

It is incorporated as such under the laws of the State of California. Dues are \$3.00 per year, pro-rated quarterly from March 1 for new members, as follows: Those joining in March, April or May pay \$3.00; those joining in June, July or August pay \$2.25; those joining in September, October or November pay \$1.50; those joining in December, January or February pay \$1.00. (Except for adopted members, whose dues will not be pro-rated for portions of years.) Dues for adopted members are \$3.50. Dues for a "family member" are \$1.25. All others pay \$3.00. Non-members may subscribe to YL HARMONICS for \$3.00 per year.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

As is the custom, the Board of Directors Meeting was conducted by mail with letters going to all on March 29, 1968. Various suggestions had been made, and these were first evaluated by the President's Advisory Committee. So the final ballot to the Directors contained questions pertaining to:

- 1. Continuous Membership Certificate. It was voted to discontinue the certificates after the first one to a YL and issue stickers to be affixed to the original to avoid retiring the old certificate which has a certain sentimental value. Custodian, W2OWL, is securing the stickers and letters to accompany them.
- 2. It was voted to move Howdy Days to later in the week so that working YLs could have a chance to participate. It was a tie between Thurs., Fri. & Sat.; or Fri., Sat., & Sun., so it was left up to the Vice-President who is in charge of contests. She chose Th-Fr-Sat. plan.
- 3. The Low-Power Multiplier came up for discussion again, and it was voted 3 to 1 to retain this in the scoring of contest logs.
- 4. It was voted to approve the appointments of VE3ASZ and VE3GJH to act as Auditors in the balloting for 1969 officers.

YLCC REMINDERS

1. QSLs cannot be honored if the:

CMC Custodian

- a. Call letters of both stations are not on the card.
- b. Call letters are incorrect.
- c. QSL has been altered in any way by the applicant (don't write over a miswritten call on a card - tear it up and make out another).
- d. YL QSL has been used before, regardless of location or change of call.
- e. QSL does not carry the usual complete information considered necessary to confirm a contact.
- 2. Keep duplicate lists of each application. Checking with these is the only sure way of detecting duplications when applying for stickers.
- 3. Silver Stickers will be awarded provided only that the holder of the certificate, in moving more than 25 miles, retains the same call letters that appear on the original certificate.
- 4. The list accompanying an application must include:
 - a. The full name of the operator, alphabetically arranged (last name first).
 - b. The call letters.
 - c. The date of each contact.
- 5. QSLs must be returned via 1st Class mail, and sufficient postage must be sent to finance their return in this way.
- 6. Please know what is required for a YLCC Certificate before applying. Rules are available upon request from the Custodian, WIZEN.
