

Message From the President lpha

First of all I would like to thank all of you who have written to me in regard to both my Presidential message in YL-Harmonics #2, and to the three Presidential bulletins sent out to the officers and committee women. It is naturally impossible for me to answer each and every one of your letters, but I want you to know that I appreciate hearing from you. We have had a number of controversial subjects, but I think this is what makes life interesting and brings everyone into the picture. As a result the following decisions have emerged.

As you will read elsewhere in this issue, the large directory will be published this year. The major thanks for this goes to Carrie, our hard working Harmonics Editor, who has once again stepped into the breach when it looked like the issue was going to collapse, and will get it out. I urge that each one of you fill out the questionaire in-cluded in this issue and get it back promptly so that you won't be left out.

The matter of financing this large directory was the main item that almost made it flounder. Printing costs have risen tremendously. However, when this matter was brought to the various officers and others to whom the bulletins were sent the response was extremely gratifying. Many pledges and actual donations were received. asking that each member of YLRL, who feels that she can financially afford to do so, send us a minimum of a dollar as a donation towards the large directory and it's additional cost. We realize that economic times are tough. of you who may be a bit more affluent and can afford to send more than a dollar we would certainly appreciate it.

One of the reasons for the added cost is that we hope to print more than the usual thousand copies of this issue so that next year at the National YLRL Convention we will have extra copies available to attendees who may be new members. We are even hopeful that perhaps some of you might wish to purchase extra copies of the big directory to send to YL friends of yours who may not be members and this may bring them into the fold. I suspect some of the OM's will want to get copies also, especially those who are hunting for YL certificates.

In the meantime, our Co-chairwomen of the '.76 Convention are working away for what sounds like it will be a really great convention in Houston, Texas, the weekend of June 11th, 12th, and 13th of 1976, so you might mark those dates on your calendar and save them for next year.

The Canadian YL's are planning a big convention August 31st, to September 2, 1975. It might be fun to go up to New Brunswick. If at all possible I plan to attend this convention. The PJ/YL girls here in New Jersey are plan-ning a Bi-centennial convention for 1976 and I imagine many of the other women's groups will be doing so. If you know when the dates of your conventions are please send them to

Carrie so that we can publicize them for you well in advance. Girls from other parts of the country who may be visiting in the area might like to attend. I am looking forward to the National ARRL convention in Reston, Virginia in July where I will also definitely be attending.

The NY/YLRL has been given a check by the Hudson Amateur Radio Council to aid in the production of a film publicizing women in amateur radio. This will be a short 16mm film produced at a very small expense. I would be interested in hearing from any of the membership who might have ideas of the type of material that could be included in this film, since I will be doing it myself with some outside assistance.

The giant directory will also contain a list of NETS and contest rules so that if there are contest rule corrections or NETS for listing, please get that information in to Carrie at once. We wouldn't want to miss you. Above all I urge all of you to please observe the suspense dates so that this material gets into Carrie on time.

The Supply Chairman tells me that we are almost out of stationary and it will have to be re-ordered. Only orders received prior to April 10th will be offered the old rates. When the new supply is available extra money may be required.

Last but not least, let me remind you again about our continued drive for new members. Everytime you hear a YL on the air, find out if she is a member. If she is not a member, get her name and address and either send it to us and we'll send her an application blank or you do so yourself. Let's get these girls in the organization so that by '76 we may reach a thousand.

AFFILIATION WITH YLRL

ARTICLE XIII - AFFILIATED CLUBS, from the CB&P

Sec. 1. Local clubs of women radio amateurs shall be eligible for YLRL Affiliated Club Membership when 50% of the licensed members of such club are YLRL members in good standing. Written application for affiliation shall be made to the Secretary, accompanied by a roll of the membership of the club and designation of the geographical area covered. Election shall be by vote of the Executive Board. A Certificate of Affiliation shall be issued by the YLRL Secretary.

Sec. 2. Affiliation of the YLRL affiliated Clubs shall be renewable annually at the beginning of the club year and shall require submission of an up-to-date membership

list and affirmation of eligibility.

Sec. 3. YLRL Affiliated Clubs shall be independent organizations and shall pursue no course of action in the name of YLRL without first obtaining written permission of the Board of Directors. If the name "Young Ladies Radio League" or "YLRL" is incorporated in the name of the local club, it shall be qualified as to location or territory served by the local club.

Sec. 4. Any action or policy pursued by an affiliated Club which is in opposition to the Constitution or policy of YLRL shall be cause for cancellation of affiliation

within the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Sec. 5. For contest purposes, the membership of Affiliated Clubs shall be limited to those members actually residing within the geographical area specified in the application for affiliation.

DXPEDITION TO DESROCHES

How many YL operators have the chance to go on an expedition to a remote desert Isle with three, handsome American bachelors? Don't give up hope girls, it can, and did happen to me!

VQ9-ers BP, D & M gave me this fabulous opportunity to join them on a trip to Desroches and having tried field days and camping out in the wilds of Kenya as a radio control station with OM John on several East African Safari rallies, there is nothing to compare with fourteen days on a dxpedition with the promise of a DX break in propagation.

After much planning, buying and borrowing we finally set off from Deau Vallon Bay on the racing yacht "Stormy"—winner of the Cape to Rio Race two years ago—with gear consisting of four rigs, three generators, a variety of antennas, three drums of gasoline and sufficient food to stand a siege. It was an all night journey, rough seas, a strong wind and rain but we made eight knots and daylight brought calmer weather and by 0040Z, we were overjoyed to see a speck of land—unbelievable Desroches.

The Island Manager, Monsieur Loiseau came out in a large pirogue, a canoe type boat, with his crew both to welcome and help us ashore with our gear, and this was carried out with the utmost efficiency, our only breath-taking moment being when lowering the second drum of gas into the pirogue and almost capsizing it. Once ashore, we were able to appreciate the beauty of the surroundings, a coral atoll, eight feet above sea level, about eight hundred acres of mainly coconut trees but areas of cedar and mangroves, the latter inhabited by hundreds of tiny, red cardinals. I also glimpsed my first Boobys and Sooty Terns, not seen on Mahe Island. Inhabitants comprised of about 24 Seychellois workers who tend and harvest the coconut plantations for the copra which is exported, we were all impressed by the lay-out and tidyness of Desroches, a credit to Mr. Loiseau indeed.

It seemed peaceful compared to our home Island, as there is only one vehicle, a clapped out Morris pick-up, but it did a fine job in transporting us four and our cag to the quarters we were to occupy for the next two weeks. These were spacious and pleasant, a large porch which served as a store for everything but the kitchen sink, plus operating space for Bill and Ron, a large bedroom at either end of the building and the smaller room in the centre we made into a utility room—midnight snacks for starving ops and operating positions for Dick and Diane. Two cold showers albeit primitive, but luxury for us expecting very little in the mod-con line, and plenty of drinking water too. We utilized the outdoor kitchen of the Manager, a very dark smoky building, some distance away from our rooms, with wood fires burning under mesh grills, and it resembled the Black Hole of Calcutta, but served the purpose, and we had some excellent meals, compared to our Kenya safaris, extreme luxury.

The lads soon got to work on the antennas, we had two beams, two verticals, dipoles and a long wire, and having erected the first one, my KW2000E was fired up and I was given the honor of making the first contact with the outside world. This was 5Z4NH and he was as pleased as we were, thanks Bob, you made our day. Closed down soon after this and concentrated on the remaining antennas. I went to work on sorting

out the stores, all 28 cartons and thinking of an evening meal. We had not eaten for almost 24 hours and were also shattered from lack of sleep, so called it a day.

Refreshed the next morning, the beams were assembled and another highlight was trying to avert a minor tragedy as the TH3 toppled over with a resounding scrunch, hitting the side of the copra shed and making a beautiful right angle bend in one element, but it worked, nevertheless. We were all set up ready to take on all comers and with excellent conditions until contest weekend, were able to give and receive many contacts and first VQ9/Ds. Conditions deteriorated during our second week. but we struggled on, taking advantage of every minute band opening. logged about 50 countries in 150 contacts before my Tx went on the blink and after my great assistant, Dick (don't know what I would have done without him) agreed it was a bench job! I again had proof of the great Ham spirit with all three lads offering me their rigs as second operator, they were really great! I increased my score to 75 countries. We were impressed by the calling stations, all stations standing by when requested, most courteous and often hanging around for ages in long pile-ups, and much appreciated by us all.

Here I would like to record my special thanks to Sandy-GM3DZB. Gerry-G3KTJ, who helped out with pile-ups, messages, and did so much to cheer us along in the dull condition periods. There are many other Hams who made the dxpedition a success, but will appreciate that lack of space prevents a personal mention. I was more than delighted to be able to get into the YLISSB System and to find Mary-Ann, WA3HUP, as she proceeded to get through as many W/Ks in as a short a time as possible whilst conditions to the States prevailed. We had many hilarious moments, local dogs wandering onto the porch in the early hours of the morning with wires, leads, connectors, around their legs-bet the op at the other end wondered what all the screaming was about when Bill spotted a deadly spider above my head and we all froze until he had bravely clobbered it—chinese noodles and champagne for supper—everyone having a go at producing pancakes like the Moms make—and the wee puppy christened CQ by Bill-swimming and snorkelling, with Ron proving he is almost as good a lobster catcher as a CW op-and Dick with his outstanding photography.

I feel sure there must have been some doubts on having a XYL along on a trip like this, but on my part it was a tremendous success and I could not have wished for more compatible companions.

All good things come to an end and soon we sighted the "Stormy" arriving to take us back. What a return trip! Very rough, high seas, and we were all pleased to disembark at 0400Z on Saturday, September 21 after fifteen hours hard going, all bleary eyed, wet, weary but thrilled to have done it and ready for the next one.

My story would not be complete without credits to all Ham friends on Mahe, expecially Carl, VQ9R, who kept us in touch with John, VQ9MI, through his spare Swan 500c, and for loaning me lots of other gear so useful on the trip.

The trip would not have been possible for me without the tremendous backing from many Ham friends, thanks for the Party!
