YLRL Membership dues for the coming year of 1967 are due and payable by March 1, 1967. Any monies paid for membership at any time during this year of 1966 are paid TO March 1, 1967 as per your current membership card.

When your dues are not paid: (1) By March 1 of any year, you are ignoring your By-Laws, Article II, Sec. 3 (2) By March 1 of any year (within the one month grace period), Article 8 says you will be automatically dropped from membership. Laxity in enforcing this policy has resulted in overworked officers and some cases of dissatisfaction and misunderstanding on the part of members.

Now we must all be "happy, happy" and toward this end, I, as Receiving Treasurer, ask that you tie a string on all your fingers as a reminder you can renew membership in our organization any time after Jan. 1 and in the time it takes to tie on the strings, you can be

YL/OM CONTEST RULES

TIME: Phone-Saturday, February 25, 1967, 1300 EST (1800 GMT) to Sunday, February 26, 1967, 1300 EST (1800 GMT).

CW-Saturday, March 11, 1967, 1300 EST (1800 GMT) to Sunday, March 12, 1967, 1300 EST (1800 GMT).

ELIGIBILITY: All licensed OM, YL and XYL operators throughout the world are invited to participate.

OPERATION: All bands may be used. Cross band operation is NOT permitted.

PROCEDURE: OM's call "CQ YL". YL's call "CQ OM".

EXCHANGE: QSO number, RS or RST report, ARRL section or country. Entries in log should show band worked at the time of contact, time, date, transmitter and power. (ARRL section list for SASE to the V.P.)

SCORING: (a) Phone and CW contacts will be scored as separate contests. Submit separate logs. (b) One point is earned for each station worked, YL to OM or OM to YL. A station may be contacted no more than once in each contest for credit. (c) Multiply the number of QSO's by the number of different ARRL Sections and Countries worked. (d) Contestants running 150 watts input or less at all times may multiply the results of (c) by 1.25 (low power multiplier).

(e) SSB contestant running 300 watts P.E.P. or less at all times may multiply the results of (c) by 1.25 (low power multiplier).

LOGS: Copies of all phone and CW logs, showing claimed scores and signed by the operator must be postmarked no later than March 20, 1967 and received no later than April 10, 1967, or they will be disqualified. Please file separate logs for each section of the contest. Send copies of logs to: Marte Wessel, KØEPE, P.O. Box 756, Liberial, Kansas 67901.

AWARDS: 1st place phone: YL-cup; OM-cup. 1st place CW: YL-cup; OM-cup. The winner of the phone cup is also eligible for the CW cup. Certificates will be awarded to high place CW and phone winners in each ARRL district and Country. (NO LOGS WILL BE RETURNED. BE SURE IT IS A LEGIBLE COPY OF YOUR LOG)

**NOTICE THE TIME CHANGE THIS YEAR. THE CONTEST HAS BEEN SHORTENED TO TWO 24 HOUR PERIODS TO GIVE ALL AREAS ONE DAYLIGHT AND ONE NIGHT TIME OPERATING PERIOD. THIS WAS THE SUGGESTION OF DX PARTICIPANTS LAST YEAR, SO WE ARE GIVING IT A TRY.

FEATURE ARTICLE

on Bea Dietz by Camille Hedges, WB2PYI

Bea, although a native New Yorker, grew up in Detroit, Michigan and returned to New York in her late teens. She met her OM, Harry, through work and had sort of an on-again, off-again romance. They eventually married and have two children, Steve and Suzanne.

As the Children were growing, Bea became interested in PTA activities, serving as finance chairman, kitchen slavery, and delegate to any and all outside events.

Bea was active as Secretary of the Coordinating Council, member of the School Board of the Temple, a delegate to the Jewish Council for Religious Education, the Jewish Community Council and a speaker for the Jewish Education Committee.

Bea's introduction to ham radio came when, serving as Hobby Show Chairman for the Police Dept. Coordinating Council, she met a few very young OM's. Then she moved to Valley Stream and that was the end of community work for her. She had a new house to work with, summers in Vermont and then the PTA found her, and likewise the Temple, and so it started all over again.

The motivation to become a ham came when one day her son brought home an old wooden table-top Marconi radio which didn't work. She asked him to get rid of it; she couldn't get a sound out of it and it was just a dust collector. He said, "Mom, I didn't spend a year in tanks for nothing. Give me ten minutes." He took a wire coat hanger, wrapped wire around it, nailed it up on the edge of the roof, attached it to the "piece of junk", and Bea found a new world! Every day she listened to hams, reading mail until she realized that she just had to get an honest-to-goodness receiver. The OM bought her one, she obtained ARRL books, Ameco books, learned the code and built her own oscillator from a battery and a doorbell buzzer. She still didn't know a ham, but when she thought she was ready for the test, she picked one OM, K2YSK, Frank, whom she could hear almost every day, phoned him, and he told her how to get ready for the Novice test, which she passed in 1959, and one year later with the coaching of Frank and his friends and with much studying, she had her General.

Her years as a ham have truly been a revelation. She has talked around the world, handled an untold amount of traffic, helped find a missing Peace Corps girl in Honduras, located a truck driver in Pennsylvania to tell him he was needed at home, helped with the Alaskan Earthquake, sent messages to and from servicemen and women, and has secured blood and eyes. She has had mothers weep with joy and pleasure. She has been bawled

out because a message wasn't delivered within the hour (like Western Union) - the father really blew his top and wanted to "talk to the manager." Bea told him that he was talking to the "manager" and explained the service. Thereupon the OM was most apologetic. She has phone-patched and typed and sent code until her fingers tingled. She has gotten messages directly through to Antarctia (sometimes 5/9 and sometimes letter by letter. repeated over and over-but they got through). She has sent word directly to Liberia to Peace Corps workers (they had transmitters and no crystals) telling them that their crystals and frequencies were okayed and were on the way.

All of this had become so routine that Bea was often surprised when she was awarded some sort of commendation. She has had letters from the ARRL, the Red Cross, U.S. Embassy, the Peace Corps in Monrovia and Liberia, two Public Service Awards, a U.S. Navy Recruiting Service Certificate of Appreciation, about 50 BPL's and a Medallion, and is an A-1 Operator. She has also been named Operator of the Month. Bea belongs to Navy MARS (her call is NØREH), she holds a CP for 15 wpm (hasn't had time to go for more) and has been active with YLRL-was 2nd District Chairman for two years, NYC YLRLwzs Vice President, OPS, RACES, AREC, ARPSC Achievement Award, Assistant Manager of the Mike Farad Emergency and Traffic Net, Assistant Manager of the NYC, LI VHF Traffic Net, NCS on the All Service Net, NCS on the North American SSB NET, has WAS, RCC, YLCC (250+) and has just become interested in the CHC/FHC.

OM Harry is not a ham but is glad to see Bea busy and happy and, last but not least, Bea is a grandmother.

Bea can certainly be termed a ham's ham, lending her generous assistance to anyone crossing her path who needed help.
