinary mail, to their destinations but if airmail way is preferred IRC for amount due must be added. Foreign contstants are hereby advised that any custom duties to be collected on cups when entering their countries are their own.



A HISTORY OF YLCC-1,000 at W20HH by H.S. Bradley, better known to YLs as "Howie"

(the following article was written at the request of K6ENK, YL H Editor -- Inx to Howie for the article)

When 1st licensed in early 1933 as W8JIW (in the . same QTH as at present), YL ops were few and far between and offered a challenging search on CW to which this station has been limited until 1950. Rigs in use here were run at respective inputs of 20 watts for 14 mc and 10-17 w. on 1.8, 3/5, 7, and 28 mc into an end-fed 1351 wire about 25! above ground (this antenna still serves for many contacts, especially into Asia). Gradually as more YLs appeared on the air, it seemed feasible to work WAS/YL, and as a result, the first such award was earned in October 1949 after a 2 year search and wait for a YL in our 48th state of West Va. in the person of WSEVR. A few of the 10 Mtr fone girls kindly tuned for my CW on my one es only Xtal frequency, but all above contacts were effected with CW only from this end.

About this time a Millen exciter was added and operated at an average input of 35 watts on 1.8, 3.5, 7, 14, 27, es 28 Mc es, later 21 mc, but limited to Xtal frequencies es a modulator provided added fone contacts for the first time in 1950-1st fone QSO being wid HCSGRC (a yl at that!), before even a "V" was worked by this mode! In attaining the first WAS/ YL and WAC/YL (1948), added contacts had also been made so that undoubtedly W2QHH had over 100 YLs confirmed long before YLCC was originated, but unfortunately did not learn of the award in time to claim Nr. 1. as in the case of the two former awards. Since stickers were made available for added lots of 50 YLs. it seemed but logical to continue the pursuit which we've done, meanwhile, acquiring a Ranger (with vfo for the 1st time) which has been loaded to about 55 vatts input, and an Eldico to around 35-45 w, into the same end-fed wire, plus a new E-W 2641 wire up about 501, giving much better "tools" for the chase, especially on the fone bands!

Contrary to general opinion, time on the air is very limited, due to work which involves walking over 17 miles a day (over 20 miles per day for some 12 years), and delivering 300-400 lbs of mail, plus

additional interests which include hunting, fishing, trapping (the xyl wears some of our catches), stamp collecting, gardening es wild-flower culture. A vy active participation in softball has been shelved due to injury es the advancing infirmities of old age!) More recently line noise, ITV, the activities of a 1 large printing plant beneath the longwires, and fringe area TVI to channels 2 es 3 hve further cut operation. And, to further complicate the YL search, W2QHH, has been keenly intersted in DX, which under handicaps of QTH (in a 1600' hole in the hills), lack of a beam, QRP, etc has taken all too much time es effort to produce an all time total of 287 countries worked. So it is actually remarkable that even the first 100 YLs shud hve been worked, but the tougher the prospects, the more satisfying the results, so each hundred has been followed by another. The utmost of courtesy has always been extended by all Net Controls of the various YL Nets (even tho! in mani cases this courtesy boosted my YL totals to their respective disadvantages, since they were also in search of increased YL totals!) Under such circumstances it has always been my aim to be brief es as unobtrusive as possible es seldom hve more than a vy few minutes been available for ani such Net participation, and, in the long run, a relatively small percentage of YL contacts has been made via this route (altho I'm most grateful for each es every one obtained this way). Too, nay of the YLs worked live been most helpful in unearthing new YLs for W20HH, relaying info that we cud not otherwise hve gleaned in our limited time on the air. A goodly portion of these, expecially novices, kindly metskeds, especially on 80 Mtrs es some of them such as WV4BU es WP4AFN (aged 8 es the youngest Novice in ... Puerto Rico) representing fair DX for this band. YLs, likewise, have played an important part in completing the only 7-band WAS effected to date, oldtime YLs like W4SGD, W7GUQ, W7NH, etc. providing states which weren't otherwise too easily worked on-80 Mtrs.

Encouraging words es comments encountered along the line hve served to keep us going. Mani YLs wrked for the 1st time, knew of our special efforts directed toward their group es some, like VE3DKY remarked that they had actually anticipated my call and wondered "how long I cud elude u", or like KL7AZV

who wrote on her QSL "that several YLs had inquired of me as to whether I had yet contacted you", or like ZSLRM who had "already heard of your famous YL collection". The struggle was made well worth the truble when W+SGD replied to our IP st lot of 50 YLs "I simply don't believe it, but seeing is believing, Congratulations?"

"Mani an OM has kindly dragged his MyL or daughter from the kitchen, or even from their bed (may I be forgiven) to provide a new one. The Colvins of W6KG must be mentioned especially in this connection, for Lloyd got Iris out of bed in Japan to complete my WAC/YL and similarly his daughter, Joy, from their Calif, QTH in more recent years. While wrking UA9DN in 1957, I inquired whether his XYL was available at the time, but he replied that she was not at home at the moment; when I QSLd, I reminded him that the next time he heard me calling him, he wud know that I was looking also for his XYL, UA9DA; as is my custom. I left the Rour on while writing letters one evening over a year later, es who shud appear but UA9DN, so a quick QSY to the rig a short call es bk came Vo wid a good report on our QRP, es an immediate "QRX for Toni, UA9MA. " My own memory being as faulty as it is, I cad not but marvel at his keeping me in mind. in this manner especially for such a period of time. Notes kept on other OM/XYL teams in the DX world paid off in such contacts as JTLAA, PAØZD, VP2DA, OH2YV es mani others followed immediately by QSOs wid the respective XYLs. An eager ear is always kept cocked for "88", "YL", "XYL" or a feminine name in my tuning routine es has often produced info that has led to a new YL contact in the future, if not at the immediate time. While tuning 21 mc CW one day, I caught someone just as they signed "GB Elena", without having any idea who Elena was or who was signing with her. A desperation call "Elena, de W2QHH" surprisingly enuf produced an unexpected contact wid ILCWK!

To K5LFK falls the dubious distinction of hving actually been our 1,000th YL confirmation rovd. But to one es all, sincere thanks for the contacts es QSLs rovd. Special tax to the Custodians who hve labored thru our lists es cards—especially Katherine who must hve gnashed her teeth with each successive 50 cards, but she always came up smiling.
