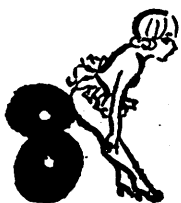

DX YL ADOPTEE PROGRAM

The dues are \$3.50 a year. A DX YL may join YLRL without being adopted if she is allowed to send money out of her country for the dues.

Several of our members have made lasting friendships through the adoptee system. By corresponding with each other and by reading about the other members and our contests and activities in the Harmonics magazine, we feel the adoptee program improves our relationship with our overseas friends.
