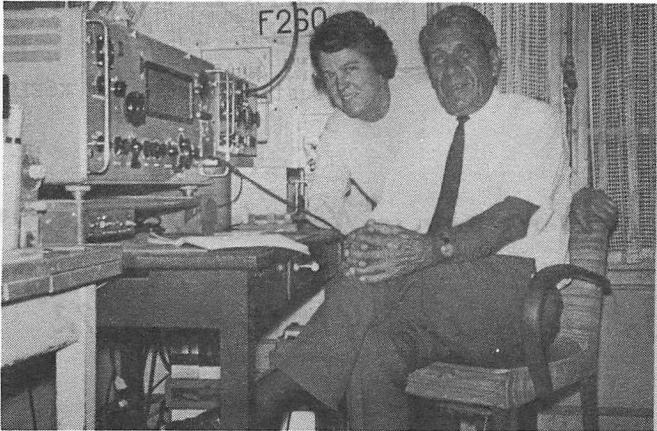

STORM WARNINGS AVAILABLE ON WWV

Perhaps as important as anything that could be heard over WWV and WWVH is their new hurricane and storm warning broadcasts. The National Weather Service in cooperation with the Bureau of Standards plans to implement an hourly program of broadcasting storm and hurricane warnings about Aug 1, 1971. Between the 16th and 17th minutes after each hour, WWV will carry a voice broadcast listing storms in the w.N. Atlantic on 2.5, 5, 10, 15, 20, and 25 khz. WWV will list storms in e. and c. North Pacific between the 49th and 59th minute after each hour on 2.5, 5, 10, 15, and 20 MHz. The list should enable a mariner to note one of concern to him.
