Many of you asked for a clarification of Proposal #1 which changed the date of subscriptions to run from March 1st to March 1st. This explanation follows.

NOTICE

We have been asked for an explanation on Proposal #1 of the revisions to the By-Laws. This proposal simply makes subscriptions run from March 1st to March 1st, concurrent with the YLRL Fiscal year. Should you subscribe to Harmonics in the middle of the Fiscal year your subscription is pro-rated according to the following schedule:

Subscriptions received during March, April and May are \$2.00:

Subscriptions received during June, July and August are \$1.50:

Subscriptions received during Sept. Oct. and Nov. are \$1.00:

Subscriptions received during Dec. Jan. and Feb. \$.50.

All subscriptions run to the next March 1st.

Formerly the Constitution called for the subscription to run one year from date of subscription causing confusion and additional work for the Treasurer and Editor. See Article XII, Section 3 of the By-Laws.

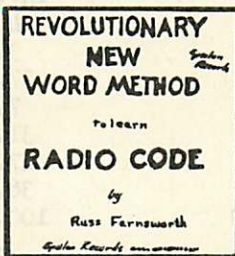

TIME: (35 hours) PHONE - Sat. March 2, 1963 - 1300 EST to
Sun. March 3, 1963 - 2400 EST
(i.e. 1800 GMT Sat. to 0500 GMT Mon.)

CW - Sat. March 16, 1963 - 1300 EST to
Sun. March 17, 1963 - 2400 EST.
(i.e. 1800 GMT Sat. to 0500 GMT Monx)

ELIGIBILITY: All licensed OM, YL es XYL operators throughout the world are invited to participate.

OPERATION: All bands may be used. Crossband operation is not permitted.

PROCEDURE: OMs call "CQ YL" - YLs call "CQ OM".

EXCHANGE: QSO number, RS or RST report, ARRL Section or country. Entries in log should also show Band worked at time of contact. Time, Date, Xmitter and Power. (ARRL Section list available for SASE to V.P.)

- SCORING:
- (a) Phone and CW contacts will be scored as separate contests. Submit separate logs.
 - (b) One point is earned for each station worked, YL to OM or OM to YL. A station may be contacted no more than once in each contest for credit.
 - (c) Multiply the number of QSOs by the number of different ARRL Sections and Countries worked.
 - (d) Contestants running 150 watts input or less at all times may multiply the result of (c) by 1.25 (low-power multiplier.).

LOGS: Copies of all phone and CW logs, showing claimed scores and signed by operator must be postmarked not later than March 31, 1963, and received no later than April 15, 1963, or they will be disqualified. Please file separate logs for each section of contest. Send copies of logs to: BLANCHE RANGLES, KLIZT, 62 Linda Ave., Framingham, Mass.

That evening I met several other hams the DXYLs including VP6PV, VP6WR, Fred and XYL took me to a very cheery party given by Geoff, VP6AM and his XYL at their modern home near Bridgetown. Later we went to a local hotel with dancing out-of-doors to one of the West Indian Steel bands, which produce a liquid type of music absolutely in keeping with a tropical star-lit night, waving palm trees and chirruping cicadas. The next day we drove to another part of the island passing miles and miles of VP6's main crop, sugar-cane. Next stop was 8 days in Port of Spain, Trinidad. Mae, VP4MM, ex VE4SK, of Toronto, came on board to meet me. It was quite the busiest day of the year--the Shrove Tuesday Carnival. West Indians have a marvellous sense of rhythm and color to watch thousands of them parading all day in the most brilliant and exotic costumes to the special carnival tune 'Maria' played by a hundred steel bands was an unforgettable experience. Most of the local people not actually in the parade, watched from 11 AM till after 7 PM, but most tourists found they were quite exhausted after about 4 hours watching, and had to return to their hotels or ships for a 'breather' before going out for a second session. Next day Larry, VP4NC, a Canadian Presbyterian Missionary who is Chaplain at a Boy's College at San Fernando, came 70 miles by car to meet me and drive me back to his home. He and his XYL, Lenore, had invited me and another visiting ham, YV6BC to a barbecue to meet the South Trinidad hams and many of their XYLs. I also met VP2SX and VP2GAC in person while in Trinidad and talked to many other VP hams from stations of VP4NC and VP4MM. I had some lovely drives to various parts of the island and was even taken to see part of the U.S. Naval station at Chaguaramas. On the Amazon part of the trip passengers were reduced from 54 to 28 including 7 charming Americans from N.J., Mo and Nevada, and we were allowed on the ship's Bridge in the mornings while on the river. Stops were made for several days at Belem and at Manana, also we had 3 days at Itacoatiara, Santarem and Breves. This last place is on the island of Marajo, near the mouth of the Amazon which is divided into two by the island, which is about the same size as Belgium! The 'rainy season' had started and we had some cloudy days and rain, but only one really terrific tropical storm, while at Belem and the heat and humidity were not nearly as great as I had expected. Mosquitoes weren't too bad either, and on the 3 days when the ship was invaded by crowds of huge black flying beetles, only a small portion of the passengers were really terrified. These included various ladies

who had a beetle bang into their heads, and then fall down their necks inside their evening dress--this caused much hilarity from fellow passengers, and wild shrieks from the unfortunate victims! After a few more days in Trinidad and Barbadoes, on the homeward voyage, we had a pleasant Atlantic crossing, during which that OLD TIMER, G2YL, surprised herself as much as everyone else by winning the Deck Tennis Singles Tournament! A few days out from Trinidad a stowaway was discovered, living only on Coke, and later on 2 very rare and valuable Brazilian orange-colored birds were found during 'Captain's tour of inspection'. They were confiscated from the member of the crew who had been trying to smuggle them to England, but a few nights later they disappeared from their large cage in the Chief Officer's office. It took 3 days before searchers eventually found their new hiding place, and during that time 6 green parrots and one large wooly monkey were unearthed. What a fabulous trip, Nell, how I envy you, tnx so much for such an interesting letter.

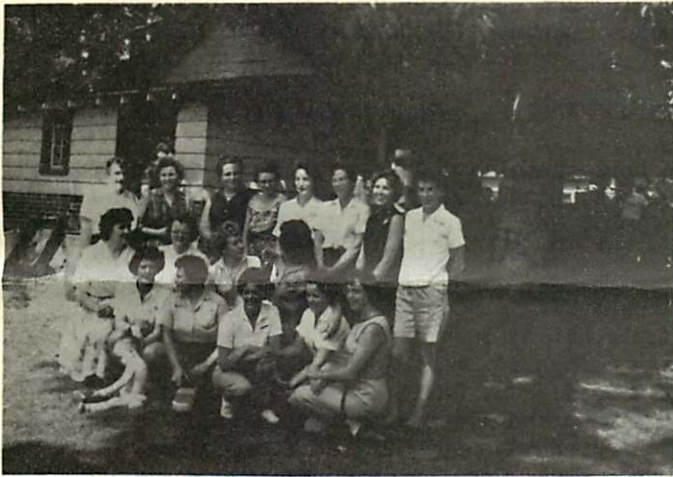

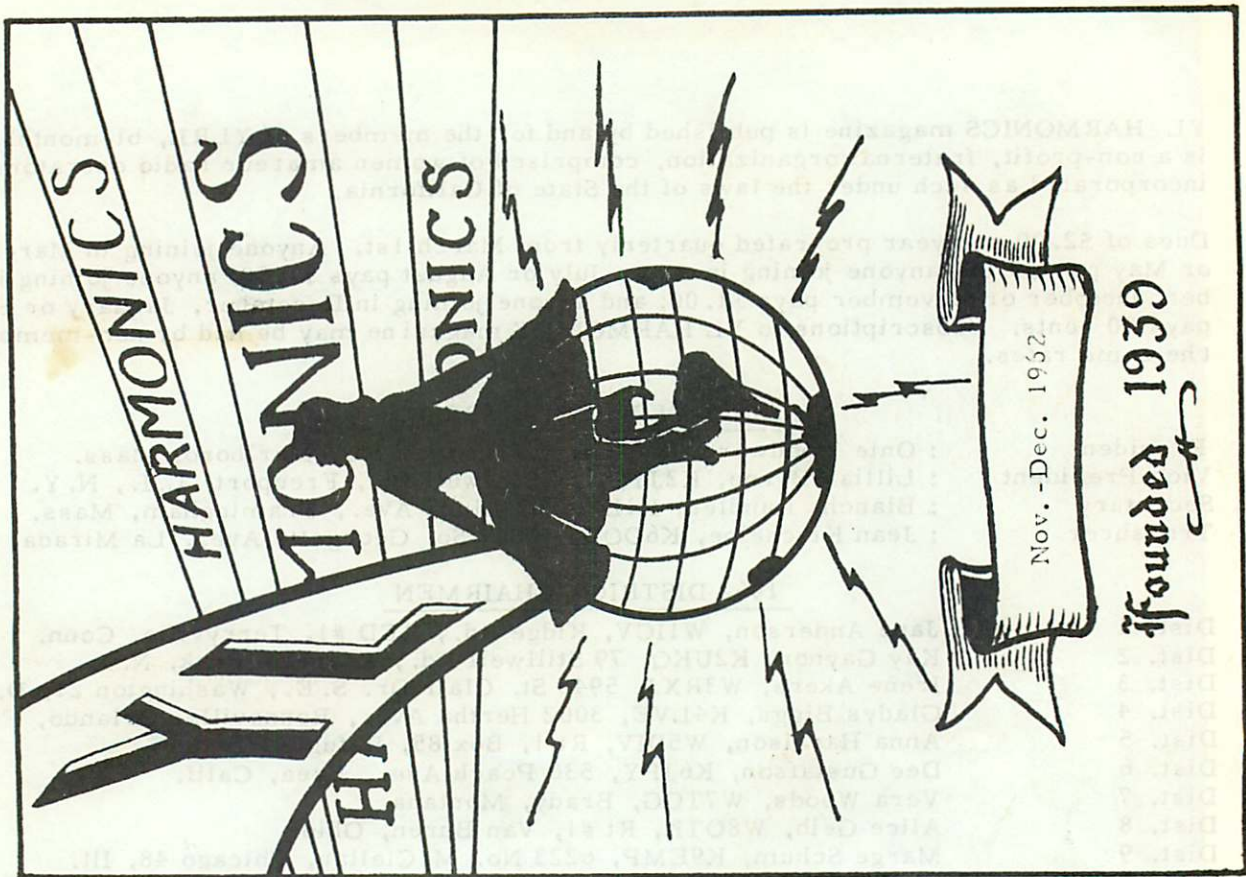
