

OPERATION: All bands may be used. Crossband operation is not permitted. Net contacts do not count.

PROCEDURE: OMs call "CQ YL" - YLs call "CQ OM."

EXCHANGE: QSO number, RS or RST report, ARRL section or country.

Entries in log should show band worked at time of contact, time,

da date, transmitter and power. (ARRL Section List available for S.A.S.E. to YLRL Vice President - or information may be found on P.6 of any issue of QST Magazine.

SCORING:

- A. Phone and CW contacts will be scored as separate contests. Please submit separate logs.
- B. One point is earned for each station worked YL to OM, or OM to YL.
- C. A station may be contacted no more than once in each contest for credit.
- D. Multiply the number of QSOs by the number of different ARRL Sections and/or countries worked.
- E. Contestants running 150 watts input or less at all times may multiply the results of D. by 1.25 (low power multiplier). S.S.B. contestants running 300 watts p.e.p. or less at all times may multiply the result of D. by 1.25 (Low Power multiplier).

LOGS: Copies of all phone and c.w. logs showing claimed scores, and signed by the operator, must be <u>postmarked</u> no later than March 23, 1970, and received by the Contest Manager (YLRL Vice President) no later than April 13, 1970, or they will be disqualified.
