PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

While at the Convention in Boston, Ethel Smith, K4LMB, handed me an envelope which contains the original letters and the first Constitution and By-Laws for YLRL. The documents have been missing for many years and were recently discovered. The pages are yellow with age. I plan to have copies made of them, then have the originals sealed in plastic to preserve them. They will be sent to our Librarian for safe keeping.

I plan to move to another location here in Denver within the next few months and, to make the transition easier for the mail service. have a P.O. Box rented which can be used at this time. Please note this change, P.O. Box 6140, Denver, Colorado 80206.

BOARD ACTION

On the ballot in this issue is a decision by the membership to make a change in the Constitution-By-Laws and Procedure Policy. The Board feels that since many of the local YL clubs permit membership to non-licensed women they are at a disadvantage when it comes to YLRL affiliation. Our rules now state that 50% of all members must be members of YLRL. If they must count their non-licensed members in many cases they cannot ever hope to have YLRL affiliation. YLRL will not permit membership to non-licensed women, but each club has it's own rules. Therefore, the board voted unanimously to allow affiliation to clubs where 50% of the Licensed members are members of YLRL. Since this requires a vote by the membership at large, we ask you to consider this move.

A motion to consider extending the term of office for District Chairmen and/or other officers to two years was denied. Tabled for future action was the idea of allowing a maximum of two successive terms for the President and Vice President. At present neither of these offices can be elected for a second term. The Board will consider this move very carefully before any further action is taken.

Your logs have been carefully gone over—and any change made in your score is for a good reason. First off, check your own multiplication. Then check your claimed sections. Some of you came up with some real goodies! We use the ARRL section list, which is available from the V.P. for an S.A.S.E. These were some of the common mistakes: counting KP4, KG4 and KV4 separately—they are in the West Indies Section. VE1 and VO are Maritime. (VE8 is a separate section—Yukon) Some of the erroneous section is that were counted were: Southern Florida, Central Pennsylvania, Northern New York, Eastern New

Mexico and Central Mass. Some of you worked contacts only in the U.S. and Canada. Both of these countries are divided into ARRL Sections—they cannot also be counted as countries.

The usual number of "lids" seemed to multiply this year! These same CW logs show a lovely bunch of unassigned calls—including a W2, a KØ and also a K2 call which years ago had been assigned to anyone. To the 12 Top Scorers—our Congratulations! To the more than 300 of you who took time to submit a log, our thanks. And a word to those who submitted illegible, sloppy logs . . your logs were used for confirmation, that is where I could read them at all. Before you send in a log next year, look at it again, and make sure you'd be willing to plow through at least 300 just like it. Even if you can't type it, you can make it readable—and not send in a blurry carbon copy made up as you went along, or an illegible, faint machine copy of what was obviously a messy log to begin with. You'll have the sincere gratitude of the V.P. who has to check it.

CQ YL COLUMN DISCONTINUED

On April 25, 1966, W5RZJ was notified that beginning with the July issue of CQ the YL column would be dropped. Other columns were affected also; in particular, Novice, VHF and Club Forum were dropped in June. Space and RTTY, as well as YL, go in July, with DX, Propagation, Ham Clinic, Contest Calendar and USA-CA undergoing drastic revisions. The editors of CQ plan to revamp the magazine, giving more space to technical material and less to operating type news.

However, K2MGA plans to publish individual news and feature items on the YLs, and cover the YL contests. So, these changes amount to a re-direction of our writing to broaden its appeal. K2MGA asks for a steady stream of feature items and news, and they'll publish as much as space permits.

So, gals, we can no longer publish such items as club officers, certificate information, etc., but if you YLs still want to be represented in CQ, let's give them a steady stream of feature items and news—I'll need your co-operation more than ever! Let's hear from you.

YL CENTURY CERTIFICATE RULES

1. Two-way communication must be established on authorized amateur bands with stations, mobile or fixed, operated by 100 different licensed women amateurs. Any and all amateur bands may be used.

2. All contacts must be made from the same location. Within a given community, one location may be defined as from places no two of which are more than 25 miles apart.

3. Contacts may be made over any period of years, provided only that all contacts are

from the same location.

4. Contacts with YL's anywhere in the world are recognized, provided only that confirmations clearly indicate the stations were operated by duly licensed women am-

ateur radio operators.

5. 100 QSL cards, or other written communications, from the stations worked confirming the necessary two-way contacts, accompanied by a list of claimed contacts, including the full name of the operator, alphabetically arranged (last name first), the call letters, and the date of each contact, must be submitted by the applicant directly to the YLCC custodian. Sufficient postage must be sent with the confirmations to finance their return by first class mail. The YLRL will not be responsible for any loss or damage to same.

Endorsements: Confirmations of contacts accompanied by alphabetical list, as described above, from stations operated by additional YL's may be sumitted for credit each time 50 additional confirmations are available. Endorsements will be made to the original certification as application is approved. Gold stickers will be awarded to applicants who have worked their additional contacts from the same location (or within 25 miles radius). Silver stickers will be awarded, provided only that the holder of the certificate, in moving, retains the same call letters that appear on the original certificate.

7. Decisions of the YLCC custodian regarding interpretations of these rules as here stated or later amended, shall be final. All inquiries regarding cards, applications, or the certificate should be addressed to her. Address and name: Onie Woodward, W1ZEN, 14 Emmett Street, Marlboro, Massachu-

DX-YL AWARD RULES

1. Keep your log as you usually do and when you have worked 25 DX YL's, make a copy showing the following information: Date, time, station worked, frequency, her report, your report, mode of operation, her name and QTH.

2. All QSO's must be made from one QTH,

or within a 25 mile radius.

Send your log to Maxine E. Willis, W6UHA, 6502 Wynkoop St., Los Angeles. California 90045. YL's in the U.S.A. may send postage stamps in any amount to help with cost of mailing their certificate. if they wish.

4. Stickers will be awarded for each 10 ad-

ditional YL operators worked.

5. QSL cards are not necessary for this award.

6. Contacts do not have to be with 25 different countries, just 25 different DX

7. U.S.A. and possessions are counted as separate countries for this award (use ARRL

countries list as a guide.)

8. Contacts will count if the YL holds an operator's license according to the rules governing amateur radio in her country. She may be using her OM's station, club station, etc.

Contacts made before April 1, 1958, will

not count for this award.

10. This award is not available for OM's.

RULES FOR WAC/YL AWARD

1. The Young Ladies Radio League issues a Worked All Continents-YL certificate to any licensed amateur in the world.

Two-way communications must be established on the amateur radio bands with the six continents: North America, South America, Europe, Africa, Asia and Oceania. Any and all authorized amateur radio bands may be used. Cross-band contacts are permitted; contacts may have been made over any period of years.

3. Contacts with all six continents must be made with duly licensed woman operators.

Contacts with all six continents must be made from the same location. Within a given community, one location may be defined as from places no two of which are more than 25 miles apart.

5. Six QSL cards or other written confirmations, showing proof of contacts, must be submitted with application. IRC's or the equivalent thereof, must be sent with the confirmations to finance their return by first-class mail. The YLRL will not be responsible for any loss or damage to same.

6. Decisions of the WAC/YL custodian regarding interpretations of these rules as here stated or later amended, shall be final.

7. Send applications and confirmations for this award to: Miriam V. Blackburn, W3 UUG, WAC/YL Custodian, Box #2, Ingomar, Pennsylvania 15127.

NOTE: To date, over 700 WAC/YL certificates have been issued to amateur radio operators all over the world.
