Hams are sure wonderful friends, even with a language barrier. On a 3 week tour of the Orient, Japanese hams kept me constantly busy during my 10 days in JA-Land.

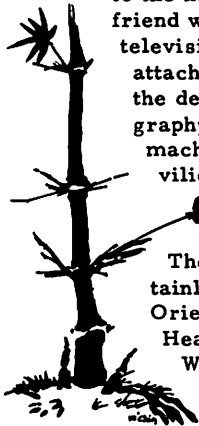

JA3WNL visited me in my hotel room with her OM and son. All who came to see me emphasized I must go to JA3XPO in the San Francisco Building after seeing the United States Pavilion. I did, and just inside the door was a Japanese wearing a beer jacket with JA3XPO on the back and his call and handle on the front. I asked him in English where I could find the ham shack, and he answered in perfect English, "come with me."

The YLs and OMs were very gracious, and I handed out QSLs like mad! There has never been a World's Fair in Asia before, so Asians are thronging to Japan, as are Australians, New Zealanders and some Europeans. The log of ham visitors was a sight to behold and I was truly thrilled to add my K11IF to the list.

When the coffee cups came out, we all sat down for a cup by the rig at JA3XPO. I could have been visiting a ham shack anywhere in the world - Connecticut, Colorado, California or Alaska! Over the friendly cup of coffee, one of the English-speaking hams told me he works at the Telecommunications Pavilion, and he would gladly take me through this most popular - but especially interesting to me - pavilion. The next day I did go to



to the head of the half-mile queue and ask the guide for my ham friend who explained in English the most advanced telephone and television exhibits. I used the telephone with only a tiny antenna attached and called another area of Japan on it. JA3CHQ is in the department which has developed and is maintaining telex photography, and I saw a printout of a news picture as it came from the machine - the first to see this picture in the back room of the pavilion. His boss and coworkers had a coffee break back there, and they took many pictures of me and my visit.

The cordiality and extreme hospitality of ham friendships certainly was the highlight of my thrilling three week tour of the Orient. It is not at all unusual, though. We live near the ARRL Headquarters and have an equal chance to welcome foreign hams. We are, in fact, right now eagerly awaiting the arrival of DL3LS, Ursula and her OM, DL1RA, Heinz. The WRONE members plan to give them the same thrills here that I had in Japan.

When you are a ham, you never leave home - wherever you go!
