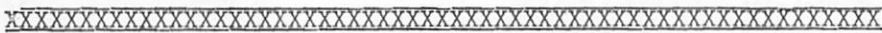
O God, Father Almighty, Creator of all mankind, bless the YLs present at this 6th International Convention, and the other YLs, wherever they maybe.

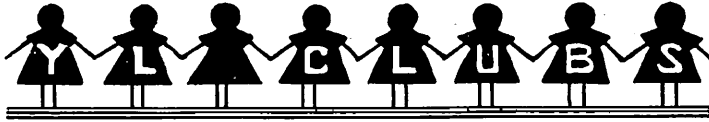
