YLRL is a non-profit, fraternal organization comprised of women amateur radio operators, incorporated as such under the laws of the State of California. Dues are \$3.00 per year, due and payable March 1, and delinquent March 31. For new and reinstating members joining after August 31, the dues may be pro-rated by half the annual

dues for that fiscal year (currently \$1.50). Dues for adopted members are \$3.50, and may not be pro-rated for portions of years. Dues for "family member" are \$1.25: and subscriptions by non-members are \$3.00 per year, and may not be pro-rated for portions of years.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Application was made at the Cochran, Ga., post office by YLRL as a nonprofit fraternal organization on February 27, 1973, for purposes of mailing YL HARMONICS at the special bulk third class rates (5% per copy at higher rate and 1.7% per copy at lower rate). This request was denied by the Atlanta District Office of the U. S. Postal Service so YLH is being mailed at the higher rate.

Application was filed once again on April 21, 1973, and this time requesting an explanation for denial. Text of letter dated April 27, 1973, received from the U. S. Postal

Service follows:

Application and supporting papers submitted by the "Young Ladies' Radio League" are returned herewith.

Section 134.51, Postal Service Manual, provides the special bulk third class rates of postage for religious, educational, scientific, philanthropic, agricultural, labor, veterans' or fraternal organizations or associations not organized for profit and none of the net income of which inures to the benefit of any stockholder or individual.

Although the application and supporting papers submitted have been carefully considered, it does not appear that the organization named above is such as to bring it within any of the nonprofit categories or classifications named in the law. This law does not exempt social and similar organizations, who are exempt from Federal taxes under section 501 (c) (7) of the Internal Revenue Code, from the higher bulk third class postage rates even though they may be organized on a nonprofit basis.

Therefore, the application for the "Young Ladies' Radio League" is denied.

To go another step further, I enlisted the aid of ARRL. A paragraph from letter dated August 3, 1973, from the law offices of Booth & Freret follows:

I note from the letter of denial dated April 27, 1973, that the principal reason was apparently that the Young Ladies Radio League is exempt from federal taxes under Section 501 (c) (7) of the Internal Revenue Service regulations. If this could be changed to, for example, Section 501 (c) (3), the special bulk mailing privileges might be forthcoming. As Counsel for ARRL, we would be glad to put in a brief amount of time on this for YLRL, but if the matter became unduly complicated, we would of necessity gracefully retire, or submit a statement to you. In the event that you have local counsel in Georgia who would undertake this with IRS, please let us know so that we can close our files on the matter.

I visited the IRS in Macon, Ga., on August 14, 1973. My trip there was fruitless--our classification remains the same.

The subject of accepting advertising in YLH has come up, but it states on the tax exemption letter that "It should be noted that any increase in gross receipts from nonmember


