Board of Directors' Meeting (January 1974).

In January, 1974, a YLRL Board of Directors' meeting was held by means of a President' Bulletin mailed to each member, with a ballot attached for each director to return her vote on each question. Your Board of Directors performed this function faithfully and after careful consideration sent me pertinent comments as well as their completed ballots.

Question #1: Jackie van de Kamp, W6YKU, asked about Life Membership which had been given to YLs who are no longer hams and she proposed a change in the Constitution to cover this condition. From the replies which I received regarding this matter, I believe that it must be postponed for consideration at a convention, for the process by which extreme views are gradually brought to a common focus is through full, free and informed discussion. This is only possible at a convention. This matter needs discussion.

<u>Question #2</u>: Dot, WA8IJW, Eastern Tape Librarian, proposed definite rules of procedure for conducting distribution of tapes to blind YLs. She has merely put down the accepted practice in black and white.

<u>Result of ballot</u>: Unanimous approval, and I believe this outline of procedural tape policy should be in the YLRL procedure policy. At the present time the rules will be in the librarians', the president's and the vice president's notebooks. One comment regarding "Area" said that provisions for tape-users in Hawaii and Alaska are theoretical for we have never yet had an application from a blind YL in either of these states. It has not yet been tried and one voter believes we should not commit ourselves in this respect.

<u>Question #3</u>: Shall YLRL establish a DX-YLCC Certificate as proposed in YLH #6 in 1973? Shall the President appoint a committee to draft rules, select a certificate and return their proposals to the President before June 1, 1974?

<u>Result of Ballot</u>: Enthusiastic approval of a YL-DXCC certificate and appointment of a committee. The only misgivings voiced by a few because of cost. Their votes were still affirmative: "Yes, if possible without too much cost." Consensus of opinion was "A worthy addition to our other YLRL certificates" and "We have had DX members since the very beginning of YLRL and we are truly a world-wide organization with a good quota of DX members, and we should surely have a YL-DXCC certificate."

<u>Question #4</u>: Would you favor an Eastern YLRL and a Western YLRL convention every four years, two years after the regular quadrennial full national YLRL convention?

<u>Result of Ballot</u>: Almost everyone favored this idea heartily, saying "The more times the members can meet and discuss the problems or other necessary data regarding our League, the better it is for the membership." The Mississippi River was suggested as the dividing line and one reply asked if members could choose which regional conference they wished to attend. Everyone is welcome at either or both conventions. The dividing line would merely be the location of the convention. It was also suggested that perhaps it could be an informal convention meeting at one of the larger motels—they usually have meeting rooms. This would require only one or two YLs to handle all reservational convention.

<u>Question #5</u>: Who has the Membership Information and Application forms supply? Have we enough to supply all D/Cs? Do we need to?

Answer: Membership Committee Correspondents and the Supplies Chairman all have these forms and the Harmonics prints them several times a year for the membership as a whole. We have enough on hand at present and they must be changed if the dues are increased. All D/Cs can obtain a supply of forms by writing to Londa, the supplies chairman or any Membership Committee member.

Question #6: Should YLRL dues be increased in 1975? By \$1.00 each? Or pro-rated? How: Send comments.

Answer: All directors agreed that dues must be increased. This, however, must be voted by the entire membership and you will have a ballot in Harmonics for your vote. It is explained in detail in other articles. Please consider this very carefully and send in your ballot for the method YLRL should adopt.




