YL HARMONICS is published by and for the members of the Young Ladies' Radio League, Inc. YLRL is a non-profit, fraternal organization comprised of women amateur radio operators, incorporated as such under the laws of the State of California. Dues are $\$ 3.00$ per year, due and payable March 1, and delinquent March 31. For new and reinstating members joining after August 31, the dues may be pro-rated by half the annual dues for that fiscal year (currently $\$ 1.50$ ). Dues for adopted members are $\$ 3.50$, and may not be pro-rated for portions of years. Dues for "family member" are $\$ 1.25$ : and subscriptions by non-members are $\$ 3.00$ per year, and may not be pro-rated for portions of years.


The nominating committee has come up with a fine slate of officers to run YLRL in 1974. A separate ballot is provided hoping that this will incourage more ballots to be cast. Please exercise your privilege to vote and send your ballot today to Secretary Myrtle, WA6ISY.

At the April 2nd Board of Directors' meeting, it was voted unanimously to establish a high-scoring certificate for Novices who participate in YLRL's contests-second and third place certificates issued where participation warrants.

It was also voted at the April 17th Board of Directors' meeting to purchase an addressing machine for the Editor of YL HARMONICS. Funds for this purchase are to be used from YLRL's savings account.

YLRL's Convention Kit finally reached me on April 19th after being shipped from Nevada on March 1st. Rather than ship it to the next president, and run the risk of more damage in transit, I will keep it here until our next convention in .976. Don't forget that we have a Mini-Kit which is light in weight and easily mailable. This kit is for promoting YLRL at conventions and hamfests that attract mostly local amateurs. This is in the keeping of the Property Custodian, Londa-WA2CRW.

## BETTER WRITE YOUR CONGRESSMAN

I am sending a copy of the bill which I read partially on WCARS coday. I think it should be printed in YL HARMONICS (it is authentic, hi!) The members should be encouraged to write their own representatives in the U. S. Congress and members of the Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce urging them to support the Bill.

93rd Congress, 1st Session, H.R. 3516, in the House of Representatives, January 31, 1973.

Mr. Teague of California (for himself and Mr. Bennett) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce.

## A BILL

To amend the Communications Act of 1934 to require that radio and television receivers meet certain technical standards for filtering out interference.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That section 303(s) of the Communications Act of 1934 is amended by inserting "(1)" after "(s)" and by adding at the end thereof the following:
"(2) Have authority to require that apparatus designed to receive broadcasts comply with standards of the Commission under this paragraph (2), when such apparatus is shipped in interstate commerce, or is imported from any foreign country into the United States, for sale or resale to the public. Standards under this paragraph shall be prescribed by rule for the purpose of requiring the filtering out of interference. Such standards shall include a requirement that all interference from any amateur station, and any citizens radio service station, operating on its assigned frequency, be filtered out."
