Knowledge of one's marital status is not

necessary for a QSO. Contacts on the air are not to pair men and women. This YL or XYL has even crept into some contest wording. Stating the contest was for YL and XYL. It was sufficient to state YL Contest before: Why was XYL necessary? Because some female licensed ops getting on the air thought YL meant single and XYL married. They had always heard their amateur op OM refer to them as an XYL. Upon becoming a ham, they never read what a YL or XYL was, so let's begin the education now. Everyone pass it on the air, in your code/theory classes, call all females by YL, be they married or single. Why should WE differentiate the marital status of female operators, no one does of the male operators. Should we begin to call all single men YM and married MYM (not my idea). Should YLs insist knowing male ops marital status? Who cares! Vol. 1 Nr. 1, May 1940, YL Harmonics, YLRL set forth their policy to use the term "YL" for all licensed amateur operators of the femine sex. YLs let us continue the policy of the licensed women before us who answered the call in May 1939 QST--"How many YLs are there---." Let's nip this in the bud. We must be conscientious when reading information that future or new ops will read—such as abbreviations for CW. Such a change. "Operating An Amateur Radio Station" published by ARRL 56th edition, page 28-xyl (yf) wife--yl young lady. "The Radio Amateurs Handbook" (1976) 53rd edition page 663, same as above. "How To Become A Radio Amateur" (1974) 29th edition page 60, xyl (EX-Young Lady) wife or married woman operator. YL (Young Lady) -- an unmarried woman or girl operator (capital letters are from the issue). So, let's begin teaching that "YL means any duly licensed female Amateur Radio Operator." Write to ARRL, Newington, Connecticut 06111, to please not change the abbreviations for CW from the present publications, but to change it in the "How To" publication, Operating Aid #8. One person writing will be ignored, many writing will will be listened to. Why do I mention ARRL publications? Because I feel more hams read and follow their publications and we trust them to be correct. I do, doesn't everyone!

This column almost didn't get written by me this time, but God must have intervened as Friday night on April 9 while driving home, the brakes were applied, but we kept going right through a red light and just missed a beige station wagon and other cars scattered, lights went all over. The OM Ken, W9DOR, said he was in the back seat and saw that. Daughter Mary, who was driving, was in shock, and I'm glad the plan was to go across the highway, not turn right. 
