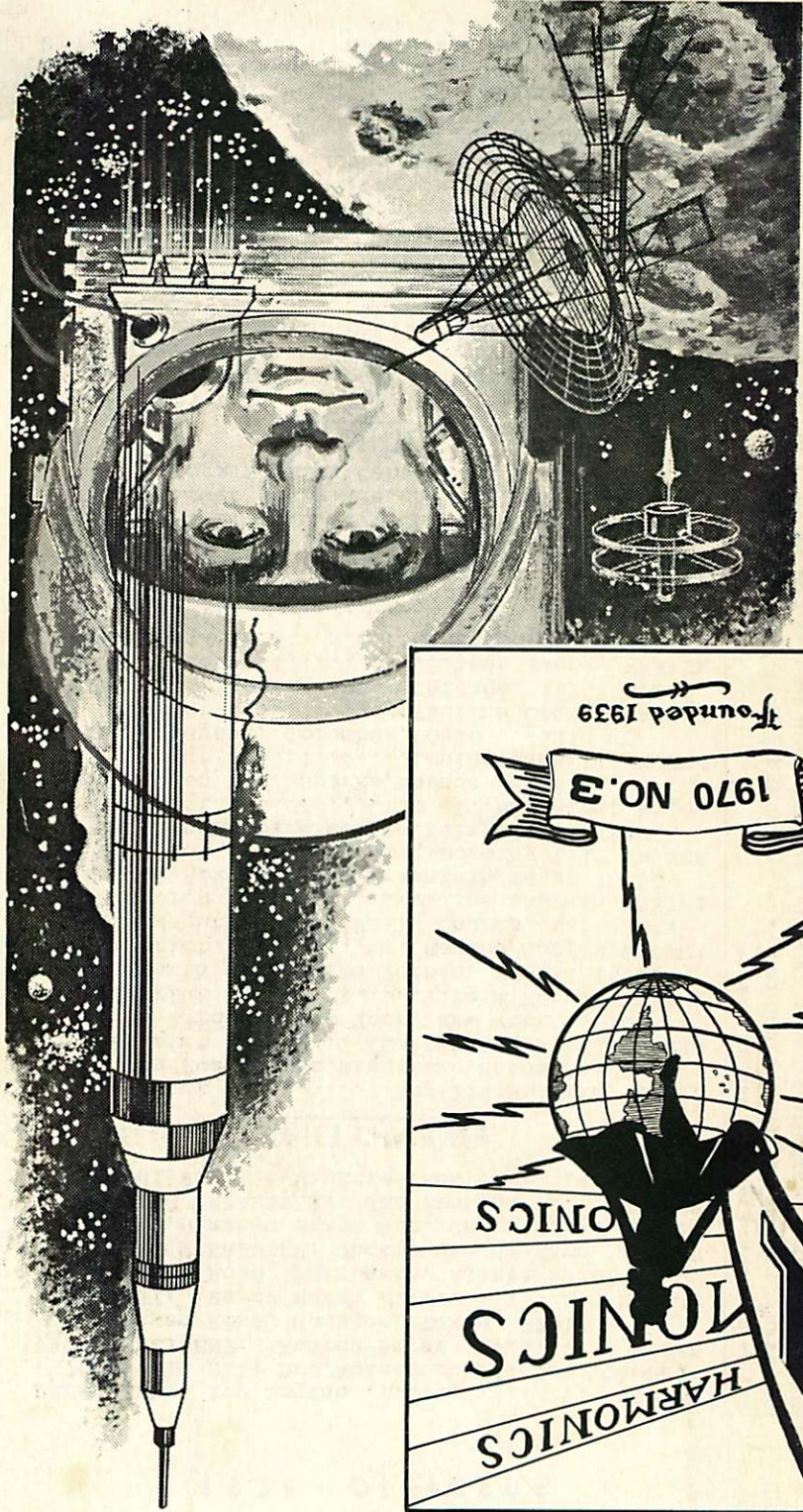

BALLOT AUDITORS for 1970: Rose, KL7FQQ and Trudy, KL7GFU.

- YLRL CONTESTS: -In the event of a 'first place tie' YLRL will award duplicate 'first place awards'.
- In the event of a 'second place tie' YLRL will award duplicate 'second place awards', and the next best score will be brought up for third place.
- The Board voted not to allow any extension of mailing dates to DX stations submitting a contest log. Deadline dates for contest logs will remain the same for all contestants as published in Y L HARMONICS.
- Under rules of the YLAP Awards, the Board approved the addition of the underlined words:-
 High score phone - gold cup; High score c.w. - gold cup; YLRL members only, including YLRL members anywhere in the world.

First, second and third place c.w.; and phone; (not combined) and highest c.w. and phone log in each district and country will receive a certificate.

Corcoran Award: It was voted that this award remain unchanged and available to YLRL members only, who are Stateside including all A.R.R.L. Sections.

TAPE TOPICS: Tape Topics edited by Raj, K7NZO, is available to our blind YLs. The Board voted against the tapes being made available to OMs unless he is a subscriber to Y L HARMONICS, since it takes a long time for the mailers to get around to the YLs.

Members who submitted suggestions for review by the Board of Directors, have been notified by Mail of the Board's decisions.

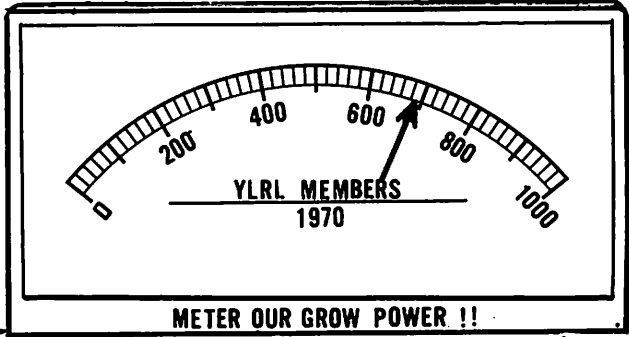
