### SILENT KEY

It is with deep regret that we announce the loss of <u>W6QMO</u>, <u>Jeri Bey</u>. We quote the article authored by her close friend Esther, W6BDE, in the BAYLARC "SPLATTER"; October, 1970.

"For the second time this year we have suffered a regretable loss. Charter member (BAYLARC), W6QMO, Jeri Bey, joined the ranks of the Silent Keys on the evening of our last meeting, September 25. Jeri was the founder and first president of the YLRC/SF which later was renamed BAYLARC. Jeri was an avid CW operator and traffic handler, a member of YLRL active on the Northern California Net for many years and participated in many ham and YL events and activities. During the past two years Jeri suffered several severe heart attacks and was greatly restricted in activity. Our sincere sympathy goes to OM Chuck, W6PHS, in his loss."

YLRL joins BAYLARC in this expression of sympathy to her family and loved ones.

### SYMPATHY NOTES

We wish to express our sincere sympathy to Kayla, WlEMV and her OM, Doc, K4MWS, who suffered the loss of their New Hampshire home by fire. 
