PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hi Gals -

The election returns are all in, and congratulations are due your new officers. However, I cannot send all our members congratulations on their participation in the election. Only 27% of our eligible members bothered to cast a ballot! I believe this is a new low, even for YIRL! Now, don't tell me you didn't know about it...there was a notice in my President's message for that issue, and a rundown on all the candidates and proposed amendments. The ballot was printed on green paper so that you couldn't miss it. That is the ONLY page of any issue that is ever printed on other than white paper. Don't you all realize what is happening. You are laying yourselves open to rule by minority groups and you have only yourselves to blame. Besides this, by your apathetic attitude, you give your officers the feeling of "why bother - - they don't care what we do or how hard we work". We have gotten to the point where if our constitution called for a gal to chalk up a majority of the membership voting for her in order to be elected we wouldn't even HAVE any officers! It is very discouraging to the girls running for office to know that the vast majority of our members doesn't care who gets elected. It is an insult to these gals, and I don't wonder that we have trouble in getting girls to accept nominations. I hope each and every one of you who didn't bother to vote will hang her head in shame!

NOW - Please all pay attention! In this last election an amendment to the constitution was passed in which the amount of dues was changed. Since most of you obviously didn't pay any attention to the ballot and the issues thereon, I had better go over it here.......Effective with the 1964 dues, the amount is \$2.50 for U.S. and Canadian YLs - and \$3.00 for all others. These same figures apply to subscribers as well. The amounts for portions of years for new members will be listed on the page of officers on the inside of the front cover starting with the first issue of 1964. PLEASE, PLEASE.. do send in the correct amount to Shirley, K8MZT, your Treasurer again for 1964, so that she won't have additional work either asking for more dues from you, or refunding overpayments. Also, please remember, we can only accept dues for one year at a time. There will be a reminder in the November/December issue of YL Harmonics, and another in the January/February issue. The one in the November/December issue is your official notice of dues coming due...we do NOT mend out bills! The reason I stress this is because, believe it or not, I have been told that we should print in YLH the amount of our dues! This information is in EVERY issue, right on the inside front cover along with the list of current officers!!! Dues are due and payable on the first of March, and become delinquent on the first of April, but if you would like to get yours in early I know Shirley won't mind accepting it any time previous to that time, hi!

While I'm still in a mean mood, let's take up another thing on which many of you are remiss. That is the failure to notify the Treasurer promptly of any change of address. She gets rightfully upset over the needless expense we continue to have issues of YLH being returned to us that have been mailed to your old address. So - I shall try to impress on you once again the importance of all this. Giving the Post Office your change of address card is not sufficient, unless you check on it, that you will guarantee forwarding postage on all magazines. If you don't do this, the magazine is returned to us with a postage due charge of 8¢, then it has to be remailed to you at your new address at a cost of another 6¢. You will save us a lot of trouble and expense if you will just take one of those little change of address cards that the Post Office provides FREE, and fill it out and mail it to the Treasurer. Once again I plead with you to do this and do yourselves as well as YIRL a favor -

and after all YOU are YIRL!!

Now we come to something else with which to trouble you - - - ZIP Code Numbers. When you send in your 1964 dues please include a slip with your name and address, showing your ZIP code number. Use of these numbers on your YIH should help get it to you more promptly.

Lest you think I am mad at all of you, I would remind you that no matter how you love your own children you have to scold them when they are naughty, hi!! If I didn't love you all - and YIRL - I'd probably adopt the same "why bother-nobody really cares" attitude that most of you show.

Now don't forget - new amount for dues; any change of address; and ZIP code numbers - PLEASE!
