Rich is the President of YLRL whom presides in a convention year, the privilege of meeting many of the YL member's that it might not have otherwise been possible.

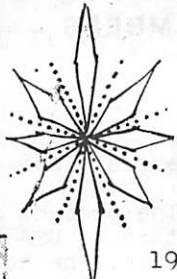

PLEASE READ IT, GALS!

We are still without anyone to put out YL HARMONICS for 1973. We all enjoy our paper, and it would be mighty difficult for YLRL to continue without it. The responsibility belongs to all of us. Who will be the next to assume this interesting and rewarding job? How about you, or You - or YOU???

Mae, K7QGO, has done a beautiful job for the past two years-even while holding other offices- and we are most grateful to her. But enough is enough, and it is time for someone else to take over. As a former Managing Editor, I have some ideas why some of you may hesitate to volunteer for the job. Perhaps you think there are some mysterious talents necessary or that the job is beyond your capabilities in one way or another. But please remember that none of us has had specific training or experience for this job - we were just willing to try it.

For one thing, printing processes have changed in the past few years and we've all had to become familiar with the new ways. But it is much simpler to prepare the material for the paper than it was in the old days when type had to be set and we had to understand proofreaders' marks, etc. Today, what you type and give to the printer is what you get. That simple!

Also, there is no law that says the paper must be done a certain way. For the past five years it has followed much the same pattern-because that seemed the easiest way...but there is always room for improvement and change. Undoubtedly, there is a YL somewhere with some great new ideas.

Although it has not been done recently, the work on the paper could be divided so that several YLs could share the load. This is why we have recommended that a club group take over...but a club is not necessary, and the YLs wouldn't necessarily be located close to each other. One way of dividing the work might go like this: (1) Someone to collect material as it comes in from the Officers, District Chairmen and Certificate Custodians and be sure that announcements of coming events and results of the contests and elections are run at the proper times. This is a cinch if you just refer to the file of the previous year's papers. (2) There should be one good typist who can arrange the pages in a way to make the reading easy. This is fun if one is fairly proficient and has a good typewriter. A machine that uses carbon ribbons, and electric, is best - but much of the material used recently has been done on a common, everyday typewriter. (3) Then it is necessary to keep the mailing list up to date to assure all members of getting their paper. Address changes must be made promptly and address labels prepared. The actual mailing preparation can be done by any willing hands. Now couldn't you do one of those jobs? Of course.

And, don't forget, those of us who have done the job are ready, willing and able to help if you get into a tight spot. Furthermore, we have a fair collection of procedure notes to pass along. So, how about it? A note to Mae, K7QGO, will bring more information on how to take over and handle the job.

Please try it - you'll like it. 33,
